

Q: Scriptural readings during the Lenten Season include the Books of Leviticus and Numbers wherein we read a holy narrative that is witness to a divinely complex range of Old Testament activity.

There's human apportionment, migration of ancestral tribes, assigned inheritances among an enrollment of clans, and a milieu of designated sacrificial offerings of praise to the Lord. These regular offerings of praise could take the form of drink offerings, grain offerings, free-will offerings, guilt offerings, burnt offerings, sin offerings, elevation offerings, and other sacrificial offerings intended as worshipful praise, "*pleasing to the Lord.*"

What does the *Catechism* say about prayerful praise to God which we may offer today?

A: The *Catechism* teaches, "*Praise is the form of prayer which recognizes most immediately that God is God. It lauds God for his own sake and gives him glory, quite beyond what he does, but simply because He Is.*"

Speaking of offerings, the *Catechism* goes on to describe, "the summit of praise": "*The Eucharist contains and expresses all forms of prayer: it is the pure offering of the whole Body of Christ to the glory of God's name.*"

We also *sing* our heartfelt words as part of that complex of praise to God. A Christopher Walker arrangement of an Ernest Sands composition is called "*Sing Of The Lord's Goodness.*" This song presents its own bit of uncommon structural offerings as it has a 5/4 time signature with five beats per measure; quintuple time with unique patterns of beats that are alternatively strong, weak, and medium in expression:

"*Sing of the Lord's goodness, Father of all goodness, come to him and bless his name...*"

This song's beat may be reflective of those long ago uniquely formative Old Testament days with their many variances and development of structural expressions in their forms and methods of praise.

It's also interesting and relevant to note that the *Common Preface of the Roman Missal* states that, "*by giving praise we are saved.*" As we at St. James praise the Lord throughout the Mass, we can identify with that gift-giving essence of saving grace as we refer to the inscription above the altar reminding us that, "Every good gift, and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights..."

And so we mark the virtues of Lent, and the virtues of praise as we engage with the Sacraments and honor the Lenten hallmarks of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving as the *Catechism* explains. "*Come to him and praise his name...*"

May these be offerings that are, "pleasing to the Lord."

Gospel Meditation

Many struggle with Jesus. Some who consider themselves faithful hail him in their churches but still struggle to figure out what to do with him on our streets. The message is somehow more palatable when it echoes pious renderings and sentiments and involves singing hosannas during worship. It becomes a bit trickier when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct the business of our lives, becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor, and marginalized, and living as servants of our Loving Creator. Ultimately, it is a struggle between wanting to be God ourselves and letting God be God as God is. That's why it's so easy to become hypocritical. We, like those who hailed Christ as he arrived in Jerusalem and sent Christ to the cross to die, also talk out of both sides of our mouths. We entertain what suits us at the time and walk away from the rest.

Many neglect God's beautiful creation because they prefer what humans have made instead. Progress isn't seen in preserving and enhancing what God has made but replacing it with something we believe is better and more useful. The earth, flowers, and animals are all expendable if they stand in the way of the "more" we want to achieve. We seek to remove as many obstacles and hurdles as possible in search of the easiest, quickest, and most efficient path we can find. We have created drugs and laws that preserve our free choice, even though it may mean setting aside God's vision and example. Why suffer when we can easily be put to rest? Why endure insult or injury when we can retaliate, eliminate or subdue? Why accept life when it is acceptable to choose otherwise? We want to be God and resist accepting the fact that our real Creator has already given us the blueprints for the life we need to live in the Beatitudes and in the example of his Passion. We don't like being stewards and managers and really want the power to do as we wish and desire. We want to create our own way.

Where has the true, effective Christian voice been through all of the wars and violence, prejudice and unjust conquests, abuse of human beings and attempted extinctions of nationalities, the establishments of procedures and protocols that serve only a few and not the many and all of the injustices and exploitations that are a part of our human history? A few courageous prophets have stood up and out throughout all of the comings and goings of our human journey with many receiving the same fate as the Crucified One we hail this week. Some still walk among us as shining stars showing us how it really can be. How would Jesus' journey have ended if he lived life as we do? Unless we encounter the good with the bad, the just with the unjust, the grace with the sin, the glory with the cross, the death with the life we most certainly risk rendering God obsolete. After all, haven't we already convinced ourselves that we can do better

The Power of Confession

All priests of God's holy Church have an incredible gift to give each parishioner: forgiveness of the sins if they have at least imperfect contrition for their sins, by the merits of our Lord, through the sacrament of reconciliation.

If imperfect contrition hasn't yet to be obtained, as long as there is some desire to stop the sin, this sacrament still sends fantastic grace to help move soul's to obtain the contrition needed to accept forgiveness and then into perfect contrition for the salvation of their souls. There is nothing more important than saving the souls of God's people. Everything we do is in vain if we can't prevent God's children from dying with unrepentant mortal sin on their soul. Truly loving each person is realized by showing them how to obtain the gift of eternal life. Nothing else can be of greater importance. Even the Holy Eucharist cannot save the soul of a man who has broken his relationship with Christ. The sacrament of reconciliation is the only ordinary means to bring purification to the soul. Outside of growing into perfect contrition, this sacrament restores our souls back into sanctifying grace—even if only for a moment and sends us unspeakable grace to help us achieve and maintain a saving faith for the salvation of our souls. www.sacramentofreconciliation.com/john-paul-reconciliation-program/
