



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Awake, O Sleeper!

This morning came a little earlier than I would have liked — Daylight Savings Time always does. Sometimes that morning sunlight seems more intrusive than illuminating. You're still half-lost in sleep, and that sun is demanding of you a lot more than you're ready to give.

I've said it, and I'm sure you've said it, too. "Just five more minutes." You hit the "snooze" button on your iPhone once (maybe twice? Show of hands?) and turn away from the window.

So many kings of the Old Testament were steadfast in their sleepy ways, rejecting the light their God tried to share with them. Likewise, John tells us that, though Light was sent into the world in the form of Christ, the world preferred darkness.

Sometimes it seems, when reading through Scripture, that all throughout salvation history, God has been trying to pull back the curtains, to rouse us from our defiant slumber. And we resist Him. Time and time again, we resist Him.

Light brings a certain responsibility with it. It seems to compel productivity. Furthermore, there's no hiding in the light. Any photographer worth his salt knows how to manipulate it, highlighting the good and casting some merciful shade on the bad.

As we enter into the fourth week of Lent, we're getting so close to the main event. Can we handle the light that will come on Easter morning, bursting into the tomb as the stone is rolled away? Can we keep ourselves from hitting the "snooze" button on our souls, and sit up to face the dawn of a new day?

We Are Never Forgotten

Today the Church celebrates **Laetare Sunday**. The word **Laetare** is a Latin word which means “rejoice”. The word comes from the antiphon of today’s Mass (Isaiah 66:10-11).

We rejoice because we are already four weeks into the journey of Lent. In a particular way, we rejoice because of the love and mercy of God in our lives. In spite of our unfaithfulness to God, He remains ever faithful. According to St. Paul in his Letter to Timothy, **“If we are faithless, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself”** (2 Timothy 2:13).

According to the First Reading from the Book of Chronicles, Israel was unfaithful to God in spite of all the Lord had done for her. She was taken into captivity in Babylon as a result of her numerous acts of infidelity. This was a painful and bitter experience for Israel, reflected in today’s Psalm (Psalms 137). When her years of exile were over, the Lord directed Cyrus, king of Persia, to send them home, and even built a temple for them in Judah. The Lord will never abandon His people.

In today’s Second Reading, St. Paul takes up the same theme of God’s compassion: **“Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ – by grace you have been saved -, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus”** (Ephesians 2:4-6).

God never forgets. Even when we choose to disobey Him and walk away from Him, He is always looking out for us. He will not abandon us. In His great love, He sent us His only begotten Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, that we may be reconciled to Him. Let us rejoice in the Lord for our God is rich in mercy and compassion. If He has loved us so much, we need to respond by inviting Him into our lives not only this Lenten season but all the days of our lives. May the light of His Divine Presence chase away the darkness of sin that sometimes enshrouds us. May Jesus draw us to His precious side.

Weekly Gospel Reflection for Families

The Good News

This Gospel passage contains one of the most beloved and well-known verses of Scripture: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). Indeed, God's great love for us is clearly presented in this Gospel reading. The Gospel also calls us to keep coming into the light, to turn from our wicked ways, and to live the truth.

Reflect

God sent his Son into the world with a purpose, and that purpose was to save and to redeem those who believed in him. Take time to think about the world into which you are sending your children. What are you doing to prepare them to fulfill their purpose, their call, as sons and daughters of God? How are you showing them what it means to come to the light and to live the truth?

Share

Think of one or more persons your family knows who might be experiencing a time of darkness, at a time when it is difficult for them to remember that God loves them. Decide on ways your family can reach out to those persons—perhaps by sending cards, making phone calls, fixing meals, or spending time with them. Make an action plan to follow through on your decisions.

Talk

Updated Mass Information



We are open in a **limited capacity**. Currently, we are able to take **264 people per Mass**. Our Mass Schedule is Monday-Friday (8:00 AM), Tuesday evening (6:00 PM), Saturday (8:00 AM, 4:30 PM), and Sunday (8:00 AM, 10:00 AM, 12:00 Noon, 2:00 PM).

We are also able to offer Confession by appointment. **Reservations are required for all Masses. To make a reservation for Mass, you can sign-up online using the links on our homepage (www.stjosephhom.org) or call the parish office during business hours.** Per Diocesan policy, we are required to lock the doors once Mass begins. We ask that those with reservations arrive 25-30 minutes early so that everyone can be well-checked and seated on time. Thank you for your help.

This week the parish office is open Monday - Friday from 8:30 AM - 4:00 PM, and Sundays from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM. We will no longer be open on Saturdays. During this time the church is not open for prayer outside of the Mass. Masks must be worn at all times while on our property. Everyone is required to pass a temperature check. We look forward to welcoming you!

