FROM THE DESK OF FR. JUAN GONZALEZ, MSPS

Dear Friends,

On January 10th was the 84 years since the death of one of my favorite people, Felix of Jesus Rougier (1859-1938). Fr. Felix was a Frenchman who chose to follow Christ by dedicating his life to love others. Born in rural France, he joined the congregation of the Marist Priests and worked as professor, catechist, military chaplain, missionary, parish priest, formator director, founder of four religious communities, spiritual director, and spiritual writer.

No matter what you think about the Church or priests, no matter if you practice the faith or not, no matter what your political views are, we all admire a life lived with passion and purpose. A life that is given away. And he lived his life that way.

I hope that you can join me and my brothers in celebrating today the life of a man who gave the best of him for others. For he loved prophetically. That is, he publicly expressed his love for God and for God's priestly people in the midst of enormous difficulties: war, religious persecution, intolerance, false accusations, and poverty. He didn't love just a particular group of people, but all people: he ministers to the soldiers, as well as to the rebels. He served the indigenous, and ministered to the hierarchy of the Church, among his friends were bishops, beggars, political leaders, cloister nuns, Mexicans, Irish, Spanish, people who practiced the faith, and people who didn't. That kind of love that reminds us of another person who worked in and around Galilee, publicly loving all sorts of people - lepers, tax collectors, prostitutes, Gentiles, Roman centurions-.

When I thought about Felix's 82nd anniversary of his death, I thought of the Gospel of Luke, which says: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

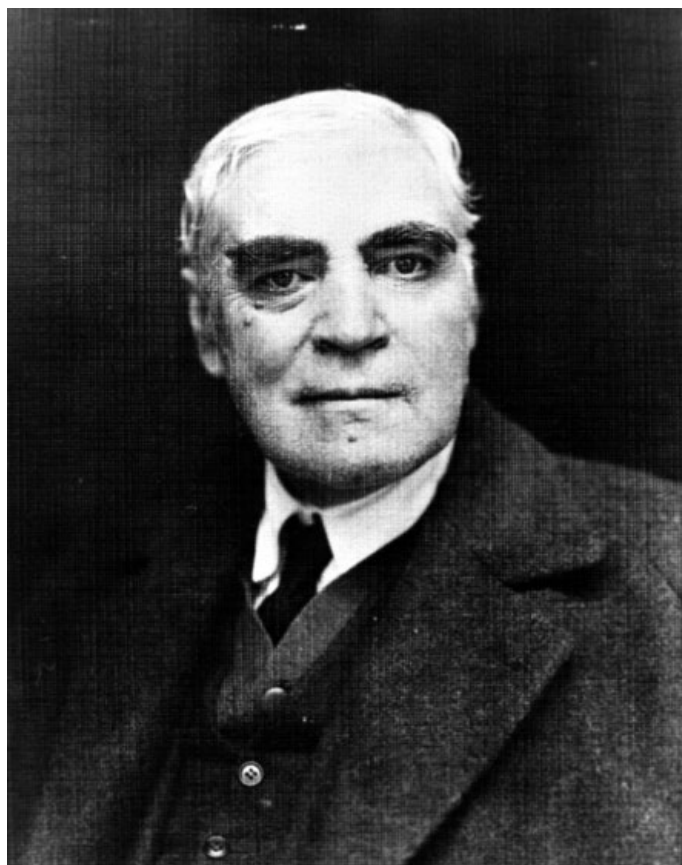
There is a lot of talk about who deserves our care and attention and who doesn't these days. But in every thing we say and do, particularly for Christians, love must come first. And not the love that condemns first, or judges first, or labels first. But the love that loves first. Because God is love.

Eighty-two years after Felix's prophetic life on earth ended, the Missionaries of the Holy Spirit, the Oblates of Christ the Priest, the Missionary Guadalupanas of the Holy Spirit, and the Daughters of the Holy Spirit, continue in different Countries, languages and ministries the legacy of a Frenchman who loved much. Such is the power of a life lived with passion.

May Felix intercede for us, and may we always love prophetically, recklessly, prodigally... eternally.

