

The Structure of the Mass

The Mass begins with the entrance song. The celebrant and other ministers enter in procession and reverence the altar with a bow and/or a kiss. The altar is a symbol of Christ at the heart of the assembly and so deserves this special reverence. All make the Sign of the Cross and the celebrant extends a greeting to the gathered people in words taken from Scripture.

The Act of Penitence follows the greeting. At the very beginning of the Mass, the faithful recall their sins and place their trust in God's abiding mercy. The Act of Penitence includes the Kyrie Eleison, a Greek phrase meaning, "Lord, have mercy." This litany recalls God's merciful actions throughout history. On Sundays, especially in the Season of Easter, in place of the customary Act of Penitence, from time to time the blessing and sprinkling of water to recall Baptism may take place.

On Sundays and solemnities, the Gloria follows the Act of Penitence. The Gloria begins by echoing the song of the angels at the birth of Christ: "Glory to God in the highest!" In this ancient hymn, the gathered assembly joins the heavenly choirs in offering praise and adoration to the Father and Jesus through the Holy Spirit.

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, also called the Collect. The celebrant invites the gathered assembly to pray and, after a brief silence, proclaims the prayer of the day. The Opening Prayer gives a context for the celebration.

Liturgy of the Word

Most of the Liturgy of the Word is made up of readings from Scripture. On Sundays and solemnities, there are three Scripture readings. During most of the year, the first reading is from the Old Testament and the second reading is from one of the New Testament letters. During the Easter season, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles which tells the story of the Church in its earliest days. The last reading is always taken from one of the four Gospels.

In the Liturgy of the Word, the Church feeds the people of God from the table of his Word (cf. Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, no. 51). The Scriptures are the word of God, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. In the Scriptures, God speaks to us, leading us along the path to salvation.

La estructura de la misa

La Misa comienza con el canto de entrada. El celebrante y los demás ministros entran en procesión y reverencian el altar con un beso. El altar es un símbolo de Cristo en el corazón de la asamblea y por eso merece esta especial reverencia. Todos hacen la Señal de la Cruz y el celebrante extiende un saludo a la gente reunida con palabras tomadas de la Escritura.

El Acto de Penitencia sigue al saludo. Al comienzo de la Misa, los fieles recuerdan sus pecados y depositan su confianza en la misericordia permanente de Dios. El Acto de Penitencia incluye el Kyrie Eleison, una frase griega que significa "Señor, ten piedad". Esta letanía recuerda las acciones misericordiosas de Dios a lo largo de la historia. Los domingos, especialmente en el Tiempo de Pascua, en lugar del acostumbrado Acto de Penitencia, puede tener lugar de vez en cuando la bendición y aspersion del agua para recordar el Bautismo.

Los domingos y solemnidades, el Gloria sigue al Acto de Penitencia. El Gloria comienza repitiendo el canto de los ángeles en el nacimiento de Cristo: "¡Gloria a Dios en las alturas!" En este antiguo himno, la asamblea reunida se une a los coros celestiales para ofrecer alabanza y adoración al Padre y a Jesús por medio del Espíritu Santo.

Los Ritos Introductorios concluyen con la Oración de Apertura, también llamada Colecta. El celebrante invita a rezar a la asamblea reunida y, tras un breve silencio, proclama la oración del día. La oración de apertura da un contexto para la celebración.

Liturgia de la Palabra

La mayor parte de la Liturgia de la Palabra se compone de lecturas de las Escrituras. Los domingos y solemnidades hay tres lecturas bíblicas. Durante la mayor parte del año, la primera lectura es del Antiguo Testamento y la segunda lectura es de una de las cartas del Nuevo Testamento. Durante el tiempo de Pascua, la primera lectura se toma de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, que cuenta la historia de la Iglesia en sus primeros días. La última lectura siempre se toma de uno de los cuatro Evangelios.

