From Our Pastor

In my heart of hearts, I know that the Feast of the Epiphany falls on January 6th, the twelfth day of Christmas. Perhaps it's because of the song (The Twelve Days of Christmas) or perhaps it's because the Christmas break from work and school as I was growing up, always respected the time between December 25th and January 6th, and the extended holiday for families that it entailed, but I struggle with

moving this Feast to a nearby Sunday. Nonetheless, that is our practice in this part of the world.

The Feast of the Epiphany, irrespective of the day upon which we celebrate it, is a reminder to us to "make haste slowly" into the coming year. It's as though despite the world moving on, our gospel invites us to a completely different change of pace. It reminds us of truths that are deeper and more enduring than the simple movement of dates might suggest.

The primary narrative to mark

this Feast is that of Matthew's telling of the Magi arriving in Jerusalem from the East, as they search for the "newborn king of the Jews." I confess, I love the idea that so quickly after our celebration of the birth of Jesus, God-Come-to-Us, we now have a story that reminds us of the importance of our coming in search of God. It's as though the Church's tradition, passed down through the ages, holds a profound wisdom for us that we surely need as we enter into a New Year.

If Christmas is understood by many as a celebration that focuses on children, this feast of the Epiphany in the Christian year is one that moves the focus to deliberately embrace adults. Where do we look for the epiphany of God in our lives? Where do we look to see the "manifestation" of God in our lives? While Christmas is all about proclaiming that God is present in the world, this Feast is about our seeking out, recognizing, and responding to that presence. While Christmas is about God coming to meet us, Epiphany is more about our going to meet God.

The very image of the Magi traveling "from the East" conjures up the idea of a journey that takes time. In other words, our seeking out and finding, or recognizing, the Divine Presence in our lives doesn't happen at the flip of a "life-switch." Neither does it often happen very quickly. We have to be ready for a

journey. This search, or quest, calls us to be properly equipped and ready to encounter all manner of distraction. It's important for us to keep our eyes to the heavens and to the "star" that guides us on our life's journey. If we lose our bearings, if we keep our head directed only toward the immediacy of our days, then we will slowly, but surely, forget the very fulfillment we tell ourselves we seek.



Every year, in its own way of marking time, the Church endeavors to support us in our journey. It does so by marking time in its own ways (liturgical calendar.) while also respecting the passing of time as it is marked by the world. There is a tradition in the Church of announcing the major "Movable Feasts" of the Church year on the Feast of the Epiphany, a reminder to disciples everywhere that our pilgrim journey is woven through with different understandings of mystery and time. With that in mind....

Here follows the Announcement of Easter and Movable Feasts for 2022:

Know, dear brothers and sisters that as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the 2nd day of March will fall **Ash Wednesday**, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten Season. On the 17th day of April you will celebrate with joy **Easter Day**, the Paschal Feast of our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the 29th day of May will be the **Ascension**

On the 29th day of May will be the **Ascension** of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 5th day of June, the feast of **Pentecost**. On the 19th day of June, the feat of the **Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. On the 27th day of November, the First Sunday of the **Advent** of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.





Parents everywhere are struggling to be parents, teachers, and friends for their

children in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, many are likely and understandably relying on screens to help them through these seemingly endless days. Many children are also online for school, which only increases their screen exposure. The American Pediatric Association warns parents that too much screen time can lead to sleep problems, lower grades, mood and weight problems, and can keep children from learning how to relax and have fun without a screen present. Try to make time for reading, playing games, and other screen-free activities that will help break the cycle of screen addiction and talk to your children's teachers about how screen time for school can be managed. La Asociación Estadounidense de Pediatría advierte a los padres de familia que pasar demasiado tiempo frente a una pantalla puede provocar problemas para dormir, calificaciones más bajas, problemas de estado de ánimo y de peso, y puede impedir que los niños aprendan a relajarse y divertirse sin una pantalla presente. Trate de hacer tiempo para leer, jugar y otras actividades lejos de la pantalla que ayudarán a romper el ciclo de adicción a la pantalla y hable con los maestros de sus hijos sobre cómo se puede administrar el tiempo de pantalla en la escuela. 

The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember - the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.
