FROM THE DESK OF FR. JUAN GONZALEZ, MSPS

Dear Friends,

I am so excited to begin this new liturgical year. Advent is one of my favorite seasons of the year, and this Advent in particular feels to me like a personal and communal opportunity to rebuild, renew, and refresh our lives and our community.

Advent is a time when we recall the Son of God becoming man for us, and we prepare ourselves for his second coming in glory. It is a time for active expectation, desire, prayer, communication, and joy.

Christmas is a time for joy and contemplation of the mystery of the Incarnation of the Son of God. We witness the first manifestations of his efforts to save us. As the Mother of God, Mary is especially celebrated during this season.

In the method of prayer proposed by the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, contemplation of the mysteries of Christ's life plays a central role. That is why, in addition to prayerful reading, it highlights what is called **contemplation**. During this time, we ask for a very special grace to know the Lord more intimately in order to love and serve him better.

I have **two suggestions for you**: I want to encourage you over December to daily pick up your Bible and follow the Advent journey by reading the first three chapters of **Gospel of**

Luke. We are hearing much in the media about the uncertainty of what Christmas 2021 will be like for us. It will be difficult for many and it will not be like a normal Christmas. However, one thing doesn't change – Christmas is the celebration of the most amazing gift offering in the history of humanity – that God would present Himself, made flesh as a baby in a backwater town in a not so important area of the Roman empire, born to an unmarried young woman and a lowly carpenter father. So, I pray whatever Christmas brings for you, the one main thing will be that you and your loved ones, wherever they may be can celebrate the coming of God into the midst of humanity in the person of Jesus.

The **second suggestion** is this: After a couple of years without opportunities to gather and pray and meditate together, we want to invite you to Join Fr. Peter Arteaga, MSpS, for a three part series on **THE MEANING OF ADVENT**. Fr. Peter will lead us in these evenings of recollection in the church on December 2nd, 9th, and 16th. He will begin with the 6:00 pm bilingual Mass followed by a one hour meditation, concluding at 7:30 pm. Please, consider making this part of your Advent plan.

Queridos amigos,

Estoy muy emocionado de comenzar este nuevo año litúrgico. El Adviento es una de mis estaciones favoritas del año, y este Adviento en particular me parece una oportunidad personal y comunitaria para reconstruir, renovar y refrescar nuestras vidas y nuestra comunidad.

El **Adviento** es un tiempo en el que recordamos al Hijo de Dios hecho hombre por nosotros, y nos preparamos para su segunda venida en gloria. Es un momento para la expectativa activa, el deseo, la oración, la comunicación y el gozo.

La **Navidad** es un tiempo de alegría y contemplación del misterio de la Encarnación del Hijo de Dios. Somos testigos de las primeras manifestaciones de sus esfuerzos por salvarnos. Como Madre de Dios, se celebra especialmente a María durante esta temporada.

En el método de oración propuesto por los Ejercicios espirituales de San Ignacio, la contemplación de los misterios de la vida de Cristo juega un papel central. Por eso, además de la lectura orante, destaca lo que se llama **contemplación**. Durante este tiempo, pedimos una gracia muy especial para conocer al Señor más íntimamente para amarlo y servirlo mejor.

Tengo dos sugerencias para ti: quiero animarte durante diciembre a que recojas tu Biblia todos los días y sigas el viaje de Adviento

leyendo los primeros **tres capítulos del Evangelio de Lucas**. Estamos escuchando mucho en los medios sobre la incertidumbre de cómo será la Navidad 2021 para nosotros. Será difícil para muchos y no será como una Navidad normal. Sin embargo, una cosa no cambia: la Navidad es la celebración de la ofrenda de obsequio más asombrosa en la historia de la humanidad, que Dios se presentaría a Sí mismo, hecho carne como un bebé en un pueblo en un área no tan importante del imperio romano, nacido de una joven soltera y un humilde padre carpintero. Mi oración es que sea lo que sea que la Navidad les traiga, lo principal será que usted y sus seres queridos, dondequiera que estén, puedan celebrar la venida de Dios en medio de la humanidad en la persona de Jesús.

La segunda sugerencia es la siguiente: después de un par de años sin oportunidades para reunirnos, orar y meditar juntos, no podemos invitarlo a unirse al P. FROM THE DESK OF MRS. RAMSPERGER



Dear Parishioners,

I would like to begin by thanking each of you for your continued support of St. Matthew Catholic School. Your generosity allows us to continue providing a Catholic education to all.

