PARISH SCHOOL & CHAPEL



NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



In late 2019, a Pew Study indicated what many had long suspected. Few Catholics, approximately 30 percent, fully believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

This stark reality inspired the Bishops of the United States to action. More than an event or a program, they envisioned a true Revival to rediscover the source and summit of our Faith through a deep commitment of prayer, pilgrimage, and worship on the part of the entire Church in the United States.

The advent of the pandemic only accelerated these plans, revealing their urgency and importance. Too many Catholics still have not returned to Mass to celebrate the central mystery of the Church.

Taking its title from the Bread of Life discourse in John's Gospel, "My flesh for the life of the world/Mi carne para la vida del mundo," the Eucharistic Revival is not a step-by-step plan or a series of meetings; it is a grassroots call and a challenge for every Catholic across the United States to rekindle the fire of love and devotion for the Eucharistic Heart of Jesus.

Over three years, every Catholic diocese, parish, school, apostolate, and family is invited to be a part of renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

This Revival launches on the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 19, 2022. Over the next three years, dioceses will host Eucharistic Congresses and processions. Parishes will increase or begin Eucharistic Adoration. There will be a revival of faithful adherence to the liturgical norms in all their richness – the ars celebrandi. Families and friends will gather in small groups to learn and pray together. Filled with the flame of charity from the reception of Jesus in the Eucharist, missionary disciples will go to the margins, recognizing the mystery of Jesus' presence in the poor.

All of this will culminate in the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost fifty years. From July 17-21, 2024, thousands of Catholics will journey on pilgrimage to Indianapolis to personally encounter Jesus in the Eucharist and be sent back out into their parishes and communities. 

Letters from a Monastery: Contemplata aliis tradere

"Hearing God's Voice"



In my last letter I focused on the nature of vocation. Here, I want to briefly explore what it means to hear God's voice in prayer and how this relates to one's vocation.

Many wonder, "How can I discover God's Will for me? How do I hear His voice?" The answer is simple: *prayer*. There are no two ways about it. The only way to discern our vocation – the only way to "hear" God's voice – is through a life of prayer. Why? Because prayer is our very relationship with God; it is how we communicate with Him. Prayer and silence constitute the indispensable means by which we encounter the Lord within our hearts, at the deepest level of our being. Through silent prayer, we speak to God and God "speaks" to us; that is, He imparts His grace to us by enlightening our minds to understand better His ways and promptings. When we pray, Our Lord speaks to us interiorly through good inspirations and holy desires. These divine movements, or "tugs," of the heart are very subtle, and sometimes imperceptible, but they are always accompanied by peace and confidence.

We usually perceive these good and holy thoughts to be simply our own. And they truly are our own. But they are also, in a very mysterious yet real way, God's thoughts in us. God, Who fashions the human heart in His loving hands, speaks to us from that same heart. This is a profoundly beautiful mystery! The great spiritual authors across the ages attest this truth: The

Lord resides in the heart and speaks to us from the heart. That sudden inspiration to pray your Rosary or go to Confession is from God. The desire to reconcile with an estranged friend is from God. The recurring thought to enter the seminary or the convent is from God. When we remain deeply rooted in a life of daily prayer, these divine inspirations or thoughts become ever more clear, as does the path to one's vocation.

God also speaks to us through Holy Scripture. Why else would we call the Bible, "the Word of God"? Words are used for communication, and our communication with God is no different. The Holy Spirit speaks to us when we read Scripture. When we pray and read Scripture, we so often find the words of our heart laid out before us on the sacred page. How many times have we dwelt upon certain thoughts only to have them echoed back to us from God's Word? How often have the readings at Holy Mass spoken to us on some level, or even pierced us straight through? How many vocations have arisen from a transformational encounter with Jesus in Scripture? God's Word is truly alive! It lives, and it shares its life with us ceaselessly. And it never fails to help guide us on our spiritual journey. Do you want to hear God's voice, God's call? Open your heart and then open your Bible!

As we grow in our prayer life and grow closer to God, we soon realize a gradual change in mindset. We begin, more and more, to see life through the lens of faith – to see life as God sees it. We become increasingly aware of the movements of God's providential hand in our life. By remaining in contact with God, we are more or less spiritually attuned to the supernatural order and the mysterious workings of the Holy Spirit. The more we pray, the more we understand God's unique language for us personally. And it is by way of this unique language that God leads us to our vocation.

So, pray and listen! Pray and read! Pray your Rosary! Go to Adoration and pray in silence. Listen for Christ's voice and trust in His love. And know in your heart that "He who calls you is faithful; therefore, he will do it" (1 Thessalonians 5:24).


A PRAYER FOR FATHERS

God our Father, we give you thanks and praise for fathers young and old.


We pray for young fathers, newly embracing their vocation; may they find courage and perseverance to balance work, family and faith in joy and sacrifice.
