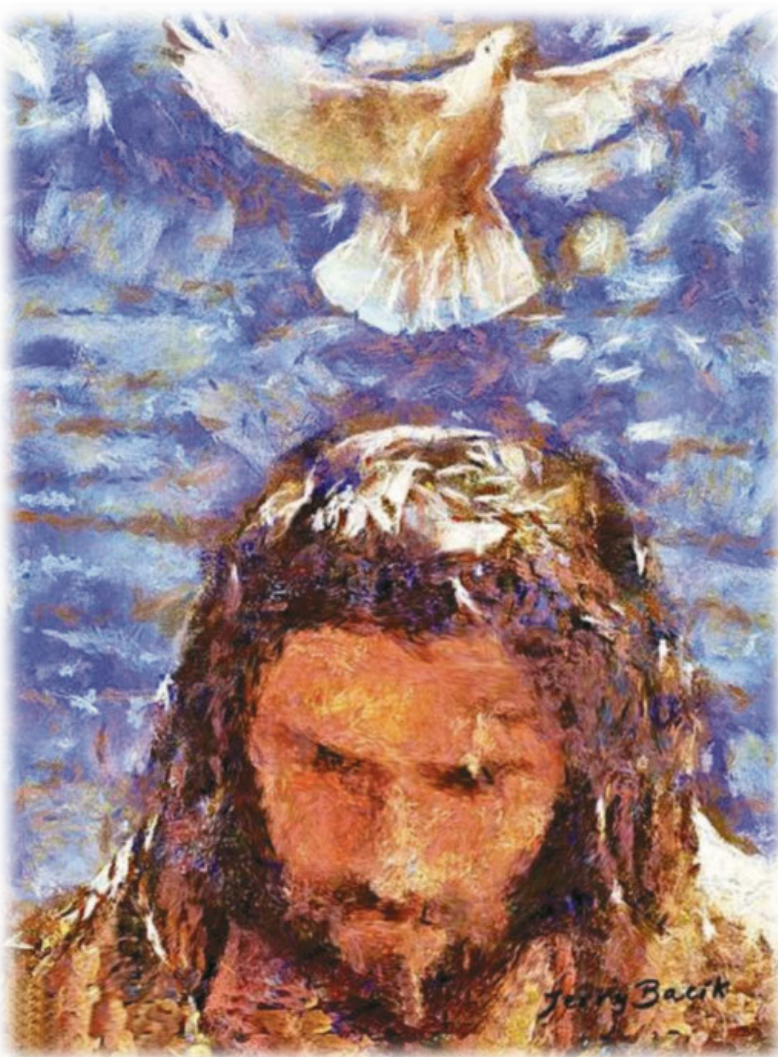

WE HOSTED OUR LADY OF JUQUILA

Yesterday, Saturday, the 8th, St. Mary's hosted followers of Our Lady of Juquila from all over southern California.

In the state of Oaxaca, about 4 hours Southeast of Oaxaca City, 16th century, about 30 cm natural wood with burn marks from a fire. The Virgin of Juquila,

There are several versions of the legend of this Dear Dark One. The most common one claims that her first known owner was a Dominican priest. He was the first to bring Christianity to the state of Oaxaca. Some say he brought this statue from the Philippines, which would explain the oriental hair do under her wig. He kept this little figure on his personal altar until he moved on to another area in 1558. The monk had an indigenous house servant to whom he gave the Madonna. The humble peasant kept her on an altar in his hut and that's where she first began to perform miracles. Once she was recognized as a miracle worker, her fame quickly spread.

75 years later, in 1633, the Church authorities decided it was time to build a church for her. Somehow he was persuaded to let the Dark Mother move out of his hut and into a Christian temple.

One year a great fire consumed the whole village, including the church. When they returned to see if the fire had spared anything, they found the only surviving object in the church and the village was the Most Pure Virgin standing on her sculpted agave plant, on which she still abides today. The fire stained her face dark giving her the title Morenita. So her fame spread even more. The priest in the nearby town of Juquila wanted her in his own church and somehow "persuaded" her owners to give her up. However, it seems that Our Lady also wanted to stay with the simple folk in the mountains and so, the night after she had been brought to Juquila, she stole back to Amialtepec.

The Indians were punished for stealing her, she was brought back to Juquila and guarded day and night. Still, she escaped again and returned home. But the fourth time the image remained in Juquila and gradually people accepted the Mother's new home. She appeased them by continuing to work miracles in both her old and new domicile. Her children learned how to honor her in both places.

