

From our Pastor

A Presence of Charity and Unity is Christ

When I was a young boy, I loved playing with magnets. I could drag a horseshoe shaped magnet through the sandpit in our backyard and it would pick up small black iron filings. When I put them into a glass jar, the magnet could move the iron around the jar and different shapes would appear. I learned a simple rule, magnets attract iron and other metals. I also learned that magnets have the power to attract or to repel. Opposite poles attract each other while like poles repel each other. Trying to put two negative or two positive poles together is impossible. When they come close together, there is an invisible force that repels them. It's this experience of polarization which permeates our religious and political discourse today.

Unfortunately, this is nothing new for us as Americans but it may seem to be more virulent and contentious among some folks polarized in today's religious and political activism. As Catholics, we have witnessed during these past few months, our commitment to a Eucharistic Revival which offers us the means toward unity and Christian charity. The Revival calls forth from us a deeper reflection on the "Real Presence" of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and its implications for those who seek a life deeply centered on Christ. This was the prayer that Jesus made to the Father on the night when he instituted the Eucharist: 'That they may be one, as you Father, are in me and I in you; that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me.'" The Cardinal reflected further on the meaning of the Revival by saying:

"What is Eucharistic Revival? We know that such revival, while it is always accompanied by sacramental devotion, must extend beyond devotional practices as well. When we are truly "revived" by the Eucharist, then our encounter with Christ's real presence in the Sacrament opens us to an encounter with Him in the rest of our life. This means seeing Him everywhere we go. It means meeting Him in the interactions we have with others. Not only is He present in our family, friends, and communities; but He is also present in our encounters with people from whom we would otherwise consider ourselves "divided". This might include people from a different economic class or race, people who challenge our way of thinking, and people whose perspective is informed by experiences that differ greatly from our own. When we encounter such people-- and when the competitive logic of the world urges us to become defensive--Christ is present to be a bridge. Christ, the first-born of all creation, wants to be a bridge between people who are members of the same human family: people who are children of the same Father in heaven, and whose destiny is to be united in love with the same eternal household. If we are experiencing true "Eucharistic revival", then one of the signs will be a greater movement on our part to build bridges of unity."

May we be drawn by our prayer for unity and an encounter with Jesus Christ that this revival has fostered. As we prepare for our annual Feast of Our Lady of the Assumption and the 70th Anniversary of the dedication of our church, we pray to see in one another the face of Christ. May our Blessed Mother lead us closer to her Son and into a more profound love and care for others. May we always discover Christ present in our life. WEEKLY REFLECTION: THE MEANING OF THE BREAD OF LIFE

Again, this weekend the liturgy centers on Jesus' proclamation that He is the Bread of Life. This should not be surprising, since throughout the course of human history God consistently and powerfully gives us Grace, Love, and Life!

The first reading pictures Elijah running for his life through the desert. Speaking God's truth to power, he has been very public in his criticism of Queen Jezebel, and for that he has literally been run out of town under threat of death. So, the image is a broken man flat on his face in the desert sand, exhausted and discouraged, begging God to let him die. God responds not by trying to convince Elijah of the point of life, God simply feeds him.

This is the theme in our Gospel passage. Jesus proclaims to literally life-giving nourishment for His people. But by claiming to be the Bread of Life, many become puzzled, suspicious, even actively hostile. Not unlike what we have observed on the world stage a few weeks ago. This isn't the first time Jesus' proclamation to be the Bread of Life – the only thing that can nourish and heal our lives – has been ridiculed and mocked. So how should we react? As disciples we follow His lead. We don't respond with anger and outrage, but we clearly proclaim the truth.

When Jesus says we must eat his body and drink his blood to have eternal life, he means this literally, not symbolically. This means not only to receive His Real Presence in the Eucharist, but also to live in Communion with Him and one another, to live as He lives – the virtues underlined in the passage from Paul's letter to the Ephesians: kindness, compassion, mutual forgiveness, emptied of bitterness and anger, harsh words, and malice of any kind.

So, as Catholics, we can do nothing less than take the Eucharist as it is offered, as the bread of life. For us, as for Elijah, the message of the angel is the same, "Get up and eat, you have a long way to go. Take what is offered. It will be enough."




Evangelio

Los Días Festivos Nos Recuerdan: A Quien Pertenezcemos

Cuando era niño, me encantaban los imanes. Llevaba un imán en forma de herradura a la arena del patio trasero de mi casa y recogía pequeños pedacitos de hierro. Cuando los ponía en un frasco de vidrio, el imán movía el hierro dentro del frasco y aparecían diferentes figuras. Aprendí una regla sencilla, los imanes atraen al hierro y otros metales. También aprendí que los imanes tienen el poder de atraer o repelar. Los polos opuestos se atraen uno al otro mientras que polos iguales se repelan. Tratar de juntar dos polos negativos o dos polos positivos es imposible. Cuando se acercan uno al otro, hay una fuerza invisible que los aparta. Esta experiencia de polarización es lo que penetra nuestros discursos religiosos y políticos hoy en día.

