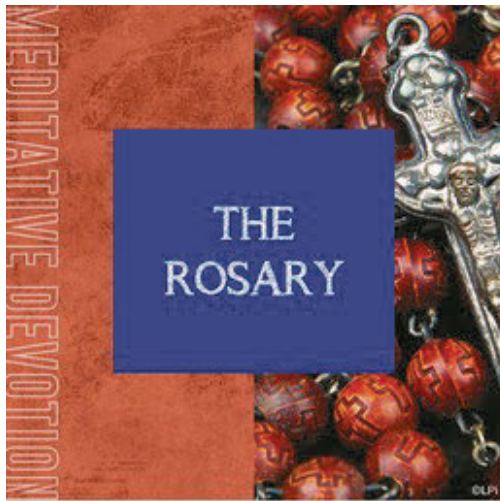

VATICAN CORNER

On Saturday April 26, 2025, over a quarter of a million people poured into St. Peter's Square and overflowed into the adjacent areas to say their final farewell to Pope Francis at his Requiem Mass. There were world leaders and heads of state wearing black or dark clothes, some 250 cardinals wearing red, 400 bishops wearing purple, and 4,000 priests and consecrated religious wearing white. The funeral Mass was presided over by 91-year old Cardinal Giovanni Rattista Re the Dean of the College of Cardinals. The simple coffin, inlaid with a large cross, was brought out of the basilica by 14 white-gloved pallbearers at the start of the Mass as



applause rang out. In his homily, Cardinal Re said "Rich in human warmth and deeply sensitive to today's challenges, Pope Francis truly shared the anxieties, sufferings and hopes of this time." Cardinal Re said Francis had been "attentive to the signs of the times and what the Holy Spirit was awakening in the Church." The Cardinal noted that the outpouring in this week of mourning tells a lot on how much the pontificate of Pope Francis "touched minds and hearts" of many people, not only within the Church. He said that "Despite his frailty and suffering towards the end, Pope Francis chose to follow this path of self-giving until the last day of his earthly life," in which he "followed in the footsteps of his Lord, the Good Shepherd." "The final image we have of him, which will remain etched in our memory, is that of last Sunday, Easter Sunday, when Pope Francis, despite his serious health problems, wanted to give us his blessing from the balcony of Saint Peter's Basilica. He then came down to this Square to greet the large crowd gathered for the Easter Mass while riding in the open-top Popemobile." The Cardinal recalled Francis' decision to take the name Francis "immediately appeared to indicate the pastoral plan and style on which he wanted to base his pontificate, seeking the inspiration from the spirit of Saint Francis of Assisi." Cardinal Re described the many highlights of the Pope's remarkable and intense 12 years as leader of the Catholic Church, marked by his style of closeness to the people and his spontaneity until the very end, but most importantly, by this deep love for the Church which he wanted open to everyone, "especially the marginalized, the least among us." The Cardinal explained that evangelization remained central to Francis' image of the Church, and how he characterized the Church as a field hospital", actively engaging with the world's wounds. "His insistence on working on behalf of the poor was constant." Many of Francis' 47 Apostolic Journeys extended the Church's presence to the farthest peripheries. Cardinal Re also highlighted Pope Francis' persistent advocacy for a "culture of encounter" against the prevailing "throwaway culture." He reminded everyone of Francis' writings on environmental stewardship, stressing the interconnectedness of all creation and our shared responsibility for the planet. Also in times of global violence and war, Pope Francis' voice stood out as one of peace, always insisting that "war is a defeat for humanity." The Cardinal's homily closed saying Pope Francis now rests in God's embrace. "Dear Francis, we now ask you to pray for us. May you bless the Church, bless Rome, and bless the whole world from heaven as you did last Sunday from the balcony of this Basilica in a



final embrace with all the people of God, but also embrace humanity that seeks the truth with a sincere heart and holds high the torch of hope." The crowd clapped loudly again at the end of the service when the ushers picked up the casket and tilted it slightly so more people could see. After the service, the great bells of St. Peter's were rung and the coffin was placed on the open-topped popemobile, a modified Dodge Ram, that Mexico had gifted to the Vatican in 2017, and which he used during his historic 2016 visit to that country. The coffin was taken in a procession through the heart of Rome to St. Mary Major Basilica, and over 150,000 people lined the streets to see him. Francis had shunned much of the pomp and privilege of the papacy, and he asked to be buried at St. Mary Major Basilica rather than at St. Peter's. St. Mary Major is the largest and oldest church in Rome dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, which has a special Marian devotion to the Icon of Mary that is loved and valued by Pope Francis and by the Roman people. The body of Pope Francis was interred in a niche directly adjacent to the chapel housing the icon. Pope Francis became the first Pope in over 120 years to be buried outside the walls of the Vatican. 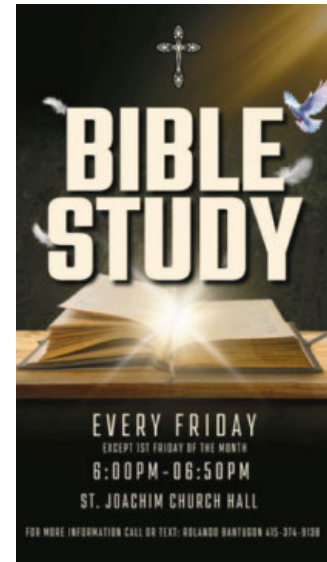
