HOLY MATRIMONY



PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS



One of the greatest acts of charity is to pray for the living and the dead. The greatest and most powerful prayer we have is the Mass, since the fruits of the Mass are the very fruits of Jesus' redemption. For that reason, all are encouraged to have Mass offered for loved ones who have died, or even for the living who have some need. This is an ancient Catholic practice, and all are encouraged to take it up. In our parish there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. The following policies are now being implemented in order to accommodate the numerous Mass requests.

You may call parish office the beginning of 2022 to schedule Mass Intentions (January - December, except month of November for Holy Souls in Purgatory).

- Universal Church discipline as contained in the Code of Canon Law (canons 945 958) of the 1983 Code of Canon Law strictly regulates the offerings made for the celebration of Mass.
- Canon Law does not permit us to keep Mass intentions for only those Masses that can be celebrated by our priests within a calendar year.
- A Mass intention may be requested for a Mass for: a deceased loved one or a living person who is sick or suffering.
- 4. A maximum of six (6) intentions per year from **any one individual** may be scheduled at the parish with no more than two (2) scheduled for a Mass (Vigil, Sunday, Weekdays, & Holy Days).
- The schedule of Mass intentions is subject to change according to the Mass schedule and there is no promise that they will be said on the scheduled day due to unforeseen circumstances.
- For many years, the customary Mass Stipend was \$5.00; however, now the suggested amount in some Diocese's in U.S. is a minimum of \$10.00.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?



Answer: The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, "In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 15). God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we're there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom.
