

DID YOU KNOW?

How we know the details of the Christmas story

Did you know that the Nativity story about the birth of Jesus is only found in two of the Gospels—Matthew and Luke? Their accounts have similarities and differences, because they were written for different audiences and at different times. Matthew's Gospel was written in the late 70s-early 80s AD to share the Good News of Jesus with the Jewish population. Luke's Gospel was written in the mid-80s AD, to bring the Good News of Jesus to the Gentiles (anyone outside of Jewish culture). While every aspect of the life of Jesus was important to Mark and John, the Christmas story might not have fallen under the theme or purpose for their Gospels. Mark's Gospel was thought to be written in haste during a time of Christian persecution, and John's gospel focused more on the divinity of Christ and less on His humanness. We hope you will look at the Nativity scene even more fondly now that you know the origins of the different aspects of the Christmas story!





12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS?

When and how long is the Christmas season really? It does not actually begin until Christmas Day and continues until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (which falls on January 9 this year). The 12 Days of Christmas mark the days from Christmas Day until the Feast of the Epiphany—January 6, when we celebrate the Wise Men visiting Jesus and His parents in Bethlehem.

Legend has it that the song "The 12 Days of Christmas" was written to help young Catholics remember significant elements of our Faith. Next time you hear or sing this song, remember the beauty and joy of our faith, and thank God for allowing us to learn it in lighthearted ways!

The "true love" that gives each day's gift in the song is God Himself, sharing His abundant love with us throughout the Christmas season.

THE MASS We gather together to pray and celebrate Jesus' sacrifice and love for us. We invite you to join us in prayer. These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The grace of our Lord...be with you all. And with your spirit.

PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Please sit as we listen to a reflection from the clergy.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together. I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, *and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. *(please bow during this profession) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

UNIVERSAL PRAYER

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

Cover Photo: We recreate the Nativity scene in our homes and at church to commemorate the birth of the Savior of the world. The Three Wise Men are added on the Feast of the Epiphany. Although traditionally celebrated on January 6 (12 days after Christmas), Catholics in the United States have celebrated Epiphany on the first Sunday after January 1 since 1970.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life. Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink. Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again. OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

Please stand as we pray together.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever. Amen.

THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb. Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.

CONCLUDING BLESSING

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen. Go in peace. Thanks be to God.

SACRAMENTS—A PASSAGE TO THE SACRED

DID YOU KNOW THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS MARK IMPORTANT MOMENTS OF THE CATHOLIC CHRISTIAN LIFE?



BAPTISM—Jesus was baptized and taught his Apostles to do likewise. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as children of God. We become members of the Body of Christ and share in the mission of the Church.

RECONCILIATION—Also known as Confession, this is a celebration of God's merciful love. We are all in need of healing. Confession is not about punishment, but about making things right again.

EUCHARIST—Often referred to as Communion, it is the source and summit of the Christian life. When we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ we grow deeper in communion with God and in fellowship with one another.

CONFIRMATION—In Confirmation, we receive a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit and deepening of baptismal graces needed to grow as mature disciples of Jesus.

MARRIAGE—God's love becomes present to the spouses in their total union and flows through them to their family and community.

HOLY ORDERS—Since the time of the Apostles, Christ has personally called forth men to dedicate their lives ministering in the service of the Church as priests or deacons.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK—The hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.
