

Did you know? December 25-26 || Check Christmas presents for button batteries Many parents will be spending

the next few days and weeks assembling (and reassembling) their children's gifts, and it's important to be on the lookout for potential hazards, including button batteries. Button batteries are small, round discs used in anything from toys to key fobs to watches. If these batteries end up being swallowed or placed in a child's nose or ears,



WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question:



I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?


