

The Fruitfulness of Faith

We've all heard the parable where Jesus threatens to cut down the fig tree that isn't bearing fruit in Luke 13:6-9. The parable Jesus told isn't really about a fig tree. It's a story about the Jewish people, God's chosen people, and it's a story about us—we who call ourselves followers of Jesus Christ. All who call themselves Christians are called to bear fruit. In John's Gospel, Jesus says very clearly, "My Father's glory is shown by your bearing much fruit, and in this way, you become my disciples" (John 15:8). Like that fig tree, our job is to bear fruit for the Master, for God.

Are we bearing fruit for God? This thing we call religion isn't a private thing; it's a call to action. It's a call to share the Kingdom of God with those around us. God's Kingdom is all about fruitfulness. Bearing fruit requires action. Action that results from developing a close relationship with God and knowing what He desires. It comes from an intimate, sensitive connection to Jesus. Jesus once said, "If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me, you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

Apart from a relationship with Jesus Christ, it's impossible to bear fruit. How is your relationship with Jesus? Fruitfulness is Christlikeness. The definition of Christlikeness is a person who has qualities like Jesus Christ. Examples of Christlikeness are being kind, forgiving, sincere, and caring and being a person who produces healing. When we become more like Jesus, when He increases in our lives, we can deliver the fruit that honors God. Jesus is the nourishment we need to produce fruit.

Being Christlike means giving a human face to the gifts we receive through the sacraments. The gifts we speak of here are the "fruit of the Spirit": love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. When we see these traits in our lives, we will begin to see the fruit. The fruit God wants us to share is our faith, a faith that brings people to Him, including new believers and fallen-away believers. That's the fruit Jesus wants. He is encouraging us all to till the soil of our faith and develop a Christ-like attitude full of love, joy, kindness, which we develop through studying the Bible and daily prayer time, as well as being charitable, giving to those who need it. That's how we till the soil; that's how we bear fruit.



THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

GETTING MORE OUT OF THE EUCHARIST—PART FOUR

JESUS IS WALKING WITH YOU

“A they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going farther. But they urged him, “Stay with us for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over.” So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight.” Luke 24:28-31



In Luke’s Gospel, one of the stories recounting an appearance of the risen Christ is “The Road to Emmaus.” As two disciples walked along the road, they lamented the events of the previous few days. They had so hoped that this Jesus of Nazareth was the promised Messiah, but he had been crucified and now their hopes were dashed and their hearts were broken. As they continued walking, Jesus drew near but they did not recognize Him. They shared their grief and confusion with Him, and then He proceeded to explain the Scripture stories that prophesied His death and resurrection. They began

to understand, but it was not until they were at table with Him—in the breaking of the bread—that they truly recognized that it was Jesus who had been walking with them on the way.

For Reflection:

- In what ways do you recognize Jesus walking with you?
- What does it mean to you that Jesus pours His life into you when you receive Him in the Eucharist?

Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we don’t always recognize that Jesus Himself is present with us. He is always present with us. In our moments of sorrow or trial, He draws near and walks alongside us. “He meets us where we are and guides us to where He desires us to be. He is constantly reaching out to us, if we only have the eyes of faith to see it.”*

In a most special way, Jesus is present in the Eucharist. Like the disciples, with the eyes of faith, we can recognize Him in “the breaking of the bread.” As we receive Him in the Eucharist, He pours His life into us. He is not only with us, He is within us.



The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(*please bow during this profession*) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

Please stand as we pray together.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.
