

# From Our Pastor

"The days are coming, says the Lord..." (Jer 33:14)

I know it may sound odd, but the onset of Advent always catches me with something of a surprise. I know it's coming. I enjoy this Church season of waiting, of preparing, of expecting. I always find myself caught between the social "holiday season" when Christmas begins immediately following Thanksgiving, and yet, there is something I really enjoy about the near-but-not-yet-ness of these days. While in prior years I might be focusing on all that usually comes with this season, such as office parties, shopping expeditions, family preparations, travel plans, and so on... This year I'm also longing for one additional thing... I so want COVID to be over and behind me.


Like many of us, I'm sure, I'm longing for a return to days when I don't need to worry about masks, or vaccinations, or whatever other precautions I need to take for my own wellbeing as well as for the well-being of others. Don't get me wrong, to my mind it's a relatively small thing to wear a mask if it helps to protect someone more vulnerable than myself. That said, I look forward to the days when I can again look people not only in the eye, but in their smiles. I long for smiling faces. I long for the full range of expressions that we communicate with our whole face. I long for questioning gazes, for puzzled faces, for intent looks. I long to greet people with my own full face, with its deadpan looks, its propensity to tease people, as well as its capacity to share empathy and care, compassion and concern.

When I hear the words of the prophet remind me that the "days are coming," I really want the next words to be "when there will be no more pandemic." However, I'm not going to hold my breath that this will happen anytime soon. Neither do I choose to indulge my own personal longings, because there are greater and deeper longings in our neighborhoods and in our world.

I remember that when Jeremiah spoke these words he was speaking to a people in exile. They were strangers, living in a strange land, far from their own native place, looking to make a life for themselves and for their children in a land that was not always welcoming to them. It is in this context that the prophet reminds the people that the day is coming when the Lord God will fulfil his promise and return the people to a place of respect and restore to them a place they can call "home" once more. Jerusalem rebuilt and restored is the image of the promise upon which the eyes of God's people are fixed.

In our own days, there are overwhelming realities faced by brothers and sisters in faith the world over, whose stories have been largely obscured because of pandemic

responses and economic challenges. Refugees and migrants, people yearning for "home," continue to face daunting threats to their lives. It's important that we don't let our concern for the immediate challenges of our own lives obscure our efforts to assist and support God's children everywhere.



Advent is a time for us to consider not only our immediate longings and yearnings, but also to consider the deeper and more internal needs of our spiritual longings. A word to the wise from St. Augustine reminds us that we are made for God, and that our hearts will always experience a certain wanderlust, a need to search for fulfilment, until we at last return to life in God's presence. "Our hearts are restless until they rest in thee, O God." It is a good thing for us to remember in this Holy Season of Advent that it is not a bad thing to long for something, to yearn. It is an essential part of the fabric of our very

human condition. Our longing for the Divine is conditioned by our longing to care for and look after the "neighbor" of the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:25-37) or the people referenced in Jesus' parable of the Judgment of the Nations (Mt 25: 31-46). Until we find ourselves at peace in our relationships in life, it is normal to feel like there is something missing, that no matter how comfortable we might feel, there is still some ways to go before we will fully enjoy the "comfort" of "home."

The days are indeed coming, though they are not yet fulfilled... And so perhaps in this season of Advent we might prayerfully choose to foster some work that is about serving those who are in crisis and who long for "home":

Some suggestions to consider:

### Understanding the Dangers of Carbon Monoxide

Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that is often undetected. More than 400 people in the U.S. die every year from unintentional carbon monoxide poisoning, and thousands more are hospitalized. When gas builds up in enclosed spaces, people or animals who breathe it in can be poisoned. Consider installing a battery-operated carbon monoxide detector, and have your furnace, water heater, and other gas or coal-burning appliances serviced regularly, along with your chimney. 


