REOPENING: RENEWED COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

REOPENING: EFFECTIVE JULY 1ST, 2021

- All indoor liturgical celebrations and faith gatherings are now allowed to take place without capacity limitations, social distancing or sign-up systems.
- Masks may be worn but are not required.
- Sacramental preparation programs, faith formation, prayer groups, & bible studies will be allowed for in-person gatherings in coordination with their Staff Rep.
- The Precious Blood of Christ will not be offered to the faithful.
- The Sign of Peace will not be exchanged through physical contact.
- Holy water returns to fountains.
- Cleaning after Masses and gatherings is no longer required.
- Front doors will be unlocked and/or opened for liturgical celebrations.
- Livestreaming of Masses will continue until further notice.


St. Matthew is looking for **two** parishioners to serve our parish family as members of the Administrative Council for a three-year period. The estimated time commitment is about five hours per month.

THE CHURCH DRAWS HER LIFE FROM THE EUCHARIST

My dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord Jesus,

The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. With these words, Pope St. John Paul II began his last encyclical letter to the Church on the mystery of the most Holy Eucharist (*Ecclesis de Eucharistia*). Through this encyclical, the saintly Pope wished to rekindle in the Church a new Eucharistic amazement. Once we have realized the tremendous gift of the Eucharist that Jesus left to His Church, we should experience a sense of profound amazement and gratitude. In the Eucharist, Jesus has given us the gift of Himself, His true Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity under the mere appearance of bread and wine.

This encyclical letter was the inspiration for my own episcopal motto, *Vultum Christi contemplari*. "To contemplate the face of Christ, and to contemplate it with Mary, is the 'programme' which I have set before the Church at the dawn of the third millennium, summoning her to put out into the deep on the sea of history with the enthusiasm of the new evangelization. To contemplate Christ involves being able to recognize him wherever he manifests himself, in his many forms of presence, but above all in the living sacrament of his body and his blood. The Church draws her life from Christ in the Eucharist; by him she is fed and by him she is enlightened. The Eucharist is both a mystery of faith and a 'mystery of light.' Whenever the Church celebrates the Eucharist, the faithful can in some way relive the experience of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus: "their eyes were opened and they recognized him." (*Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 6)

"The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is 'the source and summit of the Christian life. For the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our pass-over and living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to men.' Consequently, the gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love." (*Ibid.*, 1)

This is the heart of the matter. We discover the full manifestation of Christ's boundless love within the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood. It is about the love of God for us.

With the new status of the COVID pandemic, resulting in far fewer infections, hospitalizations, and deaths, and with so many having chosen to receive the vaccine, the time has come for the most significant change in a long time regarding our divine worship.

Therefore, I am rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to participate at Holy Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation, which I granted on April 6, 2020. This becomes effective July 16, 2021. This means that the faithful are once again obligated to participate in the Holy Mass on Sundays and on holydays of obligation. I want to emphasize that a serious reason will excuse one from this obligation by virtue of the Church's law itself and as taught in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 2181). If you have any questions or concerns about what constitutes a serious reason in your particular situation, please speak to your pastor. The Archdiocese is also issuing new guidelines for the celebration of Holy Mass and other aspects of parish life.

Recalling how I started this pastoral message, this is not really about obligations and dispensations, is it? It's about the love of our God which He has poured out for us in His most beloved Son, Jesus Christ and which is manifested in the Holy Eucharist. Jesus makes Himself present for us in the Eucharistic Sacrifice of His own Body and Blood, and then invites us to the feast, which is a foretaste of the eternal life to which we are called and for which we have been created. I find it odd to speak about an obligation to receive this incredible gift of love from God and participate in this sacred mystery.

I often think of it this way: If Jesus had invited me to be at the Last Supper, would I have told Him I had something else on my calendar that day? If He had invited me to stand by His mother, Holy Mary, at the foot of the cross, would I have said I had to be somewhere else that day? If He had invited me to be at His tomb when the stone was rolled away as He rose from the dead, would I have replied that I was too busy? Of course not! Yet this is precisely what we celebrate and make present during every Mass. We sacramentally participate in the Paschal Mystery, i.e. the passion, death and resurrection of our Savior.

My dear Brothers and Sisters, it's time to return to the Eucharist with joy. For those of you who have already resumed your practice of attending Holy Mass, welcome back! For those who have yet to do so, there is no time like the present. Jesus waits for you with His love beyond all measure!

