PASTOR'S CORNER

My dear Parishioners,

Happy Pentecost to all of you! May the Holy Spirit open the eyes of all people to see the dignity, the beauty and the goodness of every person as created in the image and likeness of God.

Allow me now to present to you the second half of the article written by Cardinal Roger Mahony to make us aware of the evil of racism as it happened then and now. The article, I think, is calling all people of good will and especially all Catholics to work together to put an end to the sin of inequalities or discrimination in our own neighborhood and in our country.

Here is the continuation:

FURTHER INCIDENTS - Between 1942 and 1945, some 120,000 Japanese across the country were rounded up and confined in ten different relocation camps in several States. Two of those camps were here in California: Manzanar Relocation Center along the eastern Sierra Nevada Mountains, and the Tule Lake Relocation Center in northern California.

These Japanese, many USA citizens, were presumed to be "pro-Japan" during World War II. These camps were fortified with no opportunity to depart, a veritable prison setting.

Following the end of the war in 1945, those in internment camps were allowed to return to their homes. These Japanese were often met with suspicion and hostility for years to come.

After the fall of Vietnam in April of 1975 to the Viet Cong, thousands of Vietnamese refugees were housed in many countries across southeast Asia. Many were permitted to come to California under the auspices of the Catholic Church acting as partner with the government to help resettle so many refugees. The Catholic Church played a very important role in this resettlement process.

Since Cambodians and Hmong people had collaborated with our country in trying to repel communists in Vietnam, our government had to bring many to our State to avoid being imprisoned or killed.

There then followed a large influx of Koreans to southern California. Next, people from throughout Southeast Asia and Asia Pacific began arriving here.

Many people from all of these groups brought with them their Catholic faith, and many special Centers sprung up to serve them.

Despite our best efforts to enculturate our many Asian brothers and sisters into our society in California, the Asians continued to be subject to verbal and physical insults and attacks. The naming of Covid-19 as a Chinese or Asian flu created renewed hostility and attacks upon all Asians because most Caucasians cannot distinguish the various Asian peoples and their varying countries.

The Catholic Church had a strong presence in many of these countries, and many priests and Sisters came to assist them in spiritual and pastoral ministry.

V. CONCLUSION - Sadly, so many aspects of hateful discrimination live on in our State--from the 1860s until today. Our road forward is rooted in our Catholic teaching of the equality of all peoples God has placed on our earth. There are none "better" or others "worse." We share our resemblance to God's spirit and share this journey forward. Now is the time for us to reach out to all our Asian brothers and sisters with a new sense of welcome and to diminish hateful speech and actions from our hearts, from our lives, and from our communities.

My sincere gratitude to Cardinal Roger Mahony for sharing this information and truly appreciate his loving concern for all peoples, as children of God.

So, my friends let us remember what Jesus said: "If you keep my commandment you will remain in my love". "And if you love me, you will do what I command you". "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you". Through the Holy Spirit may we be given the courage and the willingness to do God's will in our lives all the times.


May 23, 2021 - Pentecost Sunday

“Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.”

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.”

-John 20: 21-22

PENTECOST



Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit

The following prayer was recited by Pope Benedict XVI in a homily on November 7, 2006. This is a prayer to the Holy Spirit.

Let us invoke him
so that he will irrigate, warm and straighten,
so that he will pervade us
with the power of his sacred flame

at this time, in these days.



From the diary of St. Faustina: I got up much earlier than usual and went to the chapel, steeping myself in the love of God. Before receiving Holy Communion, I silently renewed my religious vows. After Holy Communion, the infinite love of God swept over me. My soul was in communion with the Holy Spirit, who is the same Lord as the Father and the Son. His breath filled my soul with such delight that it would be useless for me to try to give even a faint idea of what my heart experienced. Throughout the whole day, wherever I was and regardless of with whom I talked, a vivid presence of God accompanied me; my soul was drowned in thanksgiving for these great graces. (Diary 1781)

My prayer response: Through the writings of St. Faustina, I have a chance to see what is possible. Come Holy Spirit, enkindle me with the fire of Your Love. Remind me of the infinite love of God that I may recognize His presence vividly in every moment.

You Don't Have What It Takes — but You Will

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: *Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.*

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your-tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide.

Tu no Tienes lo que se Necesita, Pero lo Tendrás

Aquellos de nosotros en el ministerio amamos este dicho: Dios no llama a los equipados. Él equipa a los llamados.

Todos conocemos ese tipo de sensación de malestar que tenemos en la boca del estómago cuando queda claro lo que se supone que debemos hacer, en cualquier situación. Es esa sensación de: *Oh, no. Yo no. Ahora no. No puedo.*

Todos tenemos nuestra lista de razones por las que no, ¿no es así? Lo hacemos para todo, desde los grandes problemas de la vida hasta las pequeñas decisiones cotidianas. No voy a invitar a mi vecino a la iglesia porque no quiero parecer insistente. No voy a hacer las paces con mi prima porque simplemente volverá a pisotearme. No voy a rezar el Rosario esta noche porque estoy cansado y me estresará.

Sin embargo, incluso si todos juntamos nuestras listas de "razones por las que no podemos", no creo que ninguno de nosotros tenga razones tan válidas como los apóstoles.
