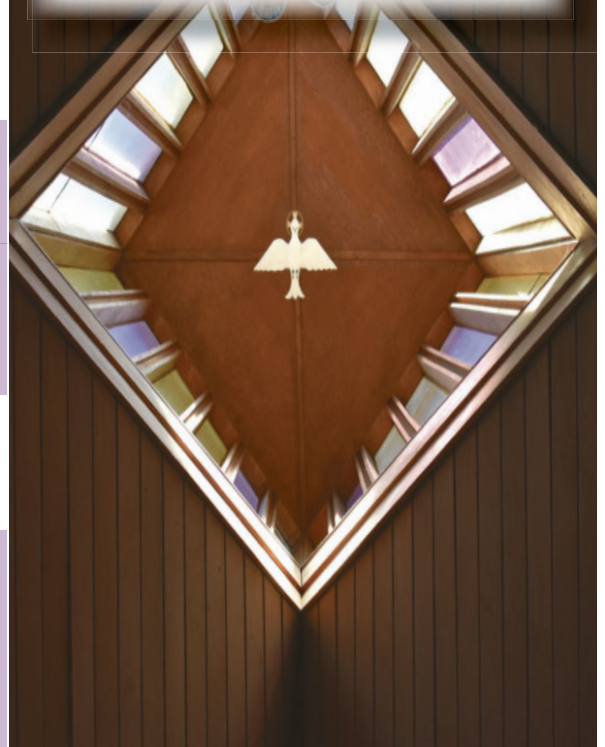

SET YOUR HEARTS ON THE THINGS OF HEAVEN

Though we are just in the second week of Lent, the liturgy invites us to reflect on how the passion of Christ leads to his resurrection. In the Gospel of today, Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While at prayer, he revealed to them the mystery of the *Transfiguration*. They were completely overwhelmed by this experience. This manifestation was a revelation of Christ's divinity and a foretaste of the resurrection. The event was also to strengthen them to stand firm and not to be scandalized by the cruel crucifixion of Christ which would follow. As we continue our Lenten journey, we are called to unite our sacrifices, and prayers with Christ, God's chosen Son, and to listen to him. It is Christ who gives meaning to all our works of penance and self-denial.

Like Abraham, our father in faith in the First Reading of today, let us put our faith in God and harken to his word. When God called him, he was not popular, but through his obedience to God, he became a father of multitudes. The reading also reminds us that, if we do not deviate from God's ways, we will realize His promises. This is a very consoling message for this season.

The Second Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians invites us to conduct ourselves properly as citizens of heaven. In the words of St. Paul: "For many, as I have often told you and now tell you even in tears, conduct themselves as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction. Their God is their stomach; their glory is in their "shame." Their minds are occupied with earthly things" (Phil 3:18-19). As we begin this new week, let us spend some quality time listening to Jesus as he speaks to our hearts. We ask him to melt away our pride, fears, prejudices, coldness, and doubts. May he help us set our hearts on the things of heaven. So, let us not just fast from food this week but, may our fasting challenge us to do the things that matter in the eyes of God.

The Resurrection and Spiritual Hangriness

I want to talk about being hangry. I'll give you a quick description of hangriness, though I warn you, it doesn't come from the Oxford English Dictionary. Hangriness is when you're so hungry you get angry. You turn into a real piece of work. You can't get anything done and you're probably not a joy to be around, at least until you grab a snack. Everybody gets this way sometimes.

We can be this way in our souls, too. It's so easy to get distracted by the hungers of this world: greed, pride, anxiety. We can become ruled by the needs of our bodies and the desires of our mind and, in doing so, neglect the needs and the desires of our souls.

Everyday stewardship calls us to a constant reflection on the truth that we are not made for this world, as Christ clearly shows us in his Transfiguration. He reveals himself in his heavenly glory, just before he is going to be deprived of all earthly needs and wants — even his very life. He shows us that this is what we were meant for. This is what we are striving for.

Lent exists to remind us that we are not made for this world. When you become spiritually hangry — or as Scripture more eloquently puts it this week, when your mind is "occupied with earthly things" — turn your thoughts to the Transfiguration. I promise you, it's even better than grabbing an energy bar.

GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR FAMILIES

THE GOOD NEWS

Peter, James and John went with Jesus to pray on a mountain top. The disciples witnessed what we call the transfiguration where Jesus' face became radiant and his clothes dazzling white. Along with Jesus stood Moses and Elijah. The disciples had no idea what was happening and Peter, in his ignorance, suggested that they erect three tents to commemorate the event. As though to correct Peter's misunderstanding, a voice came from the cloud naming Jesus as his son and telling the disciples to listen to him. There was not to be confusion about Moses or Elijah being equal to Jesus nor should Peter have tried to assume control of a holy happening, but rather listen to this holy one.

REFLECT

Parents and older siblings are often in a privileged situation to see a radiant look on a joyful child's face. Maybe it's how they light up when special company arrives, or maybe the look of delight at a special gift or surprise. What kind of transfigurations have you seen this week either in the faces of children, friends, co-workers, or even in yourself?

SHARE

Think about places where you have seen change, perhaps in your family and home, school, workplace, neighborhood or community. Suggest ways that these changes are transforming for you and others. Jesus marked the end of an ancient age and the beginning of something new. How are the changes you see like the end of something old and the beginning of something new? How are you involved in that change? How are you part of the change Jesus brings?

What is Saint Joseph's Table?



Many centuries ago, a beautiful tradition began in southern Italy and Sicily, to honor St. Joseph, Husband of Mary. A severe famine occurred in this area causing intense suffering.

The Italian farmers beseeched their patron saint, St. Joseph, for help. The famine ended and in gratitude, the people built an altar in honor of St. Joseph, and filled it with their prized possession . . . food.

Loved by so many Italians, many have asked special petitions of St. Joseph through prayer and in turn promised a table of foods that would be acquired through begging or donation and then placed on a table, in his honor.

This table feast is done in thanksgiving for prayers and wishes that have been granted.

Since the feast of St. Joseph is celebrated during the holy season of Lent, meat is not served, only breads, pastries, pasta, vegetables and fruit. The food is blessed during the course of Mass in honor of St. Joseph, and after Mass, attendees may purchase the wonderful foods, desserts, fruits, flowers and special St. Joseph candles.

All proceeds are distributed to the poor.

Legend tells us that “HE” who feeds anyone entering “HIS” home on St. Joseph’s Day will never want for food.
