



## CLERGY CORNER Deacon Chris Hulburt

### TO ACT WITH LOVE

"If we cannot act with love, then we should not act at all. But if we are not moved to act, then we do not truly possess love." These words from a recent statement by the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus name the mission of a faithful Catholic, an authentic disciple of Jesus Christ. Our faith is a call to action. Our Eucharist is both a call to the table and a sending to the world. "As the Father sent me, so I send you," Jesus declares (John 20:21), just as James teaches, "faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead" (James 2:17).

To talk of love as a solution to practical problems in our lives and our world may seem naïve or unreasonably idealistic. But to act with love and bring our faith to action is what the world needs from us as members of the Body of Christ. Love is the only power great enough to overcome the forces of division and separation that now appear so dominant. "Love is of God ... for God is love" (1 John 4:7-8).

To act with love as a disciple of Jesus Christ is a radical choice that seeks to bring the creative power of God, not the narrow interests of the self, to very practical situations. It is a choice to view life through a particular lens—not one's political party or nationality, not one's race, sex, or gender, not one's social status or wealth, not one's personal self-interest, but through the lens of the love of God for all people and all creation—so that we might be instruments of peace.

Let us love one another as Christ loves us. (John 15:12).

# CELEBRATING BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

## SPOTLIGHT: MOTHER MARY LANGE



November is Black Catholic History Month. In commemoration, we will pray for the canonization of one of the six African-American candidates for sainthood each week. We also invite parishioners to attend one of the Black Catholic History homilies proclaimed at Christ the King Parish during the Sunday 8:30AM Masses this month.

This week, we pray for the canonization of Servant of God Mother Mary Lange. Born Elizabeth Lange, she took the name Mary when she founded the Oblate Sisters of Providence, the first religious congregation of African-American women. Along with three other women, she professed her vows on July 2, 1829. They soon set to work educating and evangelizing their fellow African-Americans.

During her long ministry, Mother Lange sheltered orphans and widows, nursed the terminally ill during the cholera epidemic of 1832, and served as a domestic at St. Mary's Seminary. Persevering through poverty and injustice, her faith in Christ sustained her until her death in 1882.

Today the Oblate Sisters of Providence now number 125 sisters, 20 associates, and 16 Guild Members. Their motto is "Providence will Provide." For her tireless work and dedication, Elizabeth has been put on the path to official sainthood in the Catholic church. If canonized, she could become the first African-American woman saint.

# THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

## STEWARDSHIP—LIVING IN GRATITUDE AND GENEROSITY

“As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied grace.” 1Peter 4:10

This month of Thanksgiving is a perfect time to reflect on the gifts we have been given and take inventory of how we are using them.

It has been said that stewardship is everything that happens after we say, “we believe.” It is discipleship in action. As we grow in relationship with Jesus, we come to understand that everything is gift, everything is from God, and everything belongs to God. We learn to live in a posture of “open hands,” ready to receive and willing to let go. We begin to desire what God desires and we find we live in a more grateful and generous way.

Living as disciples who are grateful for all God's gifts, we strive to be good stewards by sharing our time, talent, and treasure to help carry out the mission Jesus entrusted to us. Through the witness of our lives, we help others encounter, know, love, and serve Jesus.



### For Reflection:

- Make a list of the gifts you have been given and thank God for them.
- Do you find it easier to share your time, talent, or material resources?
- What gifts do you think God might be calling you to share in a more generous way?

But how do we know how God is calling us to share those gifts? Most importantly, we make spending time in prayer a priority. As we deepen our relationship with God through the habit of daily prayer, we become more adept at understanding God's will in our lives. Discovering our gifts and talents helps us identify how God is calling each of us to a unique purpose. In addition to prioritizing time for prayer and sharing our talents, we share our treasure, our financial resources, to help bring God’s love and provision to the world.

For the next three weeks, we will explore each of these three areas of stewardship— time, talent, and treasure—in more depth. We hope you will follow along, spend time on the reflection questions, and discover that God just might be calling you to something new!



As the calendar year draws to a close and 2022 fast approaches, we invite you to reflect on how God is calling you to live out your discipleship in the coming year. How have you been blessed? What unique gifts, talents, passions, and financial resources has the Lord given you and how can they be used to carry out the mission that Jesus has entrusted to us? Here are "Four P's" to consider:

- **Prayerful**—All that I have (time, talents, job, income) is a gift from God and not something I earned myself. Do I express my gratitude by generously sharing the first-fruits of those gifts? Do I ask God how I should use my time, talents, and financial resources?
- **Planned**—Do I thoughtfully plan how much time and money I am going to contribute to the mission of my parish?
- **Proportionate**—Do I give according to my means? Is the amount that I give truly sacrificial or am I giving from my surplus?
- **Progressive**—What percent of my time and income am I giving now? Can I take a step to increase it? Is God asking me to grow in trust and generosity in this area of my life?



**THE MASS** We gather together to pray and celebrate Jesus' sacrifice and love for us. We invite you to join us in prayer. These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

### INTRODUCTORY RITE

*Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn.*

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

### PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

*Repeat after the priest:*

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

### GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

### HOMILY

*Please sit as we listen to a reflection from the clergy.*

### PROFESSION OF FAITH

*Please stand as we proclaim the creed together.*

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, \*and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. \*(*please bow during this profession*) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

*Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.*

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

## THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

### THE OFFERTORY

*As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.*

### PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink.

Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

*Please stand and reply:*

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

### EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right and just.

### HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

*Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.*

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again.

OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

*Please stand as we pray together.*

### THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

### THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

**And with your spirit.**

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

*At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.*

### LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

*Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.*

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

### COMMUNION

*Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.*


