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Apostolic Exhortation

Veneremur Cernui – Down in Adoration Falling (continued...)

60. However, the teachings of the Church have always been clear and based on Scripture. Holy Communion is reserved for those, who with God's grace make a sincere effort to live this union with Christ and His Church by adhering to all that the Catholic Church believes and proclaims to be revealed by God.

61. From the very beginning, the Teaching of the Twelve Apostles, passed down to us in the Didache – one of the oldest writings outside the New Testament – describes this ancient practice in which the priest, just before distributing Holy Communion says: "Whoever is holy, let him approach, whoever is not, let him do penance" (*Didache 10*). The Church has always stressed this perennial doctrine and discipline: before one receives Jesus Christ in Holy Communion one must be in communion of life, restored often by God's mercy in the Sacrament of Penance. Otherwise, instead of receiving all the graces from Holy Communion, we are partaking of our own condemnation. Saint Paul declared, "*Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord.*" In other words, whoever unworthily receives the Eucharist will have to answer for the Lord's death. The Apostle further warned, "*A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself*" (1 Cor 11:27-29).

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Exhortación Apostólica

Veneremur Cernui – Venemos inclinados (continuada...)

60. Sin embargo, las enseñanzas de la Iglesia siempre han sido claras y son basadas en la Escritura Bíblica. La Sagrada Comunión está reservada para aquellos que, con la gracia de Dios, se esfuerzan sinceramente por vivir esta unión con Cristo y Su Iglesia, adhiriéndose a todo lo que la Iglesia Católica cree y proclama que Dios ha revelado.

61. Desde un principio, la enseñanza de los Doce Apóstoles transmitida a nosotros en la Didaché – uno de los más antiguos escritos fuera del Nuevo Testamento – describe esta antigua práctica en la que el sacerdote, justo antes de distribuir la Sagrada Comunión decía: “*El que sea santo, que se acerque, el que no lo sea, que haga penitencia*” (Didaché, 10). La Iglesia siempre ha subrayado esta disciplina y doctrina perenne: antes de recibir a Jesucristo en la Sagrada Comunión, hay que estar en comunión de vida, restaurada a menudo por la misericordia de Dios en el sacramento de la Penitencia. De lo contrario, en lugar de recibir todas las gracias de la Sagrada Comunión, estamos participando de nuestra propia condenación. San Pablo declaró: “*Por eso, el que coma el pan o beba la copa del Señor indignamente tendrá que dar cuenta del Cuerpo y de la Sangre del Señor*”. En otras palabras, quien recibe indignamente la Eucaristía tendrá que responder por la muerte del Señor. El Apóstol advirtió, además: “*Que cada uno se examine a sí mismo antes de comer este pan y beber esta copa; porque si come y bebe sin discernir el Cuerpo del Señor, come y bebe su propia condenación*.” (1 Cor 11,27-29).

REFLECTING

with the Readings

First Reading

Ezra and Nehemiah were the religious and political leaders of Judah in the mid-5th century BC. They grounded their leadership in Scripture ("the book of the law.") What role does sacred Scripture have in guiding your life?

Second Reading

Paul used the human body as an analogy for the "many parts" of the Christian community in Corinth that should unite as the "one body" of Christ. In what ways do you find this a challenging vision for community?

Gospel

Today's reading contains both the opening prologue to the Gospel of Luke and the initial reaction to Jesus' return to his hometown of Nazareth. Luke is the only Evangelist to provide us with a prologue outlining his motivation to write his Gospel. What details do you find most interesting from Luke's prologue?

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INSPIRACIÓN

La gente puede perder fácilmente el sentido de lo sagrado y trascendente. Cuando perdemos el sentido de la presencia especial de Dios, necesitamos ser devueltos. Esdras hizo que la gente volviera a la palabra de Dios y se dieron cuenta de lo que se estaban perdiendo. Jesús proclama la palabra de Dios en la sinagoga con verdadera convicción y les dice a los reunidos que Él es el cumplimiento de todo lo que Isaías enseñó. Aunque las personas se pierden, se distraen, se desaniman y, a menudo, viajan por el camino equivocado, la ley eterna de Dios permanece. Cuando nos permitimos escuchar verdaderamente la palabra de Dios y actuar de acuerdo con ella, esa palabra viva, con el tiempo, nos cambia lentamente. Tiene el poder de ablandarnos y moldearnos, creando dentro de nosotros un espíritu alegre. Nos damos cuenta de la verdad en lo que Dios habla y nos abrimos al amor de Dios. Gradual y suavemente, Dios nos lleva de regreso a donde pertenecemos. Descubrimos nuevamente el carácter sagrado de la vida y la maravilla del poder de Dios. Con razón Lucas dirige sus comentarios a Teófilo. Es un nombre que significa "amado de Dios," un nombre que puede usar cualquier persona que deseé la amistad con Dios.

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PROFUNDIZANDO CON LA PALABRA

Primera Lectura

Esdras y Nehemías fueron los líderes religiosos y políticos de Judá a mediados del siglo quinto A.C. Ellos basaron su liderazgo en las Escrituras ("el libro de la ley"). ¿Qué papel tienen las Sagradas Escrituras en guiar tu vida?

Segunda Lectura

Pablo usó el cuerpo humano como una analogía para las "muchas partes" de la comunidad cristiana en Corinto que deberían unirse como el "cuerpo único" de Cristo. ¿De qué manera te parece una visión desafiante para la comunidad?

Evangelio

La lectura de hoy contiene tanto el prólogo inicial del Evangelio de Lucas como la reacción inicial al regreso de Jesús a su ciudad natal de Nazaret. Lucas es el único evangelista que nos proporciona un prólogo que describe su motivación para escribir su Evangelio. ¿Qué detalles te parecen más interesantes del prólogo de Lucas?

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INSPIRATION

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.