The feast day of the Morenita of Juquila is December 8th. On any given day you'll pass hundreds of pilgrims on foot and bicycle, some camping out for days, even months. On her special day the occasion is celebrated with a fair, fireworks, sporting events, indigenous and contemporary dances.

LE DIMOS HOSPEDAJE A NUESTRA SRA. DE JUQUILA

Ayer, Sábado, día 8 del mes, Santa María le dio la bienvenida a los devotos de la Virgen de Juquila que vinieron de todo el alrededor del sur de California.

Aproximadamente a 4 horas del sur-oeste de la ciudad de Oaxaca, en el siglo 16, de unos 30 cm de madera natural dejando marcas de fuego de la Virgen de Juquila,

Hay varias versiones de esta leyenda de nuestra Querida Morenita. La mas común dice que su primer propietario era una sacerdote Dominicco. El fue el primero en traer la Cristiandad al estado de Oaxaca. Algunos dicen que el trajo esta estatua de las Filipinas, esto explicaría el peinado con pelo oriental debajo de la peluca. El guardaba esta pequeña estatua en su altar personal hasta que se cambio a otra área en 1558. El monje tenia un sirviente indígena en su casa a la que le dio la Virgen. El siervo hizo un humilde altar en su choza, ahí fue donde primero empezaron los milagros. Una vez que fue reconocida como milagrosa, su fama empezó a cundir rápidamente.

75 años después, en 1633, las autoridades de la Iglesia decidieron construir una iglesia para ella. De alguna manera fue persuadido a permitir que la Morenita saliera de su choza a un templo Cristiano.

Un año una gran quemazón consumió todo el pueblo, incluyendo a la iglesia. Cuando regresaron a ver si a través de las llamas se había salvado algo, encontraron que el único objeto que se había salvado en la iglesia y en el pueblo fue la Mas Pura Virgen parada en la planta de agave, en donde hoy todavía sigue de pie. Las llamas quemaron su rostro dándole el titulo de la Morenita. Entonces su popularidad creció aun mas. El sacerdote en el pueblo cercano de Juquila la quería en su propia Iglesia y de alguna manera se la ingeniaron para convencer a sus dueños para cederla. Pero, parece que Nuestra Señora se quería quedar con la gente sencilla de las montañas y por eso, en la noche cuando la llevaron a Juquila, ella se regreso a Amialtepec. Los Indios

fueron castigados por habérsela robado, entonces fue regresada a Juquila y custodiada día y noche. Y todavía así, se les escapo nuevamente y se regreso a casa. Pero la cuarta vez la imagen permaneció en Juquila y poco a poco la gente acepto la nueva casa de la Madre. Ella poco a poco los calmo al continuar obrando milagros en su antiguo domicilio y en el actual. Sus hijos aprendieron como venerarla en ambos lugares.

El día de fiesta de la Morenita de Juquila es el 8 de Diciembre. En uno de esos días pasan cientos de peregrinos a pie o en bicicleta, algunos acampando por días a algunos hasta por meses. En su día especial la ocasión se celebra con una buena cantidad de juegos artificiales, eventos deportivos, bailes indígenas y contemporáneos.

POPE TO KIDS: JESUS LOVES YOU, WANTS YOU TO LOVE OTHERS

At a meeting in the Vatican audience hall, Pope Francis told children that Christmas is a sign of how much God loves them, and they are called to share that love.

As a toddler roamed the room, checking out everything, Pope Francis told the parents to let him be and told the other kids that they, too, should have the courage to investigate their surroundings. The meeting included a slightly marred birthday cake for the pope — two of the little ones who helped present the cake each ran a finger through the icing before the singing was over. Pope Francis had turned 85 Dec. 17.

"Each of us is a unique person. No two are alike," he said. "We are not photocopies; we are all original!" "This is how Jesus sees you. He loves you as you are, even if someone does not respect you and thinks you count for little."

But the pope asked the children to be attentive because "the bad thing is when we want to imitate others and do the things that other people do, from originals we become photocopies."

Especially as Christmas approaches, Pope Francis asked the children to be close to others just as Jesus is close to them, to help their friends and relatives and anyone who seems in need. And, he said, don't forget to talk to Jesus.

