REFLECTION FOR THE WEEK

January 30, 2022—4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

St. Oscar Romero (1917-1980) was a “Salvadoran Roman Catholic archbishop who was a vocal critic of the violent activities of government armed forces, right-wing groups, and leftist guerrillas involved in El Salvador’s civil conflict (Encyclopedia Britannica).” As a voice of the voiceless, he was an outspoken champion of the poor who were the ones most affected by the civil unrest and violence. His advocacy provoked several attempts on his life. Nonetheless, St. Oscar Romero was convinced that before all else his faith in the resurrected Christ and the values of the Gospel trumped any earthly concern or worry. He walked with complete confidence and trust. On March 24, 1980, St. Oscar Romero was assassinated while celebrating Mass. Such is often the fate of those who challenge the socio-political agendas of the day.



We may look at the example of witness of St. Oscar Romero as something extraordinary. In one sense it is. Through the power of God, an ordinary human being did extraordinary things. But, in and of himself, St. Oscar Romero was simply a humble, loving servant of God. Oscar knew not only the power of love but the risk that comes when loving unconditionally. The beauty of God’s message was able to shine in and through him because he was able to step out of the way and be a vessel. One can assume that for St. Oscar Romero, one’s earthly life has no merit when faith, integrity, conviction, zeal and love are jettisoned. Fear and apprehension had no grip on this man who not only saw but spoke the truth.

Do we speak the truth? It makes us feel good to speak of God as love. But have we ever considered the ramifications of this radical message? There are assaults on human life occurring daily. More and more the value and worth of a human being is being reduced and minimized. We are becoming widgets in the production of life. In our whole simple humble ways, we too are called to be prophets. Knowing who you are and what is within your means to do, how can you make God’s love real, stand up for what is right, and give witness to the sacredness of all that is around you?

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:
Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

Over the next few months, Catholics from around the world will be participating in the Synod on Synodality, called for by Pope Francis. What is Synod and what is the Synodality? The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialogue that began with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021. The whole process consists of three phases: Diocesan Phase (discussions and discernment at the local level, in parishes and dioceses), Continental Phase (Discussions and discernment at the Regional conference of the Bishops) and Universal Phase (Discussions and discernment at the global level with Pope Francis in Rome). The synodal process will conclude in 2023.

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: “It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium.” This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church’s “renewal” proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission.

What does that mean for us?

Here at All Saints, it means we all first pray together and invite the Holy Spirit to help us to listen deeply to one another, and we will talk together about how best to do that, at different levels.

Here is the timeline for the Archdiocese of Portland’s participation in the worldwide Synod. Below the timeline is an explanation of each phase.

Now until August 15, 2022 — Prayer Phase

January 20, 2022, 1:30–3:00 p.m. — Synod Virtual Orientation Workshop

February and March 2022 — Parish (and other groups) Participation Phase

April and May 2022 — Vicariate (Regional) Participation Phase

June 2022 — Archdiocesan Discernment Phase

July 2022 — Preparation of Report & Submission to U.S. Bishops

August 15, 2022 — Conclusion of Local Participation in the Synod

As a general guideline, it should be noted that this synod is about synodality itself. **Its goal is not to discuss all of the issues in the Church, but rather to discuss how the Church listens to, and can listen better to, all her people and draws the voices of all into her prayer, her mission, and her decision-making process on every level.**

May we all strive to live in active service of Jesus and his mission as we nationally join together during Catholic Schools Week and always.

FSC is on the Move!!

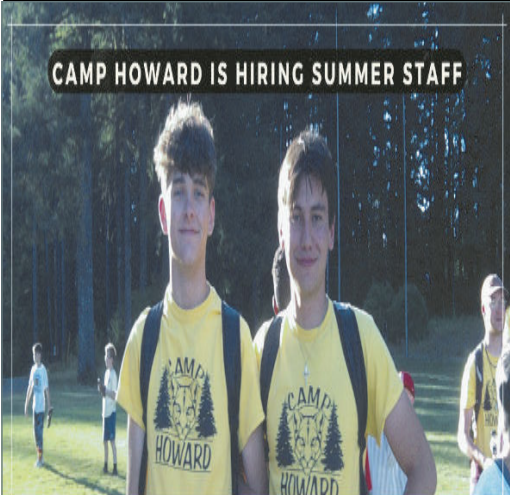

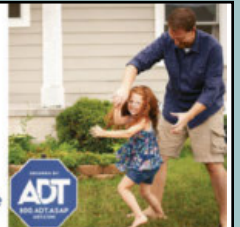