Desafortunadamente, esto no es nada nuevo para nosotros como norteamericanos, pero puede parecer más virulento y polémico entre algunas personas polarizadas dentro del activismo religioso y político de hoy. Como Católicos, hemos sido testigos en estos últimos meses, de nuestro compromiso al Avivamiento Eucarístico que nos ofrece el camino a la unidad y la caridad Cristiana. El Avivamiento nos invita a una reflexión más profunda de la “Presencia Real” de Jesucristo en la Eucaristía y sus consecuencias para los que buscan una vida profundamente centrada en Cristo. Esta fue la oración de Jesús al Padre la noche en la que instituyó la Eucaristía: “Que todos sean uno: como tú, Padre, estás en mí y yo en ti, que también ellos sean uno en nosotros, para que el mundo crea que tú me enviaste.” En el Avivamiento, el Cardenal reflexionó más sobre este significado cuando dijo:

“¿Qué es el Avivamiento Eucarístico? Sabemos que tal avivamiento, aunque siempre es acompañado por la devoción sacramental, también debe extenderse más allá de las prácticas devocionales. Cuando verdaderamente somos “avivados” por la Eucaristía, entonces nuestro encuentro con la presencia real de Cristo en el Sacramento nos da la apertura a un encuentro con El en toda nuestra vida. Esto significa verlo donde quiera que vayamos. Esto significa encontrarnos con El en las interacciones que tenemos con otros. No solamente está presente en nuestra familia, con los amigos y en las comunidades; sino que él está presente en los encuentros con las personas de las que pudiéramos considerarnos “divididos”. Esto puede incluir a personas de diferentes clases económicas o raza, personas que retan nuestra manera de pensar, y las personas cuya perspectiva se ha formado por las experiencias que son muy diferentes a las nuestras. Cuando nos encontramos con estas personas – y cuando la lógica competitiva del mundo nos impulsa a ser defensivos – Cristo está presente como un puente. Cristo, el primogénito de toda la creación, quiere ser el puente entre las personas porque somos miembros de la misma familia humana: hijos e hijas del mismo Padre en el cielo, y cuyo destino es unirse en amor en nuestro hogar eterno. Si experimentamos un verdadero ‘avivamiento Eucarístico,’ entonces una de las señales será un movimiento más grande de nuestra parte de construir puentes de unidad.”

Que seamos atraídos por nuestra oración por la unidad y el encuentro con Jesucristo que este avivamiento ha fomentado. Al prepararnos para la fiesta anual de Nuestra Señora de la Asunción y el 70 Aniversario de la dedicación de nuestra parroquia, oremos para que veamos entre nosotros el rostro de Cristo. Que nuestra Santísima Madre nos guie más cerca de su Hijo y a un amor y cuidado más profundo por los demás. Que siempre descubramos a Cristo presente en nuestra vida. REFLEXION: EL SIGNIFICADO DEL PAN DE VIDA

Una vez más, este fin de semana la liturgia se centra en la proclamación que hace Jesús de que Él es el Pan de Vida. Esto no debería sorprendernos porque a lo largo de la historia humana, Dios nos da de manera constante y poderosa Gracia, Amor y Vida.

En la Primera Lectura se ve a Elías corriendo por el desierto para salvar su vida porque, al decir la verdad de Dios sobre el poder, ha criticado públicamente a la Reina Jezabel y, por lo tanto, lo ha sido expulsado literalmente de la ciudad bajo amenaza de muerte. Esta imagen es la de un hombre destrozado, exhausto y desanimado, rogando a Dios que lo deje morir. Sin tratar de convencer a Elías sobre el sentido de la vida, Dios responde simplemente dándole de comer.

Éste es el tema de la lectura del Evangelio, en la que Jesús proclama literalmente que es el alimento que da vida a su pueblo. Sin embargo, al afirmar que es el Pan de Vida, muchos se quedan perplejos y se vuelven desconfiados e incluso activamente hostiles. Algo similar a lo que hemos observado en el escenario mundial desde hace unas semanas. Esta no es la primera vez que la proclamación de Jesús de ser el Pan de Vida –lo único que puede nutrir y sanar nuestras vidas– ha sido ridiculizada y burlada. Entonces, ¿cómo debemos reaccionar? Como discípulos, seguimos su ejemplo. No respondemos ni con ira ni con indignación, sino que proclamamos claramente la verdad.

Así pues, como católicos, no podemos hacer otra cosa que tomar la Eucaristía tal como se nos ofrece, como el Pan de Vida. Para nosotros, como para Elías, el mensaje del ángel es el mismo: “Levántate y come, porque aún te queda un largo camino”. Tomemos lo que se nos ofrece. Será suficiente.

Te lo pedimos por Cristo nuestro Señor. **Amén.**

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


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
