BE ON YOUR GUARD

We are almost at the end of the liturgical year, and the Church presents us today with readings that remind us about the end of the world and the end of life. The first Reading and Gospel give a picture of the end time that will come with terrible happenings. To buttress this, Jesus pointed to the Temple of Jerusalem, adorned with gold, glory, and majesty, and said, "The days will come when this Temple will be destroyed, leaving not one stone upon another." This seemed impossible, and the people did not take him seriously. But as he predicted, the Jerusalem Temple was utterly destroyed in AD 70 by the Roman Army under the command of Titus.

As a matter of fact, an end awaits everything human, be it life or institution, work, marriage, friendship, education, or employment. Naturally, we believe that the end will come, but we do not admit it can happen today or soon. We do not even believe we can become a victim but others. This is why the end takes us by surprise when it comes; to a situation Jesus wants his disciples to avoid.

One of the ways to do what Jesus intends in this revelation is to be courageous and not give in to fear. This is the message behind the second reading. When the Church in Thessalonica heard about the end-time, they were overcome by fear; they stopped attending their jobs and consequently became a burden to their fellows who had to provide them with their daily bread. When Paul heard about this, he wrote and told them, "If anyone is unwilling to work, that person should not eat." This state of irresponsibility, which comes from fear, despair, and hopelessness, is something we must try to avoid. It is wrong to interpret the crises of life as if they were the end of the world."

The take-home message is that while we are living and waiting for the end, we should not allow the difficulties of the last times to weigh us down or make us dispirited. The events that bring about an end to life are often accompanied by suffering, sickness, wars, rumors of wars; family revolutions; anxiety, disappointments, and failures. The sufferings from these human problems can make a relationship with God very difficult for those who are not strong in their faith. Jesus knew this when he said: "Because of the increase of evil doing and difficulties, the love of many will grow cold, but the one who perseveres to the end will be saved." (Matt 24:12).

So, today, Jesus is telling us to be on our guard and use the end of the liturgical calendar to think about the end of our own lives. Our life will come to an end one day. We will never change this because we live in a world where nothing seems permanent, and we often meet violence and the threat of destruction. These are a reminder to all of us that we have not here a lasting city.

But one thing is certain, God's love for us. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that in the face of the real crises of life, our hope and trust in God become the seeds of new life. God does not want us to slip into despair or fear but to be a people of hope. The basis of this hope is the promise of Jesus that He is near us and that "not a hair on our head" will be destroyed. It is then our hope and faith that will sustain us in the face of the sufferings and trials of life. So, we must prepare ourselves through good Christian living by loving our enemies, being joyful in suffering, patient in adversity, pardoning injuries, and showing comfort and compassion to the hopeless and the helpless.

ESTÉ EN GUARDIA

Estamos casi al final del año litúrgico, y la Iglesia nos presenta hoy lecturas que nos recuerdan el fin del mundo y el fin de la vida. La primera Lectura y el Evangelio dan una imagen del tiempo del fin que vendrá con terribles acontecimientos. Para reforzar esto, Jesús señaló el Templo de Jerusalén, adornado con oro, gloria y majestad, y dijo: "Llegarán días en que este Templo será destruido, sin dejar piedra sobre piedra". Esto parecía imposible, y la gente no lo tomó en serio. Pero como predijo, el Templo de Jerusalén fue completamente destruido en el año 70 dC por el ejército romano bajo el mando de Tito.

De hecho, a todo lo humano le espera un fin, sea la vida o la institución, el trabajo, el matrimonio, la amistad, la educación o el empleo. Naturalmente, creemos que el final llegará, pero no admitimos que pueda suceder hoy o pronto. Ni siquiera creemos que podamos convertirnos en víctimas sino en otros. Por eso el final nos sorprende cuando llega; a una situación que Jesús quiere que sus discípulos eviten.

Una de las formas de hacer lo que Jesús pretende en esta revelación es ser valiente y no ceder al miedo. Este es el mensaje detrás de la segunda lectura. Cuando la Iglesia en Tesalónica escuchó acerca del tiempo del fin, fueron vencidos por el miedo; dejaron de asistir a sus trabajos y en consecuencia se convirtieron en una carga para sus semejantes que debían proveerles el pan de cada día. Cuando Pablo se enteró de esto, les escribió y les dijo: "Si alguno no quiere trabajar, que no coma". Este estado de irresponsabilidad, que proviene del miedo, la desesperación y la desesperanza, es algo que debemos tratar de evitar. Es un error interpretar las crisis de la vida como si fueran el fin del mundo".

