Mass Readings

First Reading

Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it—for he was standing higher up than any of the people—and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people: "Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep"—for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law. He said further: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; or today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, or rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!"

Second Reading

1 Cor 12:12-30

Brothers and sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?

Gospel

Lk 1:1-4; 4:14-21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: *The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.* Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



It's Word of God Sunday!

The Bible, also known as Sacred Scripture, is a central core of our faith tradition. As the Church interprets the meaning and importance of this Word of God, Catholics see this as the foundation of the Sacred Tradition of our Catholic Faith. The Word Made Flesh is Jesus and the way that we interpret its meaning is through the eyes and heart of Christ. This is why we hold the Biblical Word with reverence.

Unfortunately, the impact of the Protestant Reformation forced a division in the Christian community. Protestantism demanded "Sola Scriptura", Scripture alone, while the Catholic faithful maintained the Church's right to interpret and teach both the biblical and ecclesial tradition. In a way, it appeared that Catholics diminished their understanding and

appreciation of the Bible. However, biblical use and language was incorporated into the fullness of Catholic life and prayer through the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, and every prayer of the Church.

We have a revitalized appreciation for the Word of God that has emerged through the renewal of Vatican II. The weekday and Sunday readings, proclaimed by the laity, shares the Word of God for the edification of all the faithful. Catholics participate in Bible studies and in faith-sharing communities. Homilies are prepared to reveal the meaning and importance of the Sacred Scriptures for our inspiration today. The Word of God is delivered over the internet, through daily Apps, and in the printed pages of monthly publications. Catholics are both Word and Sacrament people.

It is common for Catholics to surf the internet to view Mass and homilies. In fact, I know people who search out their favorite preachers in order to hear their

understanding of the Word. Ideally, this is to help us to draw more closely to Jesus. It is also our hope that in meeting Jesus in this way, our encounter with the Eucharistic Lord is even more powerful. On this Word of God Sunday, Pope Francis invites the Church to pray, study, and meet Jesus in the Sacred Scriptures. Only then can we hear the Lord of Life speak to our hearts to live what we have heard and Him we have received in His Body and Blood. Study the Word daily. Read the Sacred Scripture before Mass and prepare yourself in this way. Join a Bible study or faith-sharing group. Reflect on the Word through "Lectio Divina". Become invested in the saving gift of Christ who gathers us in His name, as we go forth to live and proclaim the Good News of Christ. Be a blessing this Sunday to all you meet so that through you others may meet Christ.

WEEKLY REFLECTION: JESUS REVEALS GOD TO US "NOW"

"Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your healing." These words coming from today's Gospel presents to us the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It started in the synagogue where he grew up; Jesus was in the midst of neighbors and people he knew who taught him the Law. Jesus who was educated as a child and grew up in the community is now standing up, taking the floor and proclaiming the Good News. Jesus receives the scroll of Isaiah and reads a passage that summarizes his whole life mission here on earth.

Jesus reveals God to us, who comes to meet us and call us to share and take part in this present moment: "proclaiming good news to the poor...bringing liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, setting at liberty those who are oppressed, announcing the year of the Lord's favor." The Word, Jesus, has come to fulfill the word, to enter into the midst of these negative situations and bring forth the grace of salvation. This is God now. God becomes present with Jesus: it has a face, it has flesh. This is where we come to experience the merciful love of the Lord in our daily hardships and struggles. God becomes present in every situation and every circumstance. This is a time to be grateful and to acknowledge the deliverance and freedom that God has performed in our lives. This is the time to share the word of God. May we gather in communion, experience the glory of God in our lives, and become God's instruments of salvation to one another.

Ayuda de Adoración

Primera Lectura

Segunda Lectura

Hermanos: Así como el cuerpo es uno y tiene muchos miembros y todos ellos, a pesar de ser muchos, forman un solo cuerpo, así también es Cristo. Porque todos nosotros, seamos judíos o no judíos, esclavos o libres, hemos sido bautizados en un mismo Espíritu, para formar un solo cuerpo, y a todos se nos ha dado a beber del mismo Espíritu.

El cuerpo no se compone de un solo miembro, sino de muchos. Si el pie dijera: "No soy mano, entonces no formo parte del cuerpo", ¿dejaría por eso de ser parte del cuerpo? Y si el oído dijera: "Puesto que no soy ojo, no soy del cuerpo", ¿dejaría por eso de ser parte del cuerpo? Si todo el cuerpo fuera ojo, ¿con qué oiríamos? Y si todo el cuerpo fuera oído, ¿con qué oleríamos? Ahora bien, Dios ha puesto los miembros del cuerpo cada uno en su lugar, según lo quiso. Si todos fueran un solo miembro, ¿dónde estaría el cuerpo?

Cierto que los miembros son muchos, pero el cuerpo es uno solo. El ojo no puede decirle a la mano: "No te necesito"; ni la cabeza, a los pies: "Ustedes no me hacen falta". Por el contrario, los miembros que parecen más débiles son los más necesarios. Y a los más íntimos los tratamos con mayor decoro, porque los demás no lo necesitan. Así formó Dios el cuerpo, dando más honor a los miembros que carecían de él, para que no haya división en el cuerpo y para que cada miembro se preocupe de los demás. Cuando un miembro sufre, todos sufren con él; y cuando recibe honores, todos se alegran con él.

Pues bien, ustedes son el cuerpo de Cristo y cada uno es un miembro de él. 




