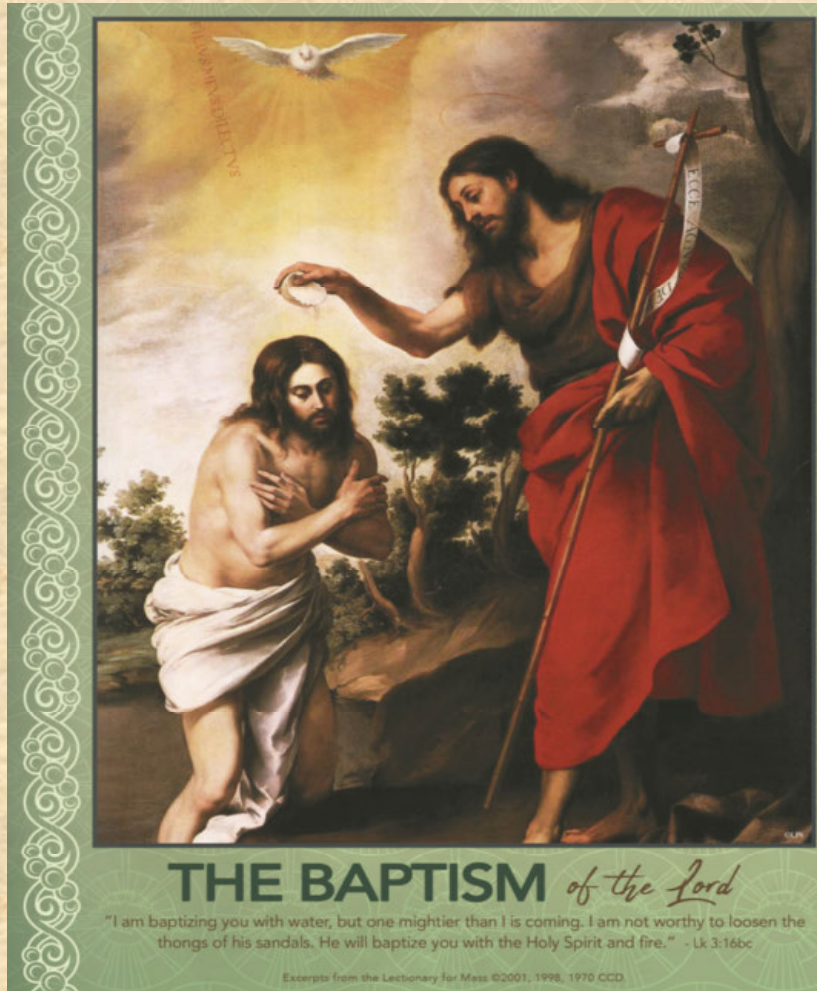

The Sunday on which we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is a “hinge” day in the calendar of the Church. The marking of “liturgical time” by people of faith can seem a little odd to those who have little time for faith, but it does serve to remind us of truth attested to on the great Feast of Easter, and which is given voice in our preparation of the Paschal candle:

“Christ yesterday and today,
the beginning and the end,
the Alpha
and the Omega.
All time belongs to him
and all the ages.
To him be glory and power
through every age and forever. Amen.”

The “hinge” that is this Feast Day is that which sees the liturgical season of Christmas close and “Ordinary time” begin.

“Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather ***the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness***, especially on Sundays. This period is known as “Ordinary Time” (Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, n43).”

I’ve taken the liberty of highlighting a particular phrase of this description, which serves me as a reminder that all that we are and are about as a people of faith is centered on Jesus Christ, or else it is pretty superfluous to our efforts as disciples of Jesus.

Here at Lourdes, a few years ago, we spent some time reflecting on our purpose as a Catholic parish in Northridge. We considered what it might mean to actually be disciples of Jesus beyond showing up for church on Sundays. What might it look like if we really tried to focus on the centrality of Jesus and his mission and ministry? What might it look like if we committed ourselves intentionally to be faithful disciples of Jesus in our words and in our actions as a parish staff, as a group of ministry leaders in our community, and as part of the general community of believers that goes to make up the parish?