El mensaje final es que mientras vivimos y esperamos el final, no debemos permitir que las dificultades de los últimos tiempos nos agobien o nos desanimen. Los acontecimientos que ponen fin a la vida suelen ir acompañados de sufrimientos, enfermedades, guerras, rumores de guerras; revoluciones familiares; ansiedad, decepciones y fracasos. Los sufrimientos de estos problemas humanos pueden hacer muy difícil una relación con Dios para aquellos que no son fuertes en su fe. Jesús lo sabía cuando dijo: "Por el aumento de las malas obras y de las dificultades, el amor de muchos se enfriará, pero el que persevere hasta el fin, éste será salvo". (Mateo 24:12).

Entonces, hoy, Jesús nos dice que estemos en guardia y usemos el final del calendario litúrgico para pensar en el final de nuestras propias vidas. Nuestra vida llegará a su fin un día. Nunca cambiaremos esto porque vivimos en un mundo donde nada parece permanente y, a menudo, nos encontramos con la violencia y la amenaza de destrucción. Estos son un recordatorio para todos nosotros de que no tenemos aquí una ciudad duradera.

Pero una cosa es cierta, el amor de Dios por nosotros. Jesús nos dice en el Evangelio que ante las verdaderas crisis de la vida, nuestra esperanza y confianza en Dios se convierten en semillas de vida nueva. Dios no quiere que caigamos en la desesperación o el miedo, sino que seamos un pueblo de esperanza. La base de esta esperanza es la promesa de Jesús de que Él está cerca de nosotros y que "ni un pelo de nuestra cabeza" será destruido. Es entonces nuestra esperanza y nuestra fe las que nos sostendrán frente a los sufrimientos y pruebas de la vida. Por lo tanto, debemos prepararnos a través de una buena vida cristiana amando a nuestros enemigos, siendo gozosos en el sufrimiento, pacientes en la adversidad, perdonando las heridas y mostrando consuelo y compasión a los desesperanzados y desamparados.

RESPONDING *to the Call*

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Eyes On Your Own Paper

"Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place."

Looking at these words, I have to wonder. Am I reading the Bible or today's newspaper headline?

It's never easier to despair than when you glance up and take a good look at what's going on in the world: disasters, natural and contrived, wars, resentments, rivalries, and divisions. It is almost too much sometimes, isn't it? The twenty-four-hour news cycle doesn't help. Add social media and it's enough to push anyone into a nervous breakdown.

When you find yourself in this place of despair, remember Paul's admonishment in his letter to the Thessalonians. Work quietly and eat your own food.

It's not so different from the old "keep-your-eyes-on-your-own-paper" rule of the classroom. Poking our noses into other people's business, we may think we are getting a shortcut to the right answer, but we're really just getting distracted. When we become too preoccupied with events that we cannot control — whether they are happening in our neighborhood or half-a-world away — we are tempted to leave off the very specific work God has given us in our own lives. We are easily lured into anger, bitterness, and anxiety.

What is the work that God has called you to? Is it your career? Your family? Your community? What is your food — what nourishes you, sustains you, connects you to something real, powerful, and life-giving? This is what you should be concerned with. This is where your thoughts and your efforts should be.

Work quietly and eat your own food.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Question:

How does a person become a canonized saint?

Answer:

It is important to remember that all the saints are people, real people who lived just as we do! The first saints of the Church were martyrs or theologians known for a holy life. Over time, the Church has established a set process to investigate the causes of saints.

After a holy person's death, the bishop of their diocese initiates the canonization process with the Vatican. Typically, they must wait five years to ensure any false enthusiasm has lessened. With Vatican approval, the process begins and the person receives the title "Servant of God." The first phase involves collecting information about the person's life and scrutinizing it carefully. One person has the specific role of raising doubts — this is the origin of the phrase "devil's advocate!" When it is clear the person truly lived a heroically holy life according to Church teaching, they are declared "Venerable."

If the person is a martyr for the faith, they will also be declared "Blessed." If the person is not a martyr, they must be credited with a miracle. This is also closely examined for authenticity. Once the miracle is authenticated as truly a miracle performed by God through the person or through their intercession, they are beatified. An additional authenticated miracle is required before canonization, and we can call them "Saint."

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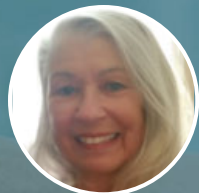
