OUR EYES WERE OPENED

A group of parishioners recently completed an intensive 8-week series on Faith & Racial Equity created by JustFaith Ministries. We studied three books together, watched numerous videos, prayed together, challenged our assumptions and perceptions, and wrestled with the discomforts that arise when race is discussed openly and honestly. Our group was mostly middle-aged and older White people, a broad demographic for whom discussion of race does not always come easily. We came with different life experiences, different attitudes and points of view, different politics, and different understandings of the nature of race and racism in America. It was hard work, necessary work, transforming work.

We studied the origins of race in this land, the economics of race-based policies, the enactment of criminal laws to achieve racial impacts, the portrayal of race in the media, and the consequences of race in education. We listened to Black scholars, educators, poets, authors, and musicians. And we read and prayed with the recorded journals of enslaved men, women, and children—people with names, families, hopes, and dreams.

One highlight toward the end of the series was a visit to Christ the King Parish for Mass and conversation. Christ the King is historically African American, founded at a time when Blacks were generally not welcome in other Catholic parishes, even in San Diego. The Gospel Mass there was bursting with joy, full voice singing, and hands clapping. Praise and hope were not theological ideas there, but fully embodied and lived experiences. They welcomed us with open arms and open hearts into conversation, and they were extraordinarily generous in their sharing, their storytelling, their honesty, and their willingness to create new relationships with us. Seemingly before we had even begun to talk, they were planning our return visit.

This work of racial awakening, discovery, reconciliation, and healing is not accomplished in an 8-week series. But our eyes have been opened and pathways to change lie before us. Hope rises to heaven with the choir's voice, and we are taking steps, however small, to bring about the Kingdom of Peace.

SEASONS OF HOPE

A Support Group for the Bereaved

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Matthew 5:4

Our Ministry of Consolation offers a quarterly bereavement group, *Seasons of Hope*. This 6-week Christ-centered support group is for those who have lost a loved one. Support group members gather with facilitators—experienced with grief ministry—who are also Saint Brigid Parishioners.

At these sessions, the group reflects on their experience of loss through the lens of Scripture and prayer, inviting Jesus into their grief for healing and comfort. Each session ends with fellowship in the kitchen, deepening the bonds of the group.

Seasons of Hope series are offered four times per year, each having a different theme to focus on for that season. Most participants stay with the group for more than one season, finding it beneficial to be among others who have experienced a loss. Each of the four seasons offers new content.

THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

GETTING MORE OUT OF THE EUCHARIST—PART ONE

JESUS THIRSTS FOR US!

“Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.”

John 15:4

Jesus urges us to remain in Him and assures us that He remains in us. We might think that Jesus gave us these instructions for our own good, but did you ever consider that there may be more to it? What if Jesus wants you to be in a personal and abiding relationship with you because, not only does He love you, He thirsts for you!



Four years before her death, Saint (Mother) Teresa of Calcutta disclosed, in a letter to her Missionaries of Charities, an encounter she had with Jesus many years prior. In that encounter, Jesus revealed the depth of His words from the cross, “I thirst.”

Mother Teresa said, “Jesus wants me to tell you again...how much love He has for each one of you—beyond all you can imagine. I worry some of you still have not really met Jesus—one to one—you and Jesus alone. Do you really know the living Jesus—not from books but from being with Him in your heart?...Ask for the grace, He is longing to give it...Only believe—you are precious to Him. Bring all your suffering to His feet—only open your heart to be loved by Him as you are. He will do the rest.”

For Reflection:

Prayerfully read Mother Teresa’s words as if they were meant especially for you—because they are!

- How easy or difficult is it for you to receive this news? Journal your thoughts and try having a heart-to-heart with Jesus about it.
- What difference might knowing how Jesus thirsts for you make in your anticipation of receiving the Eucharist at Mass on Sundays?



These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(*please bow during this profession*) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.