En la Liturgia de la Palabra, la Iglesia alimenta al pueblo de Dios con la mesa de su Palabra (cf. Constitución sobre la Sagrada Liturgia, n. 51). Las Escrituras son la palabra de Dios, escrita bajo la inspiración del Espíritu Santo. En las Escrituras, Dios nos habla, guiándonos por el camino de la salvación.

Continuara

The month of May is truly a celebration of motherhood. Traditionally, May has been dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is also the time in which we honor and thank our earthly mothers for their sacrificial love. And the Feast of the Visitation on May 31 celebrates the meeting of two mothers— Mary and Elizabeth—both with a child hidden within their wombs.

Scripture tells us that, following the Annunciation, Mary set out in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant (Lk 1:39). Despite being pregnant herself, Mary undertook the long and likely difficult journey to be at Elizabeth’s side. The Blessed Mother’s example demonstrates supporting and accompanying mothers, especially those who may be experiencing challenging or difficult circumstances. Yet in a culture that disproportionately values independence and self-reliance, mothers in need are too often left isolated and alone, not knowing where to turn for support or assistance. Mary provides a model of how we, as Catholics, are called to come alongside such mothers.

In addition to “walking with” mothers in love, support, and friendship, we can also help answer their needs for practical and material assistance. Inspired by our Blessed Mother, we can help connect mothers with the Church’s extensive network of social services to ensure mothers and their children obtain all the necessities of life. Through generous stewardship of the gifts God has entrusted to us of prayer, time, talent, and treasure, we can help meet the needs of mothers as they welcome and care for God’s precious gift of life.


El mes de mayo es verdaderamente una celebración de la maternidad. Tradicionalmente, el mes de mayo ha sido dedicado a la Santísima Virgen María. También es el momento en que honramos y agradecemos a nuestras madres terrenales por su amor sacrificial. Y la Fiesta de la Visitación, el 31 de mayo, celebra el encuentro de dos madres, María e Isabel, ambas con un niño escondido en sus vientres.

La Escritura nos dice que, después de la Anunciación, María se apresuró a visitar a su prima Isabel, que estaba embarazada (Lc 1,39). A pesar de estar embarazada, María emprendió el largo y probablemente difícil viaje para estar al lado de Elizabeth. El ejemplo de la Santísima Madre demuestra el apoyo y el acompañamiento de las madres, especialmente aquellas que pueden estar pasando por circunstancias desafiantes o difíciles. Sin embargo, en una cultura que valora de manera desproporcionada la independencia y la autosuficiencia, las madres necesitadas a menudo se quedan aisladas y solas, sin saber a dónde acudir en busca de apoyo o asistencia. María proporciona un modelo de cómo nosotros, como católicos, estamos llamados a acompañar a tales madres.

Además de “caminar con” las madres en amor, apoyo y amistad, también podemos ayudar a responder a sus necesidades de asistencia práctica y material. Inspirados por nuestra Santísima Madre, podemos ayudar a conectar a las madres con la extensa red de servicios sociales de la Iglesia para garantizar que las madres y sus hijos obtengan todas las necesidades de la vida. A través de la generosa corresponsabilidad de los dones que Dios nos ha confiado de oración, tiempo, talento y tesoro, podemos ayudar a satisfacer las necesidades de las madres mientras acogen y cuidan el precioso regalo de la vida de Dios.



THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING REGISTERED!

Being a registered, active and participating member of a Parish is very important especially when you need to baptize, register for religious education classes, sponsor a child for sacraments, get married, obtain letters (letters of good standing, immigration letters, sponsor letters, letters of transfer etc.)

For parents who have children enrolled in Catholic Schools, in order to receive the school reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your family needs to meet the criteria set by the Parish for being a registered, ACTIVE and participating member.

The definition of a registered, active and participating member of this parish includes: being registered for the minimum of six months, attend Sunday Mass regularly as well as contributing with an envelope to our offertory along with (if possible) supporting the ministry life of our parish which is a HUGE plus.
