



GOSPEL MEDITATION January 2, 2022 The Epiphany of the Lord

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."



Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.



We mournfully announce the death of former Pastor Father Joe Vigil April 18th,1952 - December 4th, 2021

Below is Father Joe's biography that was published in the bulletin for his 40th Anniversary of Priesthood.

Father Joe Damacio Vigil was born in Albuquerque on April 18th, 1952 to Reuben Vigil and Alviria Pohl. He was raised on a 285 acre ranch in Edgewood, New Mexico with his 3 sisters and 1 brother. He attended Moriarty Public Schools from 1st to 12th grade, graduating in 1970 as Salutatorian of his class.

His early jobs consisted of sweeping school rooms, washing dishes, working at gas stations, and was a summer hire at Sandia Labs. He studied at UNM beginning with electrical engineering. He graduated with his bachelor's degree in Business Administration in 1980.



During his young life he was hired as a management trainee at Albuquerque Federal Saving and Loan. He worked there for 2 years, and coincidently during this time was a 6 year resident of the North Valley, living on Guadalupe Trail just down the road from the church. He was then called to Mt. Angel Seminary in Oregon where he studied 1 year of pretheology and 4 years theology as a Master of Divinity. He was ordained a priest on June 21,1980 by Archbishop Robert Sanchez at the Cathedral in Sante Fe.

Father Joe's first assignment was at St. John the Baptist in Santa Fe as pastoral assistant from 1980-1982. He was then assigned pastor at St. Anthony's Parish in Questa from 1982 – 1986 St. Anthony's Parish in Peñasco from 1986-1992. Holy Ghost in Albuquerque from 1992-2000, and finally

Our Lady of Guadalupe in Albuquerque from 2000-2020.

Father Joe has been on many pilgrimages including Villa de Guadalupe in Mexico City 10 times, Rome where he met St. John Paul II in the Library office! The Holy Land, Medugorje, Fatima, Garabandal, Lourdes, the Divine Mercy Center in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, and the Immaculate Conception Shrine in Washington DC.

He has belonged to many groups including FFA, Old Town Optimists, Search, Cursillo, Knights of Columbus State Chaplain for 3 years, ACTS retreat, team, and retreat Priest for many men's and women's ACTS retreats. His hobbies include archery, hunting, motorcycles, basketball, horseshoes, football and 8 ball league where he's played 26 years.
