



On Pilgrimage

Before I embarked on my trip to the National Eucharistic Congress last summer with a group from my archdiocese, we had an orientation meeting. At that meeting, the coordinator of the trip shared with us "The Five Rules of Pilgrimage."

If you're not familiar with them (I wasn't), here they are:

- 1. Don't complain.
- 2. Don't complain. (It's so important, it's listed twice.)
- 3. When you see a bathroom, use it.
- 4. When someone offers you something, receive it.
- 5. When someone asks you for something, give it. It's great advice for a pilgrimage, but more than that, I think it's great advice in general. So when I read today's Gospel and I hear Jesus say essentially the same thing to his disciples as they set out to evangelize (well, minus the bathroom tip, but those weren't as much of a thing in biblical Judea), I come to an important realization.

The whole Christian life is a pilgrimage.

Too often, life falls short of my expectations. An opportunity didn't work out. A day didn't go the way I planned (like, at all). A person didn't accept me. And I ball up my fists and stomp my feet like a full-grown Veruca Salt, and I yell: I cannot work in these conditions!

And then, I imagine God, on his celestial throne, sighs and opens the Book of the Gospels (surely he keeps it handy, don't you think?) to Luke, Chapter 10. And he whispers in my heart what he said to his disciples 2,000 years ago.

Don't complain. Be open and give of yourself, and in turn, receive what comes your way, whatever it is. If it's good, rejoice. If it's not good, move on. And in the end, remember where you're headed — the place you're trying to go.

Oh, and again: don't complain.

En Peregrinación

Antes de embarcarme en mi viaje al Congreso Eucarístico Nacional el verano pasado con un grupo de mi arquidiócesis, tuvimos una reunión de orientación. En esa reunión, el coordinador del viaje compartió con nosotros "Las Cinco Reglas de la Peregrinación". Si no estás familiarizado con ellas (yo no), aquí están:

- 1. No te quejes.
- 2. No te quejes. (Es tan importante que aparece dos veces).
- 3. Cuando veas un baño, úsalo.
- 4. Cuando alguien te ofrezca algo, recíbelo.
- 5. Cuando alguien te pida algo, dáselo.

Son grandes consejos para una peregrinación, pero más que eso, creo que son grandes consejos en general. Así que cuando leí el Evangelio de hoy y escuche a Jesús decir esencialmente lo mismo a sus discípulos cuando se dispusieron a evangelizar (bueno, menos la ida al baño, pero eso no era tan importante en la Judea bíblica), me doy cuenta de algo importante.

Toda la vida cristiana es una peregrinación. Con demasiada frecuencia, la vida no cumple con mis expectativas. Una oportunidad no funcionó. Un día no salió como lo planeé (en absoluto). Una persona no me aceptó. Y levanto los puños y pisoteo como una sal de Veruca adulta, y grito: ino puedo trabajar en estas condiciones!

Y entonces, me imagino a Dios, en su trono celestial, suspira y abre el Libro de los Evangelios (seguro que lo tiene a la mano, ¿no crees?) a Lucas, capítulo 10. Y susurra en mi corazón lo que les dijo a sus discípulos hace 2,000 años. No te quejes. Sé abierto y da de ti misma, y a su vez, recibe lo que se te presente, sea lo que sea. Si es bueno, regocíjate. Si no es bueno, sigue adelante. Y al final, recuerda hacia dónde te diriges, el lugar al que intentas ir.

Ah, y de nuevo: no te quejes.



VATICAN CORNER

Lake Albano is a volcanic crater lake

about 2 miles long and 1.5 miles wide in the Alban Hills of Lazio, twelve miles southeast of Rome. The lakes depth is 560 feet, and it was formed by the union of two volcanic craters making a ridge 230 feet high in its center. In 406 BC the Greek philosopher and historian Plutarch reported that the lake overflowed the surrounding hills despite there being no rain or rivers flowing into the lake. The flood destroyed fields and vineyards before eventually ending at the sea. Scientists today think that report may be a limnic eruption, caused by accumulated volcanic gases tapped under pressure at the bottom of the lake which eventually burst. Such eruptions



are very rare but have occurred and reoccurred at places on the earth. In 395 BC the Romans dug a tunnel through the crater walls, 4,400 foot long, 4 foot wide, 6.5 feet high, and with 5 vertical access tunnels. Its purpose was to control flooding of the lake and take water from the lake for irrigation and to drive watermills. The project was said to be gigantic, and involving 30,000 men. Situated on a hilltop overlooking the lake is one of Italy's most scenic towns: Castel Gandolfo, home for approximately 8,900 residents. Almost the entire coastline of Lake Albano is a resort community, with numerous summer residences, villas, and cottages that were constructed in the 17th century. During the 1960 Summer Olympics in Rome, the lake hosted the canoeing and rowing events. Within the town's boundaries is the Apostolic Palace of Castel Gandolfo, the summer residence and vacation retreat for the popes. They go there to escape Rome's summer heat and enjoy the cooler hilltop air. The palace although outside the walls of the Vatican, is on extraterritorial property of the Holy See, and not under Italian jurisdiction. During World War II, Pope Pius XII opened the grounds of Castel Gandolfo to refugees escaping the fighting around Rome. Twelve thousand people including Roman Jews, and other non-Catholics came to the property, often bringing their cows, horses, mules and sheep. During that time 36 children were born there, and almost all were named for the Pope who gave them safe harbor. The Pope's private apartment was turned into a nursery. The Vatican announced that Pope Leo XIV will be spending a summer vacation in the Alban Hills from July 6 to 20 and August 15 to 17, 2025. He will stay in the pontifical villas at Castel Gandolfo. Doing so will be following the tradition that was started by Pope Urban in 1626, and followed by every pope thereafter except for Pope Francis. Pope Francis broke the tradition by choosing to stay at the Vatican during the summer. Concerned about his non-appearance at the small town of Castel Gandolfo which depends on the massive numbers of tourists that come during the pope's vacation, led Francis to make the Apostolic Palace into a museum, and open the villa's garden to tours year-around. The papal property is 135 acres, and bigger that the 109 acres of Vatican City. There are 74 acres of garden of which 17 acres are formal gardens. There is 62 acres of farmland with chickens, rabbits, various fowl, cows, and a small dairy operation. There are fruit and olive orchards, vineyards, hayfields vegetable patches, aromatic herbs, and flowerbeds. Pope Saint John Paul II frequently visited Castel Gandolfo and affectionately called it "Vatican Number Two". He spent much time there, including the time he recovered from an assassination attempt. He had a swimming pool built there, and it generated some controversy with the paparazzi who tried to take his picture while using it. Pope Benedict XVI frequently used the villa as a summer getaway. The highlight of the papal stay in Castel Gandolfo was always the feast of the Assumption of Mary, August 15, when the pope would celebrate Mass for the whole town and the thousands of visitors. Several times Pope Leo will be celebrating Mass at the local parish and leading the Angelus prayer in front of the main papal residence. He will not be holding any public or private audiences. Hopefully he will get some rest and relaxation by stepping away from his demanding daily schedule. Maybe he will be able to get in some extended periods of prayer, meditation and spiritual renewal. He has said he likes to play tennis, read, walk and play word games. Maybe he can try kayaking on the




