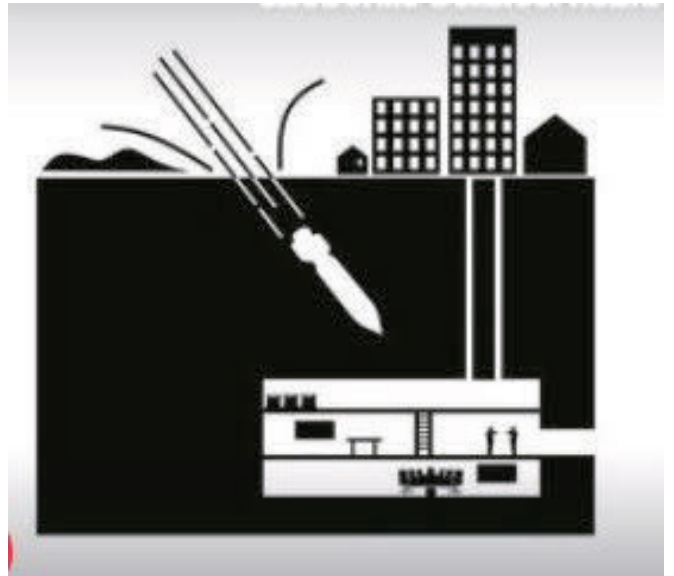
VATICAN CORNER

Hours after the US bombed three key nuclear facilities in Iran, Pope Leo XIV criticized U.S. President Trump's military strike, warning that "war does not solve problems." On June 21, 2025, President Trump announced the secret military operation he authorized and said the objective was "the destruction of Iran's nuclear enrichment capacity and a stop to the nuclear threat posed by the world's No. 1 state sponsor of terror." Trump said "Iran, the bully of the Middle East, must make peace, if they do not, future attacks will be far greater and a lot easier There will either be peace or there will be tragedy for Iran, far greater than we have witnessed over the last eight days." The U.S. military action came 10 days after Israel began

carrying out attacks on Iran's nuclear facilities and military infrastructure, causing Iran to retaliate by firing missiles at Israel. Seven B-2 stealth bombers flew from the U.S. to Iran avoiding detection. Fourteen massive bombs were dropped on one nuclear enrichment facility buried deep below a mountain outside Tehran. At the same time two dozen cruise missiles were launched from a submarine, a total of 75 "precision-guided weapons" were used in the attack. Pope Leo called the situation in the Middle East "alarming" and said diplomacy was the only responsible way forward. He said on June 22 after reciting the Angelus prayer in St. Peter's Square with thousands of people there: "Every member of the international community has a moral responsibility: Stop the tragedy of war before it becomes an irreparable abyss." He told the crowd that people all over the world were praying and crying for peace. "It is a cry that calls for responsibility and reason and must not be drowned out by the din of weapons. There is no faraway conflict when human dignity is at stake." He also said, with the "dramatic scenario" of the bombing of Iran, "the daily suffering of people, especially in Gaza and other territories, risk falling into oblivion" as the attention of the world turns elsewhere. "War does not solve problems, but rather it amplifies them and produces deep wounds in the history of people that take generations to heal." "No armed victory can compensate for the pain of mothers, the fear of children, the stolen future." Leo said "Let diplomacy silence the weapons, let nations chart their future with works of peace, not with violence and bloody conflicts!" The United Nations Secretary General Antonio Guterres said he was "gravely alarmed" by the U.S. use of force, which marked a "dangerous escalation in a region already on the edge" and "a direct threat to international peace and security." He called for de-escalation and the rule of international law, warning, "At this perilous hour, it is critical to avoid a spiral of chaos." "There is no military solution, he said. "The only path forward is diplomacy. The only hope is peace."

Author Patrick Wintour, in a column in theguardian.com tries to explain why Iran with all its vast oil reserves wants to enrich uranium far beyond what is needed for nuclear energy production, and has probably been working hard to build an atomic bomb. He points to Iran's history of being exploited by other countries, and it feels the need for dignity and respect in the world. Also having a nuclear bomb would act as a deterrent from attack. He does not try to explain Iran's hatred of Israel or why it uses foreign proxy militias to spread terrorism. He also doesn't consider if Iran could actually use such a weapon of mass destruction. But he does go on to say "if Iran's goal with its nuclear program was security and independence, and not something more sinister, the leadership has paid a huge and probably self-defeating price."

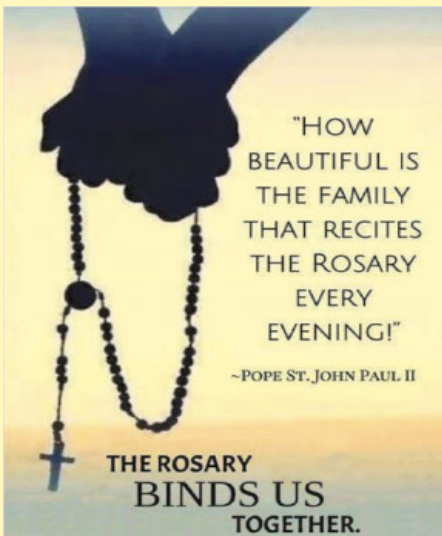

Registration Requirements:

- 1.1. If this is your child's first year, a copy of his/her Birth, Baptism will be required at the time of registration **and First Communion Certificates** (for Confirmation registration) will also be required. Please make sure you bring copies and NOT originals.
2. If your child has not been baptized they **MUST** be baptized before the classes start in September .
