

## **OUR MISSION**

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe that we have come to the end of another liturgical year. The liturgical calendar will change to a new year on the first Sunday of Advent. On the last Sunday of the liturgical year, we celebrate Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This is a lofty title. However, Jesus deserves it. After all, He is our Savior.

Jesus is God's presence amongst us. Jesus is the One that God the Father sent into the world to let His people know that God is truly with us. He is not just some mighty power in the heavens looking down upon His poor people. No, God wanted to be with us in the flesh, which is why Jesus came in the Incarnation. The whole liturgical calendar celebrates this fact.

The liturgical year starts with Advent, which is the preparation for the coming of the Lord. Many of the prophets of the Old Testament foretold that a Messiah would be coming. Advent anticipates His first coming, which happened almost two-thousand years ago, and Advent anticipates the second coming of Jesus at the end of time. As we prepare our hearts to celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas, so we prepare our hearts to receive Jesus when He comes again.

Christmas celebrates the coming of our Savior in the flesh. God is now amongst His people. What joy those people must have felt at the birth of this holy child. They were the first to see God face to face. The Christmas season does not last long though. Jesus did not come into this world to remain as a child. He had an important mission. This is why the Christmas season ends with the Baptism of the Lord. This event inaugurates Jesus' public ministry.

Jesus' mission was to teach the people about the great love and mercy that God the Father has for His people. As Jesus said, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (Jn 3:16-17)

The first part of Ordinary Time does not last too long as we enter the season of Lent. How are Lent and Easter calculated? Easter is on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. Once Easter is determined, one counts backward from that day to determine when Lent begins. Lent is a time of preparation for the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. During Lent, we join Jesus on His journey to Jerusalem. It is a time of fasting and prayer to enter more fully into His sacrifice.

We celebrate Easter with such joy that it lasts for fifty days! Jesus has conquered sin and death and given us new life! The Easter season also celebrates the beginning of the Church. The spread of the Gospel to all nations. Easter ends with Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit.

After the Easter season concludes, we are back in Ordinary Time. We continue with Jesus' public ministry which will eventually lead us to His predictions of the end of time. Our liturgical year concludes with Jesus as our King. All things will culminate in Him. The Preface for the Mass on this solemnity states: "For you anointed your Only Begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, with the oil of gladness as eternal Priest and King of all creation, so that, by offering himself on the altar of the Cross as a spotless sacrifice to bring us peace, he might accomplish the mysteries of human redemption and, making all created things subject to his rule, he might present to the immensity of your majesty an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace."

This is the kind of King that we have. This is the kind of Kingdom that we should hope to live in forever. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, King of eternal glory!




