Solemnity of The Body and Blood of Christ

This weekend the Church celebrates the queen of all the Sacraments, the Most Holy Eucharist. The First Reading from the Book of Exodus describes a very significant ceremony in the Old Testament. The sacrifice of Moses at the foot of Mount Sinai was a foretaste of the new and everlasting sacrifice of Christ on Mount Calvary. For the ancient Israelites, forgiveness of sin was tied to the offering of a victim. Jesus is the spotless victim who was sacrificed to take away our sins. His was the ultimate sacrifice of the New Covenant. It is through this that mankind is united with the Father. According to the Second Reading:

“For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer’s ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.” -Hebrews 9:11-14

Through the words of Consecration during Mass, the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The Lord Jesus is truly present to us under the appearances of bread and wine. This is not speculation:

“While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, “Take it; this is my body.” Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, “This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.” -Mark 14:22-24

What we receive at Mass is something sacred and precious: the Body of Christ. Therefore, as we celebrate this great Solemnity, the Church calls on all her children to reflect deeply on this great Sacrament of God’s divine love. How do we dispose ourselves to properly receive this Sacrament? What sacrifices does Jesus challenge us to make for others daily? How are we living out Jesus’ message of love wherever we find ourselves? Do we pay attention at Mass or do we distract ourselves or others? Do we use our time at Mass to discuss the news of the day or catch up with friends, or do we actively participate?

The Holy Eucharist is: A special **Encounter** with God and with one another. A call to **Union** with God. A communal **Celebration**. A call to **Holiness**. A call to **Adoration**. A **Reenactment** of the events of our salvation at Calvary. A moment of **Intercession** for others. A sacrament of **Sanctification**. A **Thanksgiving** offered to God.

We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?

Weekly Gospel Reflection for Families

The Good News

Mark describes for his community the words and actions of Jesus at the Last Supper. Scripture scholars believe that the words were meant by Mark to help the early Christian community to understand the Eucharist. While they may not be the exact words spoken by Jesus, they help us understand that Jesus gave his disciples a way of remembering him through the bread and the wine—his Body and his Blood.

Reflect

Much of today's Gospel focuses on the preparation for and sharing of a meal. The busy schedules that many parents and families keep today often intrude on this important daily ritual of sharing a meal, conversation, and time together. Mealtimes should be a holy time, a gathering where all are welcome to share dreams, joys, and struggles of the day. Think about the ritual of sharing a meal as a family. What can you do to create time for this in your family's daily routine? How can you involve all family members in the preparation for and celebration of a daily meal together? How can you make family mealtime a holy time, a joyful time, a prayerful time, and a memorable time?

Share

The Last Supper was a special meal that the disciples of Jesus would never forget. Jesus' actions—the breaking of the bread, the sharing of the cup, the washing of the feet—drew the attention of the disciples. While they did not fully understand Jesus' words—"Take it; this is my body" and "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many"—they could sense that there was something very special taking place. As a family, discuss your memories of very special meals. Who was at table with you? What did you talk about? What foods did you eat? If time allow, plan a special meal for a small group of family members or friends. Decide on a date, what foods you will serve, and what questions you might ask your special guests.

Talk

In light of today's emphasis on preparing for and sharing a meal, move from today's session to a shared family meal. Invite all family members to take part in setting the table; preparing the food; discussing hopes, dreams, and struggles; clearing the table; and washing the dishes.

We ask that everyone arrive 10-15 minutes early so that everyone can be seated on time. The parish office is open Monday-Friday from 8:30 AM-4:00 PM, and Sundays from 9:00 AM-1:00 PM. We are also able to offer Confession by appointment. **The Church is now open for prayer during office hours**. We look forward to welcoming you!