A few years ago, I remember standing in front of a gathering of the leaders of our many and varied ministries and asking them to imagine a scenario in which the parish didn’t exist, or to imagine that there was another earthquake in which the parish plant was simply destroyed. The question was would we (re-)build the parish and why?



That question led to a lot of discussion and reflection that continued well beyond that gathering. In subsequent conversations with the Parish Pastoral Council and with members of the parish staff, and in other gatherings of ministry leaders, the words that are inscribed over our doors were arrived at: “Embracing God’s People. Equipping Disciples. Accompanying Believers.”

I believe that these words are meaningful for us all to the extent that they remind us, exhort us, challenge us to witness to our faith in ways in which ***the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness***.

As Jesus met people as they were, in the ordinary circumstances of their lives, often complex and multi-faceted, so too we, as a community of believers, seek to encounter and to embrace all God’s people.

Just as Jesus spent time with and prepared his followers for particular roles in the living of their lives as well as in the organized life of what was to become the Church, so too we as a parish endeavor to equip people for discipleship of Jesus lived out in relationship with and in service of God’s people.

We also see the importance of living the final command of Jesus to his followers, assured that we will never be alone. Jesus promises to always walk with us, to guide us, to safeguard us, and to always be present with us. So too, as his disciples, we look to accompany one another on life’s journey, offering companionship and accompaniment however we may.

When we live up to our words, when we live up to our mission, it unfolds within the context of the ordinary moments of our lives, and for the most part, in the ordinary time of our living. Blessing upon you all for the upcoming season.

El Domingo en el que celebramos la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor es una "bisagra" en el calendario de la Iglesia. La marca del "tiempo litúrgico" por parte de las personas de fe puede parecer un poco extraña para aquellos que tienen poco tiempo para la fe, pero sí sirve para recordarnos la verdad atestiguada en la gran fiesta de Pascua, y que se expresa en nuestro preparación del Cirio Pascual:

"Cristo ayer y hoy,
el principio y el final,
Alfa
y Omega.
Todo el tiempo le pertenece a él
y todas las edades.
A él sea la gloria y el poder a través de todas
las edades
por siempre. Amén."

La "bisagra" que es esta Fiesta es la que ve el cierre del tiempo litúrgico de Navidad y el comienzo del "tiempo ordinario".

"Además de las épocas del año que tienen su propio carácter distintivo, quedan en el ciclo anual treinta y tres o treinta y cuatro semanas en las que no se celebra ningún aspecto particular del misterio de Cristo, sino que **se honra el misterio de Cristo mismo en su plenitud**, especialmente los Domingos. Este período se conoce como "Tiempo ordinario" (Normas universales para el año y calendario litúrgicos, n. 43) ".

Me he tomado la libertad de resaltar una frase en particular de esta descripción, que me sirve como recordatorio de que todo lo que somos y somos como pueblo de fe está centrado en Jesucristo, o de lo contrario es bastante superfluo para nuestros esfuerzos como discípulos de Jesús.

Aquí en Lourdes, hace unos años, pasamos un tiempo reflexionando sobre nuestro propósito como parroquia católica en Northridge. Consideramos lo que podría significar ser discípulos de Jesús más allá de asistir a la iglesia los Domingos. ¿Cómo sería si realmente tratamos de enfocarnos en la centralidad de Jesús y su misión y ministerio? ¿Cómo sería si nos comprometemos intencionalmente a ser fieles discípulos de Jesús en nuestras palabras y en nuestras acciones como personal parroquial, como grupo de líderes ministeriales en nuestra comunidad y como parte de la comunidad general de creyentes que va a componen la parroquia?