SJHOM St. Vincent de Paul Offering Limited Services




St. Vincent de Paul

Due to the ongoing pandemic, St. Vincent de Paul is currently able to provide very limited assistance with utilities, food, gasoline, or bus passes. They check messages on Mondays and Thursdays from 9:00 AM-11:00 AM. If you are a parishioner or live within our boundaries, you may call them at 702.304.3034 and provide your name, good contact phone number, your parishioner number, your address, and the type of assistance you are requesting. After an SVdP volunteer returns your call, you may also be required to provide a copy of your photo ID and, if applicable, a copy of the first page of your utility bill to the Parish Office. All other types of assistance they have helped with in the past are currently suspended.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH, HUSBAND OF MARY

The feast day of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary is March 19. The Bible pays Joseph the highest compliment: he was a “just” man. The quality meant a lot more than faithfulness in paying debts.

When the Bible speaks of God “justifying” someone, it means that God, the all-holy or “righteous” one, so transforms a person that the individual shares somehow in God’s own holiness, and hence it is really “right” for God to love him or her. In other words, God is not playing games, acting as if we were lovable when we are not.


By saying Joseph was “just,” the Bible means that he was one who was completely open to all that God wanted to do for him. He became holy by opening himself totally to God.

The rest we can easily surmise. Think of the kind of love with which he wooed and won Mary, and the depth of the love they shared during their marriage.

It is no contradiction of Joseph’s manly holiness that he decided to divorce Mary when she was found to be with child. The important words of the Bible are that he planned to do this “quietly” because he was “a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame” (Matthew 1:19).

The just man was simply, joyfully, wholeheartedly obedient to God—in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth, in the undetermined number of years of quiet faith and courage.

The Bible tells us nothing of Joseph in the years after the return to Nazareth except the incident of finding Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41–51). Perhaps this can be taken to mean that God wants us to realize that the holiest family was like every other family. The circumstances of life for the holiest family were like those of every family. This is why when Jesus’ mysterious nature began to appear, people couldn’t believe that he came from such humble beginnings: “Is he not the carpenter’s son? Is not his mother named Mary...?” (Matthew 13:55a). It was almost as indignant as “Can anything good come from Nazareth?” (John 1:46b).



ST. VINCENT DE PAUL ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Your parish St. Vincent de Paul Society would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude for your tremendous generosity amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. Our parishioners, along with all those living in our local area, who were faced with unprecedented challenges and difficulties, reached out to us. With your support in the past year, we were able to extend God's love and mercy to everyone we can appropriately assist. We had to get creative and replace in-person home-visits with phone calls. We sent rent and utilities payments on behalf of those we serve by mail or by other contactless transactions.

Our annual fiscal report year (October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020) to the International Council of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is as follows:

In the 2020 fiscal year, we received 126 calls, responding to 97 phone calls for assistance, and made 36 contactless phone assessments with clients. We helped approximately 108 families with either financial assistance or referrals to appropriate agencies based on their needs. When financial assistance included payment of bills, we paid these directly to the client's landlord, utility company, or agency such as insurance or loan. Your generosity helped families to avoid eviction or foreclosure, critical utilities shut offs, the loss of a job that required transportation to work, and/or food insecurity. You also helped us to provide relief to many victims of national disasters.

Through your generosity, we received donations of \$44,908. The members of this ministry donated \$889, approximately 794 hours volunteer time, and drove over 3.951 miles in their service to this ministry.

Our conference provided \$17,139 to those in need, as follows:

- Rent/mortgage payments: \$8,838.
- Food/gas cards, and bus passes: \$3,866.
- Utilities: \$1,716
- Other assistance (phone, cable/internet, car repairs, funeral assistance, etc.): \$2,719

We donated \$4,000 in disaster relief for the national victims of fires, floods, hurricanes, etc. Through the National Council of the Society of SVdP, these funds go directly to individual SVdP conferences in the areas impacted by the disasters.

We continued our twinning program, providing \$2,400 to help a new or struggling SVdP conference in the poorest area of our Western Region with their important ministry. Our operating expenses were \$1,753 and we paid \$281 in dues to the National Council. Our total expenses and disbursements in the fiscal year were \$25,573.

Due to the ongoing pandemic, we have temporarily expanded our coverage area to consider requests for assistance from outside the parish boundaries and to non-parishioners. Those requesting assistance should call and leave a message for SVdP at the phone number 702.304.3034. Our ministry is staffed by volunteers who answer voice mail messages on Mondays and Thursday after the 8:00 AM daily Mass and work through requests for our help and referrals.

If you would like to join us in this most rewarding ministry and/or would like more information about this ministry, please call and leave us a message.

This pandemic continues to present many challenges to many people, including to the mission of SVdP, which is based on growing in faith together and helping people to get closer to God by our personal connection. Please hold us in prayer, along with those who are supported by your kind and continued generosity.
