Alzheimer's Walk - Joyce's Story and Our Journey

This story is about my best friend and big sister by special design, God knew our paths would cross. Our sisterhood has spanned over 39 years and counting.

Both of our families were brought here by the Boeing Company. She was from the East Coast, and we were from the West, we were introduced at work, and we hit it off. She was the oldest in her family, two brothers and two sisters! I told her I always wanted a big sister, and she told me she would be my big sister and she was good at it, bossy. Joyce and I were known as the Bobbsey twins. Our families went on camping trips and holidays and our bond was sealed.

Al and I started noticing she was forgetting things, then when she ended up in Puyallup and was lost, I was concerned but she said a semi-truck was in front of her and she couldn't see. By 2015 she had stopped driving. We went to lunch a few times and she would ask us to sign her credit card receipts for her because her hand hurt or some other excuse. Her story would always change.

In 2017 she began to call me periodically and ask me to take her to lunch, but she hadn't been able to use the phone for awhile. What I didn't know was that her daughters had programmed names and numbers into the phone so she could make calls. I would set a date and time to pick her up and upon my arrival, she would tell me them same story over and over again in the 10 minute drive to the restaurant. She indicated to me that she thought she was losing her mind. I believe she wanted me to know she wasn't okay. She had also reached a point where she couldn't read, which at that point it finally became clear to me!

In 2017 the family and I got the Neuropsychological report- Alzheimer's Dementia on September 19th. I became the big sister. The songs we sang together she no longer knew the words, and was unable to feed herself. My heart started breaking thinking of all our plans of travel and meeting our grandson's girlfriends so we could tell baby stories and show pictures. I miss her laugh and her voice. Now it's one or two words and her voice has changed. She only answers to Joyce. I used to call her Boo, and she would call me Bev. Sometimes the way she takes my hand, I believe she knows it's me!

One time we went to lunch and it ended with her telling the cashier I was her little sister but now I must become the big sister! She sleeps a lot now, but I still visit her and talk to her as I used to. If I can only make a phone call to her, her caregiver puts me on speaker. A kiss on the forehead when I leave her house. Lucy and Ethel still together! Oh, just in case you want to know I am Ethel!

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News from our Gardener

I talk to many people who seem to have in their mind that a garden should be impeccable, they may have big dreams about a pond, arbor, greenhouse and all else, but these features cost a significant amount of money, time and maintenance. Instead, I advise create a plan that only includes your most basic needs. Make "inpeccable", a garden that has no chickens (some people will not get that pun)! Do, clear weeds, and trim shrubs and perennials, remember we have wildfires. This will allow you to focus on problem areas, such as bare spots and dead or dying plants, or the rotting shed that should come down. Once you assess the scene, make a list of what needs to be changed.

Avoid impulsively buying a random assortment of pretty but unfamiliar plants. Resist splurging on marginally hardy or rare specimens. Instead, stick with the "greatest hits" that you know thrive in your area. Shrubs such as spirea, hydrangea and boxwood do well, as do perennials such as day lilies (so many new colors), phlox and false indigo. Natives are even better. If you have an established garden, stick to the tried-and-true minimalist rule of only buying a new plant when an old one has expired.

If you're building a garden from scratch, create a design with a list of plants and materials, and don't veer from it unless an expert advises you to. You can designate a few spots for impulse buys, but stick to that number once you're at the store. It's important to plant the right plant in the right place, so note your sunny, shady and partly shady areas when crafting your design, then research which species prefer those conditions. Try working in the garden for 20 minutes every day, in that way you can break what might feel like an overwhelming project into manageable tasks. By the weekend, you might actually have time for something else you need to do.

The biggest benefit of a simple garden is that it will allow you more time to actually enjoy it. Read a book outside, play with the pets, cut some flowers, listen to a ballgame, whatever makes you happy. It might sound strange, but I'd recommend scheduling time to simply 'be' in your garden: time to think, to reflect, to meditate and simply enjoy the space. So, sit back, take a deep breath, and remember how special it is that, in our noisy world, you can enjoy a peaceful moment in nature at our own garden. If you do not have a garden of your own, enjoy the flowers at our own Senior Center. The Center's gardens are kept by our own members and there is always room for another hand. We keep the area relevant and simple. It seems our rose garden also keep the local deer well fed. With help, the hydrangea was replaced on the east side and it will be fun to see it grow from that one foot start to a six foot ball of flowers. The Bonney Lake Rock Club decorates with colorful rocks throughout the garden and you can find their activities on Facebook. Please take the time to sit on the outside benches and give yourself a covered respite to enjoy the flowers colors.

I also recommend finding our local gardens or just take in a local nursery to get out of the house. The Master Gardeners are having their yearly plant sale the last weekend of April which can be opportunity to see what the scientist recommends.

Let's close with a quote from a wise cook: "Knowledge is knowing that tomatoes are a fruit; wisdom is knowing to not add tomatoes in your fruit salad!"
