CLERGY CORNER Father Steve Callahan



Dear Friends,

Probably the biggest spiritual lesson I learned during the pandemic is how much coming together as a community to celebrate the Eucharist means to me. It was very difficult for me when we were not able to do so. I am delighted that restrictions have loosened in recent weeks and we can once again be in the church for the celebration of Mass. I am also delighted that with each passing week, more and more people are coming in person.

Beginning this Sunday and for four Sundays, we depart from hearing from the Gospel of Mark, and our gospel is taken from chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, which focuses on eucharistic themes. It is an opportunity for us as people of faith to reflect on the defining characteristic of our Catholic faith and what the Eucharist means to us as individual disciples and as a faith community.

This Sunday I invite you to reflect on the reason or reasons you come to Mass, your motivation for coming. From time to time I hear people say they don't get much out of the Mass. Perhaps it is our experience as well on occasion. Perhaps we feel we're just going through the motions. Or we're physically present in the church but our mind and heart are somewhere else. When this is our experience it can be helpful to remind ourselves that we will only get out of the Mass what we ourselves put into it.

There is nothing "automatic" or "magic" about the Eucharist. It is not only essential to believe that Christ himself is present in the Eucharist, but we also need to approach the sacrament with the appropriate internal disposition, that is, a conscious and deliberate choice and commitment on our part to want the change or transformation the Lord seeks to accomplish in us. God always offers us the gift of His grace in the Eucharist. That grace, however, can bear fruit only if we are properly disposed. In other words, we have to want to become more like Christ through our reception of the Eucharist if indeed it is going to happen!

GROWING IN FAITH TOGETHER (GIFT) Family Faith Formation

Growing in faith is a lifelong process. While we may think of Faith Formation or Religious Education as only a children's program, the reality is we should all be growing in faith throughout our lives. A couple of years ago we moved to a new format of Faith Formation to incorporate full families and encourage a wider sense of community throughout the parish. We call it GIFT—Growing In Faith Together. This format consists of monthly family sessions

where parents of children in grades 1-8 participate with their children. There are also child-only sessions, led by our catechists, that coincide with the parish-wide Connection to Christ (C2C) groups in the Fall and Lent.

While all of our sessions took place online last year, we look forward to getting back in-person this fall! Things will look a little different from previous years, but we will continue to offer our GIFT sessions as a way for families to learn together, meet in age-specific breakouts, and enjoy fellowship time with other parishioners. The child-only sessions offer a way for children to continue learning more stories from Scripture, discover how our faith is part of our daily lives, and connect with other children their age.

Registration for the upcoming GIFT year will open at the end of August, with our first Family Sessions happening at the end of September. 


THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

HEARING GOD THROUGH THE LIVING WORD

PRAYING WITH SCRIPTURE

Have you ever picked up a Bible and not known exactly what to do with it or where to start? Here is a simple way of praying with Scripture that you can do on your own, with a family member or friend, or in a group setting. It is not intended as a Bible Study. Rather, it is a method of prayer that helps you hear what God has to say to you personally today. Grab your Bible and a journal or notebook and find a comfortable and quiet place. Pick a short passage. You might choose one



of the Sunday Mass readings (for instance, John 6:1-15 is this Sunday's Gospel). Settle in, acknowledge God's presence, and asked God to guide your prayer time. Slowly read the passage three times, asking yourself these questions:

- **Word or Phrase**—During the first reading, what word or phrase caught your attention? You may be tempted to pick several, or to start analyzing the meaning of the passage. In this exercise, you are simply listening for the word or phrase that connects with your heart now, that God has for you today.
- **Feelings**—During the second reading, what emotions or internal responses did you notice? Do not analyze, or judge, but rather just observe what you are feeling.
- **Invitation or Affirmation**—During the third reading, what is stirring in your heart? Are you sensing an invitation from God to either an interior or exterior action? Does it seem that God is giving you a personal message of affirmation or guidance? Are you experiencing God in a certain way?

Take some time to ponder your responses and record them in a journal. Ask God to help you “unpack” the experience and tell God what is stirring in your heart. It's that simple! If you try making a practice of praying in this manner, over time you will find that these three simple questions can draw you into a deeper experience of God.



THE MASS We gather together to pray and celebrate Jesus' sacrifice and love for us. We invite you to join us in prayer. These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Please sit as we listen to a reflection from the clergy.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(*please bow during this profession*) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

COMMUNION RITE

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.


