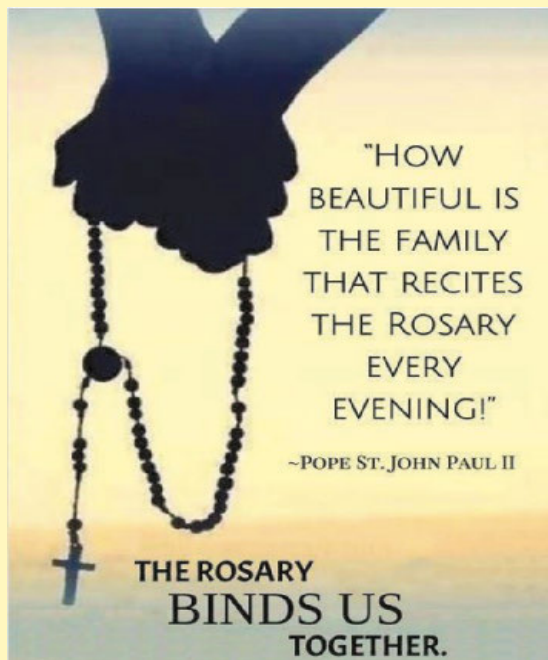

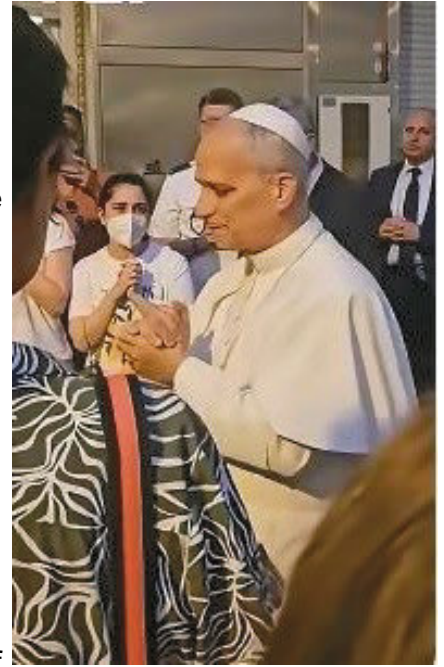

VATICAN CORNER

Pope Leo seems to enjoy surprises, especially when he is the one doing the surprising, and particularly with young Catholics. Multiple times he has made unannounced appearances since becoming Pope. He made a pilgrimage to the shrine of Our Lady of Good Council, a particularly meaningful place for him, where he had frequently prayed as a Cardinal as head of the Augustinian order before his election as Pope. He made a surprise visit to St. Mary Major Basilica to visit the tomb of Pope Francis to pay his respects. He made an excursion to “Laudato Si Village” in Castel Gandolfo, a project started by Pope Francis on environmental awareness and integral ecology. His low-key trips have been in a modest dark minivan so as not to draw attention. Leo surprised his fellow Augustinian friars at their Roman headquarters and joined them in a Eucharistic celebration and a lunch. Many people came to greet the Pope. He told the community that they “must always stay close to one another, and live in communion, just as Saint Augustine calls us to do.” Leo revisited the Dicastery of Bishops, where before his election; he worked with others there recommending new bishops. His former co-workers were surprised and joyous to see him. They held a quiet Mass in the chapel. He did not make a public speech, but just spent time in personal conversation with staff members. During his short vacation at Castel Gandolfo, the Pope broke away and arrived discreetly at the Monastery of the Immaculate Conception where the community of contemplative nuns, who have dedicated their lives to prayer, welcomed him in silence and reverence. He shared prayer alongside the sisters in the chapel and then in the chapter room greeted each sister personally. He suggested that their quiet lives behind cloistered walls are not forgotten by the Church, but cherished. He presented them with a chalice and paten for their celebrations of the Eucharist. The nuns offered him an icon of the Holy Face of Jesus. At the Youth Jubilee at the Vatican, Pope Leo surprised tens of thousands of young Catholics and showed up unexpectedly at the welcome ceremony, thrilling the youth, and he received a rock star like welcome from them. The Holy Father in the popemobile looped around St. Peter’s Square and up and down the boulevard leading to it, shocking the estimated 120,000 young pilgrims packed into the square. For 20 minutes, Pope Leo beamed and waved and seemed to enjoy all the enthusiasm, cheering and flag-waving of the youth from around the world. In a brief unprepared speech and blessing from the altar, he told the youth that they were beacons of light, hope and peace that the world needs today. “The world needs messages of hope. You are this message, and must give hope to everyone,” In Spanish, English and Italian he said “We want peace in the world. We want peace in the world!” A few days later at the same Jubilee of Youth, Pope Leo announced that a 15- year-old Spanish boy attending the Jubilee had been urgently admitted to the Bambino Gesù Hospital in Rome, and to join in prayer for him. After the Jubilee was over on Monday August 4, 2025, Pope Leo made a surprise visit to see Ignacio González in his room in the intensive care unit of the hospital. Ignacio’s parents along with his brother and sister had traveled to Rome immediately upon hearing the news. The diagnosis was lymphoma affecting his respiratory tract. Pope Leo entered the hospital room silently as the family prayed at the foot of the bed and he simply joined them in prayer. The family had their eyes closed and a priest accompanying them had to nudge them when he saw Leo come in unannounced. Leo stayed for about half an hour before visiting other patients in the hospital’s oncology ward. Pope Leo reminded the family that “we are made for heaven”. The young man’s father said they all found solace after the pontiff’s visit.



The Bible is full of surprising events, from miraculous interventions to unexpected births and divine encounters. These surprises often challenge human expectations and reveal God’s power and grace. The Bible says the past, present, and future are in God’s control. He is the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end (Rev. 22:13). We should wonder what God will do next. We should always hope in His promises, even when things seem dark. We can expect that He will surprise us for our good and for His glory. “No eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him” (1 Cor. 2:9).