MENSAJE DEL P. JUAN GONZALEZ, MSPS

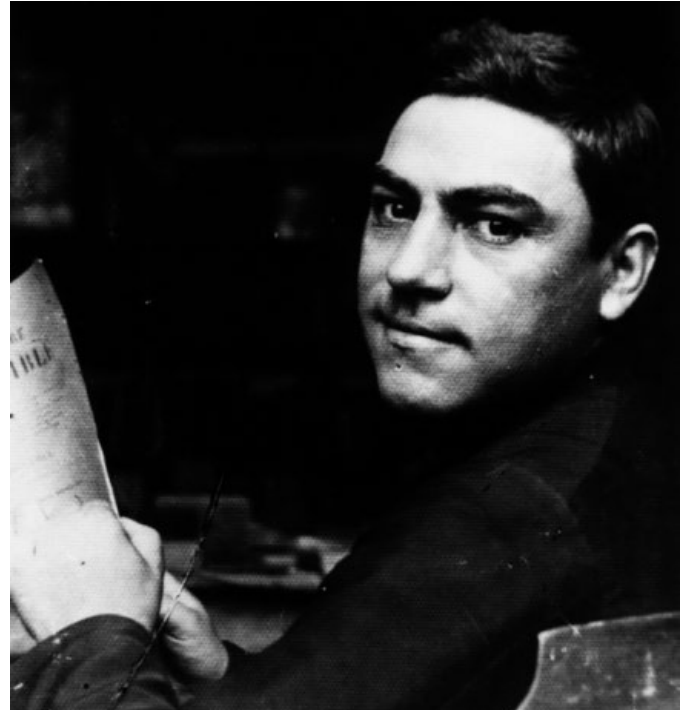
Queridos amigos,

El lunes pasado se cumplieron 84 años de la muerte de una de mis personas favoritas, Félix de Jesús Rougier (1859-1938). P. Félix fue un francés que eligió seguir a Cristo al dedicar su vida a amar a los demás. Nacido en la Francia rural, se unió a la congregación de los sacerdotes maristas y trabajó como profesor, catequista, capellán militar, misionero, párroco, director formador, fundador de cuatro comunidades religiosas, director espiritual y escritor espiritual.

No importa lo que pienses sobre la Iglesia o los sacerdotes, no importa si practicas la fe o no, no importa cuáles sean tus opiniones políticas, todos admiramos una vida vivida con pasión y propósito. Una vida que se regala. Y vivió su vida de esa manera.

Espero que puedan unirse a mí y a mis hermanos para celebrar hoy la vida de un hombre que dio lo mejor de él por los demás. Porque amó proféticamente. Es decir, expresó públicamente su amor a Dios y al pueblo sacerdotal de Dios en medio de enormes dificultades: guerra, persecución religiosa, intolerancia, acusaciones falsas y pobreza. No amaba solo a un grupo particular de personas, sino a todas las personas: ministra a los soldados, así como a las juergas. Sirvió a los indígenas y ministró a la jerarquía de la Iglesia, entre sus amigos había obispos, mendigos, líderes políticos, monjas de clausura, mexicanos, irlandeses, españoles, personas que practicaban la fe y personas que no. Ese tipo de amor que nos recuerda a otra persona que trabajaba en Galilea y sus alrededores, amando públicamente a todo tipo de personas -leprosos, recaudadores de impuestos, prostitutas, gentiles, centuriones romanos-.

Cuando pensé en el 82 aniversario de la muerte de Félix, pensé en el Evangelio de Lucas, que dice: "El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para llevar buenas nuevas a los pobres. Me ha enviado a Proclame libertad a los cautivos y vista a



los ciegos, para dejar libres a los oprimidos y proclamar un año agradable al Señor".

Se habla mucho sobre quién merece nuestro cuidado y atención y quién no en estos días. Pero en todo lo que decimos y hacemos, especialmente para los cristianos, el amor debe ser lo primero. Y no el amor que condena primero, o juzga primero, o etiqueta primero. Pero el amor que ama primero. Porque Dios es amor.

Ochenta y dos años después de que terminó la vida profética de Félix en la tierra, los Misioneros del Espíritu Santo, los Oblatos de Cristo Sacerdote, las Misioneras Guadalupanas del Espíritu Santo y las Hijas del Espíritu Santo continúan en diferentes países, idiomas y ministerios. el legado de un francés que amaba mucho. Tal es el poder de una vida vivida con pasión.

Que Félix interceda por nosotros, y que siempre amemos proféticamente, imprudentemente, prodigamente ... eternamente.

WHEN PARISHIONERS BECOME HOMEBOUND



Every parish has them: once-active church members who now have limitations (temporary or permanent) that have reduced their involvement in the parish. They are known as the homebound or

shut-ins, and require specialized care. However, they also offer substantial gifts to the community of faith.

The homebound (who are primarily older adults and their caregivers) may be forgotten, ignored, or misunderstood. Fortunately, parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Portland take a visionary approach to their homebound members... "If our homebound members are unable to come to church, let's take the church to them."

