**From The Pastor's Desk**

**The Fruits of this Sacred Time**

Last week, Jesus was in the desert. In the desert was Satan, wild beasts, and angels. After his temptations, with a new sense of authority and power he faced his mission and announced the presence of the kingdom and the need for people to repent and believe the gospel now: the hour of fulfilment. It is an invitation with an urgency that is here and now, this moment, not futuristic.

This second Sunday of Lent presents us with the tests of Abraham to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. Several years ago, a student in a Religious education class asked me, "Why didn't Abraham protect his son? Conventional wisdom would tell us that one lineage would have ended if Abraham were to physically sacrifice his son. To answer this question, one must understand the nature of the promises and their symbolisms. The mount Moriah upon which Abraham was to offer Isaac was a sacred site where revelation would take place. On Calvary, believers received the manifestation that Isaac was a prefigure of the Son of God, given as a ransom for many. Abraham trusted God and was willing to offer his son, which attests to the eternal testament of disciples of all ages proclaimed by St. Paul that *we work by faith and not by sight* [2 Cor 5:7]. And why didn't God defend his only son? God let Jesus pay the debt that we couldn't pay so we might have life and have it to the full [Jn 10:10].

On Ash Wednesday we began our season of Lent but it does seem we have been in Lent since the beginning of the pandemic early last year. I remember vividly the day the doors of the church were shut to halt public in-person worship and services. With the recent storms, it looks like those in the storm-stricken areas have been in Lent for a while. Sadly, the loss of human lives, among other incalculable losses did not help matters. We were forced us to give up heat, water, grocery, and electricity to the force of natural disaster. Conversely, this sacred time calls on us to give up through perseverance the things that keep us bloated, constipated, insensitive, and make us too heavy to make the journey of Lent. Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving are the pillars upon which our Lenten practices stand. We have numerous spiritual resources available on our communication platforms to help guide you on this journey.

In his 2021 Lenten pastoral, Pope Francis invites the Church to go up to Jerusalem with Christ. We must not forget to carry our crosses although some might say that it's already a lot of crosses to carry. But it is a journey we do not make alone. Hope and Faith are our companions as St. Augustine would say: *Faith is to believe what you do not see. The reward of faith is to see what you believe.*

As bad as the basic things we live on are pulled from under our feet by the snowstorm, the season bids us to renew ourselves in the virtues of this sacred time. This is a time to reach out and care for others and disperse the fruits and seeds of generosity. The gospel beckons on everyone to support and attend to the immediate needs of neighbors. Your contribution might provide a warm place for those without power, meals for those without food, and financial assistance to get the water running again. Like Abraham, we must go through our trials with faith. The rationale for our self-denials, restraints, and mortifications of Lent is the Paschal Mystery: the life changing mystery that makes us a new creation so we may imitate God in his loving kindness and mercy. Have a fruitful Lenten journey!

## CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION

*Third times a charm!  
In-Person Faith Formation  
sessions are this Sunday,  
February 28 for Group C.

Parents, we are setting aside next week, March 5-11, for our diocesan mandated child safety training lesson. We are still being required to have a class this year. This safety class is typically referred to as VIRTUS for Grades K-3 and is conducted during the Theology of the Body (TOB) mini-series for Grades 4-6.

In order to make this lesson plan easier on you, the parent, we are opting for and have been granted approval from the diocese, to use the on-line safety program, **NETSMARTKIDS**. Some of the children who were in Grades 2 and 3 the past several years are already familiar with this program. Our Safety Officer, Sharon Bush, and I have reviewed the available **NETSMARTKIDS** videos and have selected ones which we believe are appropriate for your children since **NETSMARTKIDS** deals with on-line safety. And since all children have been doing some form of on-line schooling this past year, this seemed to be a good fit for families. We will be uploading "Router's Birthday Surprise" for Grades K-3 and "In the Cloud" for Grades 4-6. An on-line Google Acknowledgement Form has been developed for you—the parent—to complete since this information has to be documented and reported to the diocese for our annual audit. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact myself or Sharon Bush. As always, we greatly appreciate your assistance in completing this safety training!



