

## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

The true meaning of Christmas is not found in the twinkling lights, the beautifully adorned trees, or the exchanged gifts. It is revealed when we find God along the way of our lives, especially when we feel displaced, desperate, and alone. Fleeing from their home, Joseph and Mary cautiously made their way through the uncertain, complex, and dark paths to a longed-for place of safety and welcome. Not sure where to lay their heads, they created makeshift preparations for the birth of their child, the Son of God. God, who always was, is, and will be, without beginning or end is the one constant in life who sees us through difficult and scary times. Jesus is the light, which enlightens everyone, and comes into the world to show us the truth. It is joyful good news that calms our fears and allows us to go forth into the nighttime of our lives, courageously. This is the meaning of Christmas. We are never lost or alone. God is with us, loving us and leading us where we need to be.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint John was one of the Twelve, part of Jesus' inner circle, among the few that witnessed the Transfiguration, the raising of Jarius' Daughter, and the Agony in the garden at Gethsemane. He and his brother James were the sons of Zebedee and Salome. When Jesus called them, they left their father mending nets and followed him. Jesus called the brothers "Boanerges," meaning "sons of thunder" — they were passionate in their faith and Jesus had to rebuke them for their fiery zeal on more than one occasion. John, the younger brother, possibly the youngest disciple, was the only one present at Jesus' death.

Saint John the Apostle is traditionally thought to be the author of the fifth Gospel, the three Epistles of John, and the Book of Revelation. However, there has been some debate among scholars from antiquity to the present. Tradition also gives him the title Beloved Disciple and John's Gospel sees him seated next to Jesus at the last supper and the one to whom Jesus gives the care of Mary at the crucifixion.

Although Church tradition says that John survived the other disciples, living a long life, much of it is steeped in myth and legend. Some say he retired to Ephesus after the crucifixion with Mary and remained there until he died. But in other traditions he is more active. For a time he remained in Jerusalem with the other disciples, then founded churches in Asia Minor. In a legend of his persecution, during the reign of the Emperor Domitian, John is taken to Rome and thrown into a cauldron of boiling oil but preserved from death. He is then exiled to the island of Patmos where the Book of Revelation was written.

Most accounts agree that after his exile and the Assumption of Mary he returned to Ephesus where he died sometime after 98, during the reign of the Emperor Trajan.



<i>A note from Father James</i>	<i>Una Nota del Padre James</i>
<p>Was Jesus born on Dec 25th, AD 1 or Jan 6th, 4th BC?</p> <p>The Bible does not specify a date or month or year. The traditional belief is that Jesus was born on January 6th, 4 BC shortly before the death of Herod the Great in 4 BC. The four earliest Christian writers who report the date of Jesus' birth are Irenaeus (late second century), Clement of Alexandria (about AD 200), Tertullian (early third century), and Africanus (early third century). Africanus specifies the date in terms that can be understood as BC 2 or 3. Luke 3:1 and Luke 3:23 suggest that Jesus turned age thirty in the fifteenth year of Tiberius (AD 29). Hence, many early Christians deduced by calculation that Jesus was born in 2 BC. Month and date: Several considerations strengthen the probability that January 6 was the actual birthday of Christ. Clement of Alexandria's testimony proves that the association of Christ's birth with January 6 was a tradition rooted centuries earlier, perhaps in the early church itself, perhaps even in historical fact. Before the church as a whole fixed the date of the Nativity as 25th of December, the generally accepted date in the Eastern church and possibly also in the Western church was January 6. In fact, no tradition linking Christmas to December 25 can be traced back beyond the time of Constantine. In 336 the church at Rome officially observed the "birth day of Christ" on Dec. 25th. The most important reason to fix Jesus' birth on Dec 25th was that it was the Roman feast of the Sun god celebrated in the pagan Roman Empire. Replacing the pagan feast with Christmas was also a ploy to make Christianity, the newly official religion of the Roman Empire, more palatable to Roman soldiers, many of whom had been devotees of the Roman virility god Mithra whose birthday was also celebrated on Dec 25th. Besides, the first day of Hanukka (the Jewish festival of light) was on December 25th. Hence it is a theologically sound date for Jesus' birth when we consider that every other major event in the unfolding of His redeeming work also fell on a feast day. He died on Passover, He rose again on the Feast of First fruits, and He created the church on Pentecost (Acts 2).</p> <p>Fr. James</p>	<p>¿Jesús nació el 25 de diciembre del 1 d. C. o el 6 de enero del 4 a. C.?</p> <p>La Biblia no especifica una fecha, mes o año. La creencia tradicional es que Jesús nació el 6 de enero del año 4 a. C. poco antes de la muerte de Herodes el Grande en el año 4 a. C. Los cuatro primeros escritores cristianos que informan la fecha del nacimiento de Jesús son Ireneo (finales del siglo II), Clemente de Alejandría (alrededor del año 200 dC), Tertuliano (principios del siglo III) y Africano (principios del siglo III). Africanus especifica la fecha en términos que pueden entenderse como 2 o 3 aC. Lucas 3:1 y Lucas 3:23 sugieren que Jesús cumplió treinta años en el año quince de Tiberio (29 dC). Por lo tanto, muchos cristianos primitivos dedujeron por cálculo que Jesús nació en el año 2 a. Mes y fecha: Varias consideraciones fortalecen la probabilidad de que el 6 de enero fuera el cumpleaños real de Cristo. El testimonio de Clemente de Alejandría prueba que la asociación del nacimiento de Cristo con el 6 de enero era una tradición arraigada siglos antes, tal vez en la iglesia primitiva misma, tal vez incluso en hechos históricos. Antes de que la iglesia en su conjunto fijara la fecha de la Natividad como el 25 de diciembre, la fecha generalmente aceptada en la iglesia oriental y posiblemente también en la iglesia occidental era el 6 de enero. De hecho, no se puede rastrear ninguna tradición que vincule la Navidad con el 25 de diciembre. más allá de la época de Constantino. En el año 336 la iglesia en Roma observó oficialmente el "nacimiento de Cristo" el 25 de diciembre. La razón más importante para fijar el nacimiento de Jesús el 25 de diciembre fue que era la fiesta romana del dios Sol celebrada en el Imperio Romano pagano. Reemplazar la fiesta pagana con Navidad también fue una estrategia para hacer que el cristianismo, la nueva religión oficial del Imperio Romano, fuera más apetible para los soldados romanos, muchos de los cuales habían sido devotos del dios de la virilidad romana Mithra, cuyo cumpleaños también se celebró el 25 de diciembre. Además, el primer día de Hanukka (la fiesta judía de la luz) era el 25 de diciembre. Por lo tanto, es una fecha teológicamente sólida para el nacimiento de Jesús cuando consideramos que todos los demás eventos importantes en el desarrollo de Su obra redentora también coincidieron en un día de fiesta. Murió en la Pascua, resucitó en la Fiesta de las Primicias y creó la iglesia en Pentecostés (Hechos 2).</p> <p>Padre James</p>
