### Important Message From Our Pastor

I'm interrupting our liturgical and ritual series in this column, just to address a few "housekeeping" items for our shared consideration.

Last weekend those of our parishioners who usually participate in the livestreamed mass at 11:00AM would have noticed that it didn't, in fact, go live. We had a technical difficulty that upset our usual way of things. While these interruptions are rare, nonetheless they can be frustrating. My apologies to anyone who was caught off-guard. I hope that those who anticipated enjoyment of our livestream were able to avail themselves of the 9:00AM stream, which remains available for viewing from about fifteen minutes after the

stream concludes.

As we emerge from the various adaptations we made to our liturgies and our schedules in light of the pandemic and the attendant lockdowns that took place, we do so with an eye to care for and consideration of the most vulnerable among us. I thought this might be a good time to share with everyone some of the strategies that continue to unfold for our life together as a worshipping community.

Our "return" to the liturgies with which we were familiar prior to the pandemic, has been and will continue to be a gradual process. This has worked well for us. in that it has enabled our volunteers who make everything happen around here to slowly ramp-up and grow comfortable returning to the ministries and activities in which they participated prior to the emergence of COVID-19. It has also been good in that our scaled reintroduction of mass-times has been well structured to meet the needs of congregations who themselves have been slowly re-engaging with in-person liturgies. At this writing, we have returned to celebrating six of the seven masses we celebrated pre-pandemic. The remaining anomaly is the 11:00AM Sunday morning mass which was instituted as a bridge for the 10:30AM and 12:00 noon congregations.

Last Sunday our plan to re-introduce the offertory process with which we were familiar pre-pandemic (passing the basket, processing the gifts, priest and servers receiving the gifts, etc.) were deferred. I called an "audible" in light of the recent surge in the COVID-19 delta variant in the community. Until this situation stabilizes, we will hold off on our gradual progress toward full resumption of our pre-pandemic

liturgies. This will very likely also impact our plans for a return to a full pre-pandemic schedule beginning next month. While it is more than likely we will have to defer our plans, we will be keeping a close eye on developments within the community. Prudence and care for our collective health and well-being will continue to be a priority value for us.

Part of our plan going forward also includes a revision of our live

streaming schedule. When we instituted our native livestreaming, as distinct from our use of the Zoom platform, we simply began to stream the liturgies that were being conducted in our then empty church. Our provider informed us

last week that we are exceeding our

bandwidth usage and so in the coming weeks we will be making some necessary changes to our operations. As we look at the data and the usage of the service, we note that there are about three to four times as many viewers of the 9:00AM Sunday mass (300+ viewers) than the 11:00AM Sunday mass. Our weekday 8:30aAMmass usually reaches between 60 and 80 viewers. Our

Spanish-language mass on Sunday has the smallest number of viewers, usually not having as many as 20. This information will shape the decisions we need to make for the appropriate stewardship of this resource going forward. We are mindful that there are ongoing costs associated with this service, and we are called to be prudent stewards of this resource, while at the same time ensuring that we maintain our commitment to our homebound parishioners to provide a live-streamed option.

Apart from our liturgies, we continue to welcome Sunday mass-goers with continental breakfast, and we also welcome back parish groups and ministries who enjoy meeting on-campus, taking advantage of the spaces provided by the Moran Center and Stroup Hall. A phone call or email to the parish office gets that process rolling.

It goes without saying that at all times we observe the protocols encouraged by the county health department, but it is certainly uplifting to see the progress we are making toward a restoration of our regular parish life and activity.



#### GOSPEL MEDITATION

#### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only



true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?
