The gift of the Mission

Early on in my work in parish ministry, I had to deal with a tough human resources situation, letting some staff members go and stepping into a role that demanded more of my time and energy.

In moments like this, stewardship can feel burdensome. Things take a turn we didn't expect, perhaps in spite of our best efforts. Maybe more is asked of us than we want or feel prepared to give.

But that's when we need to remember that stewardship isn't a job that we apply for. It's a gift bestowed directly from God, the Creator of all, and that can be scary all on its own, if we are preoccupied with our own unworthiness. What we might want to do is fall on our knees like Simon Peter and announce, "Depart from me, Lord — I am sinful."

But what if we stop looking in the mirror and look instead to God?

All those years ago, when I was faced with that ministerial challenge, I asked my wife to join me. What started as a tough situation turned into a decade of shared ministry with her — an experience I wouldn't trade for anything. It was a burden that became a gift.

We must remember that God knows what He is about. In His mercy, He gives us what we need as everyday stewards. When God calls out, "Whom shall we send?" we — in all our sinfulness — are allowed to cry out "Send me, Lord!" And He sends us out and behold — our nets tear with the bounty we harvest in His name.




Did You Know?

Child safety has been affected by Covid-19 *pandemic* - Today, as we deal with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it is noteworthy that the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) reported that child safety has also been affected as a result of the COVID -19 pandemic. "In 2021, NCMEC stated that they had experienced a 97.5% increase in online enticement reports between January 2020 and December 2020, versus the same time period in 2019." NCMEC maintains a 24hour hotline at 1-800-843-5678, and the CyberTipline receives reports of child sexual exploitation incidents via an online form at https://report.cybertip.org/. Historically, Get On The Bus has been incredibility unique because of the special family reunifications we have done through the visits between incarcerated parents and their children.

Due to the virus, like most places, the institutions have been closed for many months to in-person visits. During these months we have become more and more aware of how our families have suffered from lack of contact with their loved ones.

We have been working closely with California Corrections and Rehabilitation to do virtual visits and to teach our families how to use the programs so they could have virtual visits. We have provided

back packs with school supplies, food when needed, and constant support. We had so hoped that we would be able to go this spring on our buses with the families, but it is not to be.

So, we are doing the next best thing - we are having the first GET ON THE BUS virtual event. We will provide a meal for the families and also for the incarcerated parent, they will share the meal through Zoom. A love letter from the parent and a Teddy Bear will be provided at the end of the call. Online games, approved by the CDCR, will be available for the children to play with the parent. At the end of the call "Stay Connected Kits" will be distributed to the children.

All of this is possible due to the generous donations from all of you. We have purchased 12 computers, and through the generosity of Deacon Jim Carper, we have 12 classrooms we can use for this wonderful event.

Our sincere hope is that the pandemic will be over soon and the buses will began rolling. I have the request in that we have one of the first buses going, and will keep everyone posted.

Mark your calendars for our **Document Shredding Fundraiser** on Saturday, April 2nd. We'll be in the parking lot from 9am to 12noon. It's never too early to start checking those drawers and closets for outdated files and documents - and we'll be posting reminders.