No 8:15am Mass: July 26,28,29,30



According to Canon Law #619:

“Superiors are to devote themselves diligently to their office and together with the members entrusted to them are to strive to build a community of brothers or sisters in Christ, in which God is sought and loved before all things. Therefore, they are to nourish the members regularly with the food of the word of God and are to draw them to the celebration of the sacred liturgy. They are to be an example to them in cultivating virtues and in the observance of the laws and traditions of their own institute; they are to meet the personal needs of the members appropriately, solicitously to care for and visit the sick, to correct the restless, to console the faint of heart, and to be patient toward all.”

We give thanks to Fr. Roberto Saldivar, MSpS who served the Province of the Missionaries of the Holy Spirit in the USA as Provincial Superior for the past 5 years.

RENEWING THE OBLIGATION TO SUNDAY MASS



ARCHDIOCESE OF PORTLAND IN OREGON

DECREE RENEWING THE OBLIGATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MASS ON SUNDAYS AND OTHER HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

Having decreed, in response to the serious threat to public health posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, on the 12th and 16th of March 2020 and further on the 6th of April 2020, the suspension of public Masses and, ultimately, a dispensation from the obligation to participate in Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation (c. 1247), without failing to remind the faithful of the duty to keep holy the Sabbath; And having already lifted the suspension of public Masses on the 4th of May 2020 and found that the safety protocols and precautions in place in our churches since then have been effective in preventing the spread of illness; Now, observing that many reliable signs indicate that the most severe phase of the pandemic is concluding and considering that the Governor of Oregon issued executive order 21-15 on the 25th of June 2021 lifting all remaining public health restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic, effective the 30th of June 2021; And with gratitude to the Lord for guiding and accompanying His Church throughout this time of pandemic; I hereby revoke the dispensation from canon 1247, **effective the 16th of July, 2021, the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel**, and, thereby, renew the obligation of the faithful to participate, in person, in the celebration of Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation beginning with the observance of the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In accord with Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 2181) and the universal law of the Church (c. 1248 §2), all the usual factors which may excuse a member of the faithful from attending Mass on days of obligation remain in place.

For example, those who are ordinarily excused might include: the sick, their caretakers, and anyone with serious health concerns or grave fear of illness which necessitates avoiding large public gatherings. Such persons, nonetheless, should "devote themselves to prayer for a suitable time" (c. 1248 §2). In other cases, the faithful are reminded that, for a just cause, the pastor of a parish can dispense the faithful of the parish and anyone actually present in the parish from the obligation to participate in the Mass in individual cases or may commute the obligation to some other pious work (c. 1245).

All are bound to keep holy the Sabbath by abstaining "from those works and affairs which hinder the worship to be rendered to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the suitable relaxation of mind and body" (c. 1247). I order that this decree be made known to all the faithful through all the usual means of communication. Given at the Pastoral Center of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon on this 30th of June, 2021, the Memorial of the First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church, everything to the contrary notwithstanding.

Benevolence Envelope

In of July 2021, you will notice in your offertory envelopes an envelope labelled Benevolence Fund. A Benevolence Fund Policy was approved by the Administrative Council several years ago. St. Matthew established a Benevolence Fund in order to meet the immediate needs of community members in crisis. Community is defined as "people who belong to St. Matthew or anyone who lives within Hillsboro city limits". Distributions are limited to \$750 or less and must be paid directly to the business to which money is owed (ie: PGE, City of Hillsboro Utilities, landlord, etc.) The benevolence fund works in conjunction with SVDP and other local need agencies. In the past, we have assisted with rent, utilities, bus transportation, and gas.

Any donations made via the benevolence envelope are restricted to this specific fund to assist others in crisis and are 100% tax deductible (as allowed by law). If you would like to donate online, please go to <https://bit.ly/3vSg9KX> and follow the steps.

En julio 2021, notará en sus sobres de ofrenda un nuevo sobre con el nombre Fondo de Benevolencia. Una Póliza de Fondo de Benevolencia que fue aprobada por el Consejo Administrativo hace varios años. San Mateo estableció un Fondo de Benevolencia para ayudar a las necesidades inmediatas de los miembros de la comunidad en crisis. La comunidad se define como "personas que pertenecen a San Mateo o cualquier persona que viva dentro de los límites de la ciudad de Hillsboro". Las distribuciones están limitadas a \$750 o menos y deben pagarse directamente a la empresa a la que se adeuda dinero (es decir, PGE, Utilidades de la Ciudad de Hillsboro, arrendador, etc.) El fondo de benevolencia funciona en conjunto con SVDP y otras agencias locales de necesidades. En el pasado, hemos ayudado con el alquiler, los servicios públicos, el transporte en autobús y la gasolina.