Pastoral Visitation Ministers understand disabilities and the aging process and how these affect

the psychological, physical, and emotional states of those unable to participate in Mass and the life of the church. The visitation volunteers address the whole person, including the need to feel purposeful and meaningfully involved with the church community.

A parish shows its truest colors when they see that the lonely beg not to be forgotten, the hurting ask for mercy, and the sick seek compassion. Parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Portland know that caring and feeding of our homebound is essential, and a form of healing that is filled with grace.

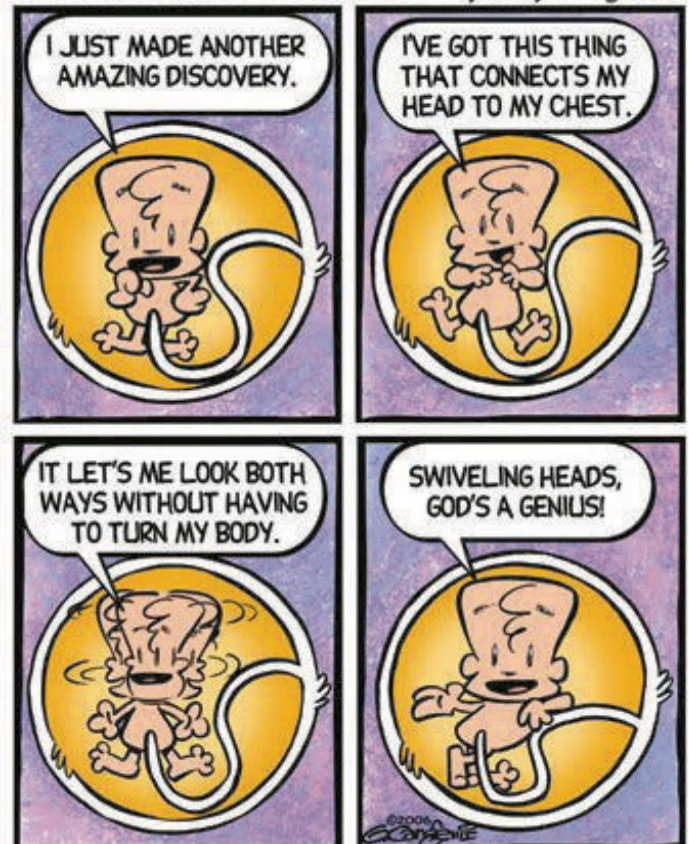

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY • MATRIMONIOS

Arrangements for the Sacrament of Matrimony should be made at least six months prior to the

wedding with Fr. Rito Guzman, MSpS at rguzman@stmatthewhillsboro.org or at (503) 648-1998 ext. 260.

REQUIREMENTS

1. Call Fr. Rito Guzman, MSpS

Make an appointment with Fr. Rito before you make a reception hall or wedding date reservation.

2. Updated Baptism Certificate

Must be reissued from the original parish within 6 months prior to the wedding date and should have the notations of all other sacraments received.

3. Four Witnesses

Two for the bride and two for the groom.

4. Marriage Preparation Classes

Arrange with Fr. Rito Guzman, MSpS

5. Wedding Coordinator

The couple meets with the coordinator before the wedding date.

6. Marriage License

Must present a valid Oregon marriage license three weeks prior to the wedding date. If there is already a civil marriage, we will need a copy of your civil marriage certificate.

REQUISITOS

1. Llamar al Padre Rito Guzmán, MSpS

Hacer una cita para platicar sobre los planes antes de reservar el lugar de la recepción.

2. Acta de Bautismo Reciente

Debe pedir a la parroquia donde fue bautizada/o una copia reciente de su bautismo con fines para matrimonio seis meses antes de su boda. El acta debe traer las anotaciones de su primera comunión y confirmación.

3. Cuatro Testigos

Dos para la novia y dos para el novio.

4. Pláticas Pre-Matrimoniales

Hablar con el P. Rito Guzman, MSpS

5. Cooodinadora de la boda

La pareja tendrá una reunión con ella poco antes de la boda.

6. Licencia Matrimonial

El matrimonio por la iglesia también es válido por el civil. Se requerirá una licencia válida del estado de Oregón tres semanas antes de la boda. Si ya están casados por el civil, solo necesita traer una copia de su certificado.

Favor de comunicarse al Padre Rito Guzman, MSpS al teléfono o correo electrónico mencionado arriba por lo menos seis meses antes de la boda para iniciar su proceso.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK • UNCIÓN DE LOS ENFERMOS

In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his dying and rising. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to

wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.

After being suspended for 18 months, the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be offered again at the 8:15 am Mass on the first Saturday of the month. For sacramental emergencies that require a priest, please call the parish office.