The pope encouraged them to learn to listen and to see what other people need. "Listen" is an important word, he told them. "Someone who doesn't listen to others only listens to themselves. And it's boring to only listen to yourself." (from [National Catholic Reporter](#))

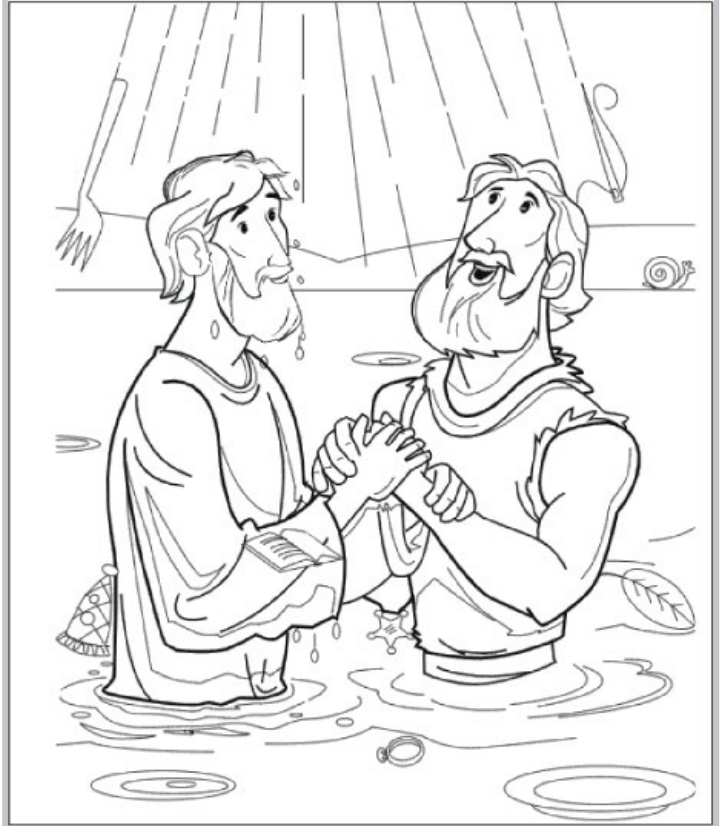

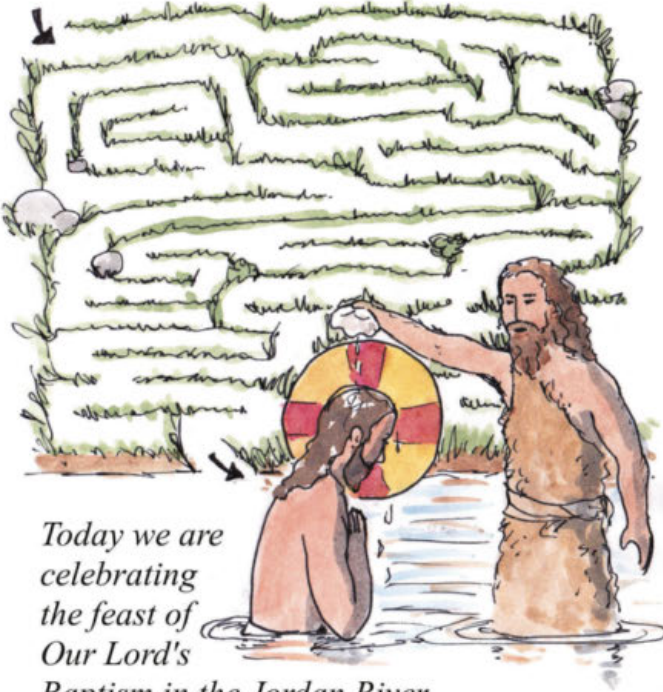

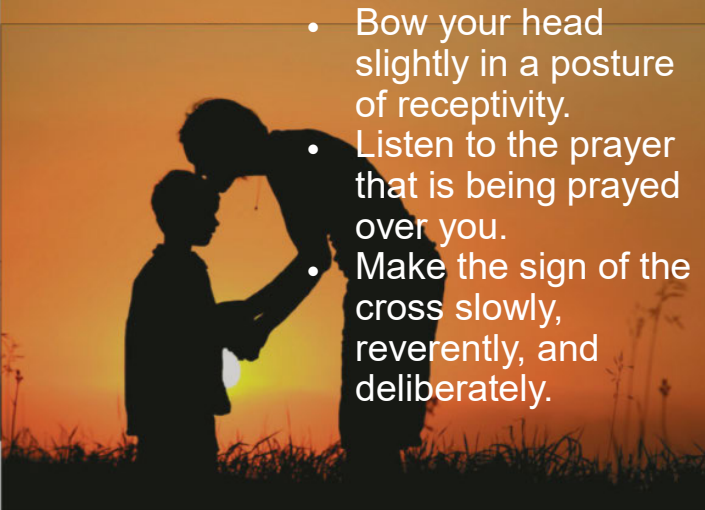
