

PASTOR'S CORNER

My dear Parishioners,

We are now just a week before Holy Week, and I hope that you and I have come closer to a loving relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I presume that we have all observed the disciplines of Lent by spending more time in prayer, by fasting from things and activities that are not of God, and by our generous giving of ourselves and our time to attend to the needs of others, especially those closest to us, our family members. Given those opportunities I am assured that it became easier for us to make Jesus the center and meaning of our lives.

I would like to share this wonderful statement from the pastoral constitution on the Church in the modern world of the Second Vatican Council (*Gaudium et spes*, Nn. 9-10) that reaffirms what I commented above as far as the result of our Lenten observance.

Man's deeper questionings

The world of today reveals itself as at once powerful and weak, capable of achieving the best or the worst. There lies open before it the way to freedom or slavery, progress or regression, brotherhood or hatred. In addition, man is becoming aware that it is for himself to give the right direction to forces that he himself has awakened, forces that can be his master or his servant. He therefore puts questions to himself.

The tensions disturbing the world of today are in fact related to a more fundamental tension rooted in the human heart. In man himself many elements are in conflict with each other. On one side, he has experience of his many limitations as a creature. On the other, he knows that there is no limit to his aspirations, and that he is called to a higher kind of life.

Many things compete for his attention, but he is always compelled to make a choice among them, and to renounce some. What is more, in his weakness and sinfulness he often does what he does not want to do and fails to do what he would like to do. In consequence, he suffers from a conflict within himself, and this in turn gives rise to so many great tensions in society.

Very many people, infected as they are with a materialistic way of life, cannot see this dramatic state of affairs in all its clarity, or at least are prevented from giving thought to it because of the unhappiness that they themselves experience. Many think that they can find peace in the different philosophies that are proposed. Some look for complete and genuine liberation for man from man's efforts alone. They are convinced that the coming kingdom of man on earth will satisfy all the desires of his heart.

There are those who despair of finding any meaning in life: they commend the boldness of those who deny all significance to human existence in itself, and seek to impose a total meaning on it only from within themselves. But in the face of the way the world is developing today, there is an ever increasing number of people who are asking the most fundamental questions or are seeing them with a keener awareness: What is man? What is the meaning of pain, of evil, of death, which still persist in spite of such great progress? What is the use of those successes, achieved at such a cost? What can man contribute to society, what can he expect from society? What will come after this life on earth?

The Church believes that Christ died and rose for all, and can give man light and strength through his Spirit to fulfill his highest calling; His is the only name under heaven in which men can be saved. So too the Church believes that the center and goal of all human history is found in her Lord and Master.

The Church also affirms that underlying all changes there are many things that do not change; they have their ultimate foundation in Christ, who is the same yesterday, today and for ever.

I invite you to please join our parish community in observing our Holy Week celebrations, starting with Palm Sunday on February 28, and the Tenebrae Service on Holy Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. which concludes the Lenten Season. We begin the observance of the TRIDUUM on Holy Thursday with the commemoration of the Last Supper and washing of the feet, followed by the Good Friday service of the Passion and Death of our Lord, and the joyous celebration of Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday at 7:30 p.m. when 2 individuals will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church. I look forward to seeing you and your family then. Let us continue to pray for each other. And ask St. Joseph, patron of the Church, to intercede for us!



The Ventura Youth Correctional Facility in Camarillo has 250 youth who have not had any visitors this past year due to COVID-19.

You can make a difference by “visiting” these youth who are incarcerated through writing an Easter note!

Because they are in a Correctional Facility, there are strict guidelines we need to follow:

- ✦ Notes must be on a large index card with no envelope.
- ✦ Please keep the message simple and general for a male or female youth.
- ✦ You can include an encouraging Scripture verse, a positive quote, poem, or song lyrics.
- ✦ You can decorate your note with crayons and markers.
- ✦ No stickers or glitter allowed.
- ✦ Let the youth know you are praying for them.
- ✦ Sign your note with your first name only.
- ✦ Do not include any of your contact information.

Please drop your note in the marked bin in the vestibule when you come to Mass this weekend or at the Faith Formation Office by 4 p.m. on Wednesday, March 24th.



Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments

When Our Own Hour Comes

We parents know that it's tricky, tackling the topic of fear with our kids. We want them to know that it's okay to be scared, that it's something we all feel from time to time. We want them to understand that bravery isn't the absence of fear, but the choices we make in persevering despite that feeling.

Most of all, we want to model the right kind of behavior for our kids. Whatever our scary situation is — illness, a job loss, life changes — we want them to see us make a choice to face that fear head-on.

Jesus seems to be the parent who is gently broaching the topic of fear with his children. A great sense of foreboding hangs over these readings. Jesus knew what was coming. He knew it was going to be hard, both for him and for his followers, who did not have his courage. Even he admits to being "troubled" and he speaks of "the time of judgment." There is the dramatic raising of Lazarus, the talk of how a grain of wheat must die in order to bear fruit, the depiction of Christ as an obedient student of his own suffering.

"Yet what should I say?" he asks them. "Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."

This week, Christ gives us a very parental gift: He shows us his fear, and he shows us how to conquer it. He challenges us to embrace the purpose for which we came to this hour — whatever that hour may hold.




First and foremost, we would like to extend a warm welcome to Joe Miskevics, our newest brother and member of our council.