Hace unos años, recuerdo estar parado frente a una reunión de los líderes de nuestros muchos y variados ministerios y pedirles que imaginaran un escenario en

el que la parroquia no existiera, o que imaginaran que había otro terremoto en el que la planta parroquial simplemente es destruida. La pregunta era reconstruiremos la parroquia y por qué?

Esa pregunta dio lugar a mucha discusión y reflexión que continuó mucho más allá de esa reunión. En conversaciones posteriores con el Consejo Pastoral Parroquial y con miembros del personal parroquial, y en otras reuniones de líderes ministeriales, se llegó a las palabras que están inscritas en nuestras puertas: "Abrazando al Pueblo de Dios. Equipando a los Discípulos. Acompañando Creyentes".

Yo creo que estas palabras son significativas para todos nosotros en la medida en que nos recuerdan, nos exhortan, nos desafían a dar testimonio de nuestra fe en formas en las que **el misterio de Cristo mismo es honrado en su plenitud**.

Así como Jesús encontró a las personas tal como eran, en las circunstancias ordinarias de sus vidas, a menudo complejas y multifacéticas, así también nosotros, como comunidad de creyentes, buscamos encontrar y abrazar a todo el pueblo de Dios.

Así como Jesús pasó tiempo con sus seguidores y los preparó para roles particulares en la vida de sus vidas, así como en la vida organizada de lo que se convertiría en la Iglesia, así también nosotros, como parroquia, nos esforzamos por equipar a las personas para el discipulado de Jesús vivido en relación con y al servicio del pueblo de Dios.

También vemos la importancia de vivir el mandamiento final de Jesús a sus seguidores, seguros de que nunca estaremos solos. Jesús promete caminar siempre con nosotros, guiarnos, salvaguardarnos y estar siempre presente con nosotros. Así también, como discípulos suyos, buscamos acompañarnos unos a otros en el camino de la vida, ofreciendo compañerismo y acompañamiento como podamos.

Cuando vivimos a la altura de nuestras palabras, cuando estamos a la altura de nuestra misión, esta se desarrolla dentro del contexto de los momentos ordinarios de nuestras vidas y, en su mayor parte, en el tiempo ordinario de nuestras vidas. Bendiciones para todos ustedes en esta temporada.

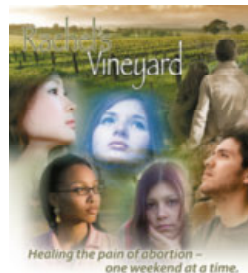

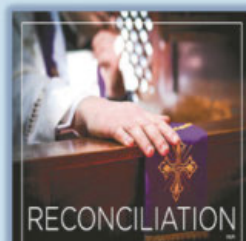



DID YOU KNOW?

Check Your Child's Backpack

As you and your children prepare for their return to school after Christmas break, make sure they are not carrying too much around in their backpacks. Backpacks that are too heavy can cause problems like neck or back pain, or poor posture. The American Chiropractic Association (ACA) recommends that a child's backpack weigh no more than 5-10% of the child's body weight. Help your children by ensuring that they wear their backpacks correctly, with both straps over the shoulders, and that they are only carrying what they need. If you have concerns about the load your child is carrying, reach out to a teacher or school staff to discuss what should and should not be coming home every day. Revise la Mochila de su hijo/hija

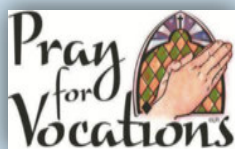

Las mochilas demasiado pesadas pueden causar problemas como dolor de cuello o espalda, o mala postura. La Asociación Americana de Quiropráctica (ACA) recomienda que la mochila de un niño no pese más del 5-10 por ciento del peso corporal del niño. Ayude a sus hijos asegurándose de que usen correctamente sus mochilas, con ambas correas sobre los hombros, y de que solo carguen lo que necesitan. Si tiene inquietudes sobre la carga que lleva su hijo, comuníquese con un maestro o personal de la escuela para hablar sobre lo que debe y no debe llevar a casa todos los días.
