MARY ASSUMED INTO HEAVEN

The Catholic Church teaches as dogma that the Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Our scriptures have no specific mention of the Assumption. It is almost impossible to understand this dogma without viewing it within the context of the other Marian dogmas. There is coherence in the teachings of the Church. They are not a hodgepodge of teachings.

Regarding the Assumption of Mary, it is important to view it first in light of the Immaculate Conception; in which Mary is preserved from original sin and was filled with grace. She was preserved therefore from decay and corruption of the body after death, one of the gravest effects of sin. And at the annunciation, our Lord assumed Mary's humanity to Himself, to become incarnate of her. She became the Mother of God because He assumed her humanity in the formation of His human nature. The assumption therefore is the logical consequence of this mystical transaction.

The Assumption of Our Lady calls our attention to the importance of Mary's body. She was forever changed body and soul by becoming mother of God. For nine months her body nourished, formed, and gave life to the Lord. It makes sense that this symbiotic relationship would prompt Jesus to keep His mother's body from decay and corruption. Mary's Assumption points us to the truth that our bodies are made for God especially now when we realize that we are not at peace with our bodies—we dislike them, worship them, treat them as playthings, and we view them as something we own.

All the Marian dogmas reveal something of what God desires for each of us. In the Immaculate Conception, God desires that we are without sin and that in her divine motherhood, we all come to conceive and bear Jesus spiritually; her perpetual virginity, that we hold the faith pure and undefiled. With her Assumption, God desires that we be raised whole and entire (body and soul) to the glory of heaven.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Feast of the Assumption celebrates the doctrine that Mary was taken body and soul (both physically and spiritually) into Heaven, because of her Immaculate Conception. The name of this feast comes from the Latin verb “assumere”, meaning “to take to oneself” which is what Jesus did when He took Mary home to Himself in Heaven.

The Solemnity of the Assumption reminds us of the unique role that Mary served in the process of our salvation. Although she was without sin, we have the possibility of receiving God’s forgiveness for our sins through Christ. Her entry into Heaven prefigures our own hope of experiencing the same eternal life. The celebration of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a holy day of obligation for Catholics. We honor this Marian feast on August 15.

3 WAYS TO HONOR OUR BLESSED MOTHER

Pray the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary. This year The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary is celebrated on a Sunday. The 4th Glorious Mystery is the Assumption of Mary. How special is that?



Practice an Act of Charity for Love of Mary. Do a special act of charity for an elderly relative or someone in need. Try sending a box of food or a Mass card to someone going through hard times. Ask Our Lady to pray for them and let them know you are with them in prayer.



Play Music for Mary. Whether it’s a Marian Gregorian chant or the Ave Maria, fill your home with the beautiful sounds of homage to our Heavenly Mother. If you can play an instrument, you might try your hand at playing anything from “On This Day” to “Gentle Woman.”



THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

UNWRAPPING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Do you know what your spiritual gifts are? Spiritual gifts, or charisms, are special abilities given to us by the Holy Spirit that enable us to be powerful channels of God's love and presence in the world. Over the next several weeks, we are exploring 23 charisms. Stay tuned for more information about our "Called & Gifted" 5-week small group series coming this October.



ADMINISTRATION

- **Function:** empowers one to be an effective channel of God's wisdom through planning and delegation, and by coordinating the resources and efforts of a group to accomplish a Kingdom purpose
- **What it looks like:** Administrators are adept at cutting through chaos and making logistical plans happen. They specialize in problem solving, are good at delegating portions of the overall task, and at coordinating the work of a number of people toward a single goal.

CELIBACY

- **Function:** empowers one to be most fulfilled and spiritually fruitful by remaining unmarried and celibate for the sake of Christ
- **What it looks like:** Not to be confused with chastity or the vow of celibacy in religious life, some Christians are given a charism of celibacy which they live joyfully even though they may never take a vow of celibacy. The charism is given so a person may be "freed up" for something else (which can be discerned based on other charisms) in a way they wouldn't be if they had the demands of family life.

CRAFTSMANSHIP

- **Function:** empowers one to be an effective channel of God's goodness to others through sacred or secular artistic creativity that beautifies and orders the physical world
- **What it looks like:** It is a Spirit-empowered creativity that includes the arts of living (cooking, sewing, construction, etc.) and recreation (painting, sculpture, etc.). Creating feels like praying and draws one closer to God.



These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries
I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(please bow during this profession) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.
