



# Reflection and Prayer



#### WEEKLY REFLECTION: "OPEN MY EYES, LORD"

Today's Entrance Antiphon directs us "to turn to the Lord and his strength, constantly seeking his face." This exhortation is our road map for life as we seek to witness God's grace in our lives. The first reading from Jeremiah provides an example of God's promised grace, the deliverance of the Israelites from bondage. This deliverance is referenced in the Responsorial Psalm when the Israelites share, "when the Lord brought back the captives of Zion, we were like man dreaming. Then our mouth was filed with laughter, and our tongue with rejoicing." The Israelites' joy was enhanced by their understanding that God was interacting in their lives and would continue to by sending the Messiah.

Paul's letter to the Hebrews speaks to the promised one of God who would be "their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins." Paul reminds his community that, "it was not Christ who glorified himself in becoming high priest, but rather the one who said to him: 'You are my son: this day I have begotten you." Jesus is indeed our Messiah who engages each of us.

The gospel reading illustrates this intimacy when Bartimaeus cries to Jesus, "Master, I want to see." Bartimaeus desires to see the Lord; he is seeking to be delivered from the darkness that has engulfed him. We are like Bartimaeus. Although not physically blind, we can be spiritually blind. We seek to see Jesus, to be near him, to rest in his presence. We seek the reassurance with which Jesus blessed Bartimaeus, "Go your way; your faith has saved you."



**REFLEXION:** "ABRE MIS OJOS, SEÑOR"

La Antífona de Entrada el día de hoy nos dirige a "volvernos hacia el Señor y su fortaleza y buscar constantemente su rostro". Esta exhortación es nuestro plan de ruta para vivir mientras buscamos ser testigos de la gracia de Dios en nuestras vidas. La Primera Lectura según Jeremías ofrece un ejemplo de la gracia prometida por Dios: la liberación de los israelitas de la esclavitud. Esta liberación se menciona en el Salmo Responsorial cuando los israelitas dicen: "Cuando el Señor nos hizo volver del cautiverio, creíamos soñar; entonces no cesaba de reír nuestra boca ni se cansaba entonces la lengua de cantar". El gozo de los israelitas creció al comprender que Dios estaba actuando en sus vidas y continuaría con el envío del Mesías.

La Carta de San Pablo a los Hebreos habla del sumo sacerdote que Dios prometió para "intervenir en favor de ellos ante Dios, para ofrecer dones y sacrificios por los pecados". Pablo recuerda a su comunidad que "Cristo no se confirió a sí mismo la dignidad de sumo sacerdote; se la otorgó quien le había dicho: Tú eres mi Hijo, yo te he engendrado hoy". Jesús es nuestro Mesías y está presente en cada uno de nosotros.

Por su parte, el Evangelio ilustra esta cercanía cuando Bartimeo le contesta a Jesús: "Maestro, quiero ver". Bartimeo desea ver al Señor y ser liberado de las tinieblas que lo envuelven. En este sentido, somos como Bartimeo porque, aunque no estemos ciegos físicamente, podemos estar ciegos espiritualmente. Buscamos ver a Jesús, estar cerca de él, descansar en su presencia. Buscamos la seguridad con la que Jesús bendijo a Bartimeo: "Vete; tu fe te ha salvado".

#### Enseñanza Social Católica

En un mundo donde unos principalmente hablamos sobre los "derechos" y otros sobre las "responsabilidades", la tradición Católica enseña que la dignidad humana puede ser protegida y que una comunidad sana puede lograrse solo si los derechos humanos son protegidos y si se cumplen las responsabilidades. Así pues, cada persona tiene un derecho fundamental a la vida y un derecho a las cosas que son requeridas para la dignidad humana. Correspondiente a estos derechos están las obligaciones y responsabilidades, uno al otro, a nuestras familias, y la sociedad en general. Aunque el debate público en nuestro país a menudo nos divide entre los que se enfocan en la responsabilidad personal y los que se enfocan en las responsabilidades sociales, nuestra tradición insiste que los dos son necesarios – reflexión de los Obispos de EE.UU.

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


