CLERGY CORNER Father Steve Callahan



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Years ago the Dominican priest, Timothy Radcliffe, wrote a book called *Why Go To Church: The Drama of the Eucharist*. It is a wonderful reflection on the central mystery of our Catholic faith.

Father Radcliffe proposes that “the ‘huge event’ of the Eucharist works in our lives in ways that are profound but often barely noticeable and hardly register as experiences at all.” He sees the Eucharist as a drama that unfolds in three acts which enacts the fundamental drama of all human existence. The first act is focused on **faith** as we listen to the word of God and then proclaim the Creed and ask for what we need. The second act, from the preparation of the gifts through the end of the Eucharistic prayer, is an expression of our **hope** that the One who suffered and died for our sins gives us life in the midst of our experiences of failure and struggle and trial. In the final act, from the Our Father onwards, we celebrate our deepening **love** for the Lord and are sent on our way to be signs of God’s love to others.

I invite you to reflect on your own motivation for going to Mass each Sunday and how you might inspire others whom you know to consider a more frequent and active participation in the Eucharist. A simple way to do this is to give witness by sharing what your experience of Sunday Mass means to you in your journey of faith as a follower of Jesus.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

This Weekend

In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. The Mission Sunday collection is always taken on the next to last Sunday during the month of October.

This day is celebrated in all the local Churches as the feast of catholicity and universal solidarity so Christians the world over will recognize their common responsibility with regard to the evangelization of the world. Every World Mission Sunday is a reminder to us of our mandate to be a missionary. As Pope Francis in his message for World Mission Sunday 2021 says, "the history of evangelization began with the Lord's own passionate desire to call and enter into friendly dialogue with everyone, just as they are." We entreat everyone to participate in the World Mission Sunday and to be at your generous best to contribute. Through your prayers and financial support through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith you can help vulnerable communities throughout Asia, Africa, Latin America, and the Pacific Islands.


THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

GETTING MORE OUT OF THE EUCHARIST—PART THREE

GOD'S FAITHFUL, COVENANT LOVE

"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, 'Take and eat; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, 'Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins.'" Matthew 36:26-28

The Last Supper has its roots going back to the time of Moses. At the Last Supper, Jesus and His disciples were gathered to celebrate Passover—the commemoration of the Israelites escape from slavery in Egypt. At the first Passover, God provided a way to protect His people from death. They were to select and slaughter a lamb, eat its flesh, and cover the doorpost of their home with the lamb's blood (Exodus 12). The households that followed God's command were "passed over" when the angel of death came to kill the firstborn male children (the tenth plague).



For Reflection:

- How have you seen God's faithfulness play out in your life? How does this give you trust in challenging times?
- How does knowing that Jesus paid the ultimate sacrifice for you affect the way you receive Him in the Eucharist?

As Jesus and His disciples gathered to celebrate Passover, they sang psalms, ate lamb along with unleavened bread and bitter herbs, and remembered God's faithfulness to their ancestors. Now, at the Last Supper, Jesus was ushering in a New Covenant—a covenant of mercy and love and joy in the Holy Spirit. This covenant with God would be sealed not with the blood of an animal, but with the blood of God's beloved Son, Jesus. "The Passover celebration that began in the upper room with the Last Supper will end on the cross of Calvary—our doorway to heaven in the next life, and to hope and freedom in this life."*

Did you know we participate in this very same meal in the Eucharistic sacrifice at every Mass? We gather, give thanks and praise, and we remember God's faithfulness and the depth of the love God has for each and every one of us. Fortified by that gathering, we are sent to be signs of God's mercy, love, and joy with others.

These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Please sit as we listen to a reflection from the clergy.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(*please bow during this profession*) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

THE GREAT AMEN

Amen.

COMMUNION RITE

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Go in peace. **Thanks be to God.**
