## **CLERGY CORNER** Deacon Patrick McCay

TAKE THAT STEP IN 2022

"Take the first step in faith. You don't have to see the whole staircase, just take the first step." —Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

As a nation on Monday we honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In his short life, Dr. King challenged us to make real the promise of America as a land of freedom, equality, opportunity, and brotherhood. This quote really spoke to me as we start a new year after living nearly two years in a pandemic. Two years marked with fear, anxiety, isolation,

lockdowns, burnout, stress, disunity, and grief for the unexpected loss of loved ones. As we deal with a highly infectious surge of a new COVID variant, many of us are feeling uncertain of what the future holds. We wonder "where is life taking us now?"

Martin Luther King's message to "just take the first step" explains that people should have faith present in their daily lives, and continue their journey even if they don't see the whole picture yet. With a strong faith that Jesus walks with us, we can move onward step by step. We can trust that the next step in the staircase will become visible as we continue to progress forward. We should embrace our journey into the unknown, and never give up.

In the book "Life is Messy", bestselling Catholic author Matthew Kelly says "The messiness of life can be paralyzing." When change seems too daunting, Mathew Kelly encourages us to "imagine the smallest adjustment you could make to your life. Something tiny. Liken it to turning and facing in the right direction at the beginning of a thousand miles. That's right, not even the first step, just turning and facing in the right direction. If that is all you can manage right now it's enough."

As we start a new year, let us turn in the right direction, and take that first tiny step in faith. With each successive step may we grow in confidence, hope and courage. May we become more like Jesus each step of the way.



## THE WAY OF A DISCIPLE

YOU HAVE A SPECIFIC ROLE IN THE GARDEN!

"If every flower wanted to be a rose, spring would lose its loveliness."

—St. Therese of Lisieux

Who is God asking you to be today? Your quick answer might be something like, "a good person," but this answer, while not wrong, does not address the unique purpose God has for you. This week's readings give us a glimpse of our general calling and the diversity of our unique paths in answering that call.

There are many players in this Sunday's gospel, the Wedding at Cana: bride, groom, guests, and servants. Each person has a particular role to play. Though it is



to the servants that Mary gives the instructions, "Do whatever he tells you," her words could apply to all—those present at the wedding and us today. How do we know what Jesus is telling us to do? Clues can be found in Scripture, through the teachings of the Church, trusted spiritual companions, and in our personal prayer time. Our gifts, talents, experiences, and desires are also a clue to hearing God's call.

#### FOR REFLECTION:

- How do I listen for instruction from God? How do I respond?
- What are some clues to the spiritual gifts God has given me?

Sunday's second reading states, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord." While we are all called to service, we will each be gifted in a unique way. In our Called & Gifted\* gifts discernment workshop participants learn about the charisms, or spiritual gifts, that the Holy Spirit has given them. Some of those charisms are: Administration, Encouragement, Leadership, Mercy, Hospitality, Craftsmanship, Evangelism, Intercessory Prayer, Music, and Writing. "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." Of the twenty-four charisms covered in the workshop, most people discover they have two to five that they regularly use to play their part in bringing God's love and provision to the world. How is God asking you to bloom where you are planted?



THE MASS We gather together to pray and celebrate Jesus' sacrifice and love for us. We invite you to join us in prayer. These pages will take you through the Mass, whether you are new to our community, our Faith, or want to participate more fully. The italicized sections explain posture, plain text is the priest's or leader's part, and bold text denotes our response as the gathered Body of Christ.

#### THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

During this part of the Mass, we hear God's Word proclaimed. We listen to preaching, which makes Scripture come alive again today, and we express our Catholic faith.

#### INTRODUCTORY RITE

Please stand for the entrance and opening hymn. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The grace of our Lord...be with you all.

And with your spirit.

#### PENITENTIAL RITE

Brothers and sisters...celebrate the sacred mysteries I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask the blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Repeat after the priest:

Lord Have Mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord Have Mercy.

OR Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison.

#### **GLORIA**

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise You, we bless You, we adore You, we glorify You, we give You thanks for Your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; You take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; You are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

#### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**

Please stand as we proclaim the creed together. I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, \*and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. \*(please bow during this profession) For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Please stand as we pray for our community, united with the entire Body of Christ.

After each intention, repeat the response said by the reader.

#### THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

In this part of the Mass, we re-experience Jesus' sacrifice. We acknowledge that He is present in the consecrated Bread and Wine—Communion. We pray together and take what we have received in Mass home and into the world.

#### THE OFFERTORY

As we bring up the bread and wine, we also offer our prayers, gifts, and even ourselves to be placed before God and be transformed.

#### PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Blessed are You, Lord... the bread of life.

Blessed be God forever.

Blessed are You, Lord... become our spiritual drink. Blessed be God forever.

Pray...to God, the almighty Father.

Please stand and reply:

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church.

#### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER**

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right and just.

#### HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Holy, Holy, Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel in reverence for Christ coming in His Eucharist.

...The mystery of faith.

We proclaim Your Death, O Lord, and profess Your Resurrection until You come again.

OR When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim Your Death, O Lord, until You come again. OR Save us, Savior of the world, for by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free.

Please stand as we pray together.

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Deliver us, Lord ... Jesus Christ.

For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours now and forever.

#### THE SIGN OF PEACE

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And with your spirit.

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

At this time we usually exchange a sign of sharing God's peace by offering a handshake, hug, or similar gesture with those around us. However during these days of COVID protocols, please offer a wave or a nod of the head or other socially-distant expression of peace.

#### LAMB OF GOD

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. 2x

Lamb of God, You take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Please kneel as we prepare to receive the Body of Christ.

Behold the Lamb of God...the supper of the Lamb. Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

#### COMMUNION

Christ's Body and Blood are truly, fully present as He offers Himself to us in Communion. Catholics prepared to receive the Eucharist approach the minister as the ushers guide you. Non-Catholics or those choosing to abstain from Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing (please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest) or may remain in the pews to pray.

#### CONCLUDING BLESSING

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit. May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen. Go in peace. Thanks be to God.



In-Person Centering Prayer

John Paul II Room

Are you seeking a way to be healed, to find peace? Centering Prayer, also called the prayer of quiet, or resting in God, is designed to reduce the obstacles to an intimate personal relationship with God, and to promote personal healing and spiritual growth.
