



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments The Daily Exam of Stewardship

"Stewardship" can get a bum rap these days. When folks hear the term "stewardship" from the pulpit, their eyes tend to kind of glaze over. "Here's Father asking for more money," they groan inwardly, "Get ready for the passing of the pledge cards."

Christ refutes this idea when he gives us what he calls the greatest commandments — instructing us to love God and to love our neighbor. Now, Christ is a man who chose his words carefully. He meant exactly what he said — and he didn't say that the greatest commandments were to tithe and to give money to charity. If he had wanted stewardship to be only about money, he would have said so.

Sometimes we are indeed called to show our love for God and neighbor in the form of a financial gift. But the concept of Everyday Stewardship — living mindfully in prayer, grateful for our blessings, and gracious to our neighbors, committed to God, and accountable to each other — is about so much more.

I propose a twist on the long-held practice of the "Daily Examen" — a pious devotion wherein, at day's end, we go over the events of the last 24 hours and discern God's will. A Daily Examen of Stewardship might contain questions like this:

How did I love God today? In whom did I love Him? What did God give me today? With whom did I share it? What did I give to Him? To whom did I reach out today? Who reached out to me? Where was God on my list of priorities today? First? Second? Third, fourth?

La "corresponsabilidad" puede tener una mala reputación en estos días. Cuando la gente escucha el término "corresponsabilidad" desde el púlpito, sus ojos tienden a ponerse vidriosos. "Aquí está el padre pidiendo más dinero," se quejan en su interior, "Prepárense para la entrega de las tarjetas de compromiso."

Cristo refuta esta idea cuando nos da lo que él llama los mandamientos más importantes, instruyéndonos a amar a Dios y a nuestro prójimo. Bien, Cristo es un hombre que eligió cuidadosamente sus palabras. Quería decir exactamente lo que decía, y no dijo que los mayores mandamientos eran diezmar y dar dinero a la caridad. Si hubiera querido que la corresponsabilidad se tratara solo de dinero, lo habría dicho.

A veces, de hecho, estamos llamados a mostrar nuestro amor a Dios y al prójimo en forma de donación económica. Pero el concepto de la Corresponsabilidad Diaria - vivir conscientemente en oración, agradecido por nuestras bendiciones y ser amable con nuestro prójimo, comprometido con Dios y rendir cuentas unos a otros – se trata de mucho mas que eso.

Propongo un giro en la práctica del "Examen Diario," una devoción piadosa en la que, al final del día, repasamos los eventos de las últimas 24 horas y discernimos la voluntad de Dios. Un Examen Diario de corresponsabilidad puede contener preguntas como estas:

¿Cómo amé a Dios hoy? ¿En quién lo ame? ¿Qué me dio Dios hoy? ¿Con quién lo compartí? ¿Qué le di? ¿A quién me acerqué hoy? ¿Quién me contactó? ¿Dónde estaba Dios en mi lista de prioridades hoy? ¿Primero? ¿Segundo? ¿Tercero? ¿Cuarto?

THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING REGISTERED!

Being a registered, active and participating member of a Parish is very important especially when you need to baptize, register for religious education classes, sponsor a child for sacraments, get married, obtain letters (letters of good standing, immigration letters, sponsor letters, letters of transfer etc.)

For parents who have children enrolled in Catholic Schools, in order to receive the school reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your family needs to meet the criteria set by the Parish for being a registered, ACTIVE and participating member.

The definition of a registered, active and participating member of this parish includes: being registered for the minimum of six months, attend Sunday Mass regularly as well as contributing with an envelope to our offertory along with (if possible) supporting the ministry life of our parish which is a HUGE plus.

If you aren't registered, come and join our parish family by obtaining a registration form from the parish office OR if you aren't sure if you are registered, call the front office to verify.

¡ES IMPORTANTE ESTAR REGISTRADO!

Ser un miembro registrado, activo y participante de una parroquia es muy importante especialmente cuando usted necesita bautizar, inscribir a los niños o adultos en clases de educación religiosa, ser padrino para los sacramentos, casarse, obtener cartas (cartas de buena reputación, cartas de inmigración, cartas de permiso, etc.)

Para los padres de familia que tienen niños inscritos en las Escuelas Católicas, para recibir un descuento en la colegiatura, su familia debe cumplir con los requisitos establecidos por la parroquia para ser considerado un miembro registrado, <u>ACTIVO</u> y participante.