I am Diane Ramsperger, the interim principal for St. Matthew Catholic School. I was principal at St. Mary, Star of the Sea School in 2000. Then in 2004 I became principal of St. Francis of Assisi School in Roy. I was there for 15 years, then decided to retire. This past summer I was asked to come be principal here at St. Matthew. This will be my 20th year as a principal of a Catholic school in the Archdiocese of Portland, OR.

St. Matthew Catholic School is going strong this year! Currently we have 100 students enrolled in grades K-8. We have 9 students in the preschool. This year the Preschool is accepting only children 4 years old by Sept. 1. We have openings if you would like to enroll your preschooler. We are working hard to continue providing the excellent education St. Matthew has known in the past. Currently, our school secretary, Karla Cardenas, is bi-lingual as are a couple of our teachers. Our student body is a beautiful mix of many cultures!

The School Advisory Council is meeting again. It is great to have this council up and running again to advise Fr. Juan and I on various activi-

ties and policies. We are currently looking for additional members, especially in the area of finance and facilities. If you have a talent to share with the school, please let Father Juan know and we can put you on the slate of nominees.

The Parent Club has had a couple of meetings this year and have agreed to bring back the usual fundraisers: Wreath Sales (which ended last week), a virtual Auction in February, and Jog-a-thon in the spring. Parents have been generous with their time in volunteering with a variety of activities in and for the school.

We are able to offer a hot lunch to all the students this year, free of charge. The National School Lunch Program is allowing schools to participate in a special program for this year only: the Summer Extended Option. Fresh & Local is the company providing the food for the students' hot lunches. Donations are being asked to help cover the cost of our part time kitchen manager to prepare and serve the lunches. Our Schoolwide Learning Expectations encourage all of our students and staff to have HEART. H for Humbly Serves; E for Effectively Communicates; A for Academically Strives; R for Respectfully Models Catholic Values; and T for Thinks Critically.

Students are currently serving through donations to the Thanksgiving baskets. I have noticed

their academic striving with their attention to their studies. I see them always doing their best and so focused.

We offer all the regular subjects: Math, Reading, Writing, grammar, Social Studies, Science, Health, PE, Music, and Spanish, K-8. We are working with an art teacher to offer that class in a more formal way.

We model Catholic values through our daily interactions with each other, the daily Religion classes, and weekly attendance at Mass.

All of the classes are in-person, with Covid protocols in place and with integrated technology.

We also have the Viking Club in session now, which is before & after school care for all ages, PreK through gr. 8. Also, CYO is open to all parishioners and school families for children in grades 3-8. You can sign up now for the basketball program.

Our theme this year is: One Community growing in Christ. As we work to improve our learning, we are also focusing our attention to working together as one community serving each other and growing together in Christ.

There is one more item I would like to mention.

As you know Catholic school does have a cost.

To help with that cost is the Weston Foundation with the Archdiocese of Portland. Mr.

Weston will match up to \$35,000 for donations to the St. Matthew Tuition Assistance Fund and

will match up to \$45,000 for donations to the Catholic Education Endowment Fund (CEEF). You are welcome to make donations to either fund. All your donations are welcome and are tax deductible as allowed by law.

Thank you once again for your wonderful support of St. Matthew Catholic School. Go Vikings!!

INTRODUCTORY RITES

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Let us praise God, who enlightens every heart, now and for ever.

Amen.

My brothers and sisters, today we begin the season of Advent. We open our hearts to God's love as we prepare to welcome Christ into our lives and homes. The candles of this wreath remind us that Jesus Christ came to conquer the darkness of sin and to lead us into the light of his glorious kingdom.

READING OF THE WORD

Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the prophet Isaiah: 9:1-2, 5-6

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone. You have brought them abundant joy and great rejoicing, As they rejoice before you as at the harvest, as men make merry when dividing spoils. For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, From David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms

INTERCESSIONS

That the keeping of Advent may open our hearts to God's love, we pray to the Lord. R.
Come, Lord Jesus.

That the light of Christ may penetrate the dark-

ness of sin, we pray to the Lord. R.

That this wreath may constantly remind us to prepare for the coming of Christ, we pray to the Lord. R.

PRAYER OF BLESSING

Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Savior, who enlightens our hearts and dispels the darkness of ignorance and sin.

Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this wreath; may their light reflect the splendor of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever. R. Amen.

The first candle is lighted.

CONCLUDING RITE

A lay minister concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the light of Christ lead us to the joy of his kingdom, now and for ever. R. Amen.

It is preferable to end the celebration with a suitable song.