Be sure you have completed your child's required Self-Reporting Form and Family Waiver Form before you arrive, as this speeds up the check-in process. The link is sent to you on Friday afternoon, via email, so be sure to check for it! The Google link will open at 6:00 a.m. Sunday morning (not before since kiddos tend to get sick between Friday afternoon and Sunday morning...) for completion. **Be sure to hit the SUBMIT button so the form makes it to my in-box.**

**On-Line students, your weekly Video Lessons continue to be posted on the CatholicBrain platform Friday afternoon. Parents, if you are not receiving my weekly emails, please let me know so we can update email addresses in my master distribution list.** With the inclement weather during the week of February 15-19, all on-line homework for the week of February 12-18 was not due until Thursday, February 25. We should now be all back on schedule and regular homework video lessons should be completed as assigned. Any families still having computer issues, please contact the CFF Office so we can make other arrangements.



## Lenten Reflections— Second Sunday of Lent

### Gospel Reading Mark 9:2-10 – The Transfiguration

#### Reflection Questions:

1. The Gospel reports that Peter is terrified in the midst of the Transfiguration. The passage does not provide a clear resolution to his fears, but points to where to begin the search for an answer: “This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.” What fears come up for you when you consider examining the sin of racism in today’s world? In your specific community? In your own family? How can your faith help you to overcome your fears to further God’s Kingdom?
2. Jesus’ clothes are described in this Gospel passage as becoming “dazzling white”. Imagery referencing light and darkness is often used to symbolize the difference between goodness, life or hope versus evil, death or the unknown. This type of symbolism has been thought to exacerbate the destructive notion of racial hierarchy in the human race, that some of our sisters and brothers are better than others (light-skinned versus dark-skinned). To what extent have you been aware of this use of language and symbols? What might be needed to counter the negative impact of this imagery in your family, workplace, community? What is yours to do?





## This Week at Home

### Monday, March 1

#### Mercy

Jesus instructs his followers to do the seemingly impossible: be merciful just as God is merciful. God's mercy is endless. How can we ever manage to love as he does? Living in a world that overflows with brokenness, we have endless opportunities to bring mercy to another. In our families, we have so many chances to forgive. How can you extend mercy to someone today? *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 9:4b–10; Psalm 79:8, 9, 11, 13; Luke 6:36–38.*

### Tuesday, March 2

#### The Greatest among You

From birth, human beings prefer to look at other human faces more than anything else. We come into the world ready for relationships of love. Yet as we seek out that love, we miss the mark. Rather than authentic love, which both affirms us and challenges us, we seek out approval, acclaim, and status. We look for relationships that reflect us back to ourselves in a positive light. Humility is opting out of this unwinnable game. It is knowing that we have an identity that cannot be taken away from us: beloved child of God. Once we accept that this is the love we are looking for, the love that grounds our being, we no longer worry about where we fit. We can instead imitate the one who humbled himself, who came in our likeness, who lived in love. *Today's readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16–20; Psalm 50:8–9, 16bc–17, 21 and 23; Matthew 23:1–12.*

### Wednesday, March 3

#### St. Katharine Drexel

St. Katharine Drexel was an heiress in Philadelphia who felt incredibly moved by the plight of Native Americans and African Americans in the United States in the late nineteenth century. She recognized this pull on her heart as a call from God, and she gave up her fortune and founded a religious order, establishing missions and schools that served these groups. She listened for God's voice and responded. How can you do the same? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 18:18–20; Psalm 31:5–6, 14, 15–16; Matthew 20:17–28.*

### Thursday, March 4

#### St. Casimir

St. Casimir was a Polish prince with legendary generosity to the poor. Is there a sacrifice you could make today in order to give generously to the poor in his honor? Consider what Abraham said at the end of today's Gospel reading. How has Christ's rising from the dead persuaded you to be merciful? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 17:5–10; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4 and 6; Luke 16:19–31.*

### Friday, March 5

#### Act with Justice

Over and over, the prophets and Jesus call us to give up our sinful ways and act with justice. We fail to recognize that the goods of creation are intended for all people and cling tightly to what we have when many do not have enough. Today choose to eat a simple lunch or dinner, and donate the cost savings to a charity that serves those who are food insecure. *Today's readings: Genesis 37:3–4, 12–13a, 17b–28a; Psalm 105:16–17, 18–19, 20–21; Matthew 21:33–43, 45–46.*

### Saturday, March 6

#### Merciful Love

Spend some time reflecting on the words of Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, and allow yourself to hear it with new ears. The son behaved as though his father were dead, yet the father watched for the son, ran to him, embraced him, and threw a feast to celebrate his return. What does that tell you about the vastness of God's merciful love for you? Is there anything you could do for which God could not forgive? *Today's readings: Micah 7:14–15, 18–20; Psalm 103:1–2, 3–4, 9–10, 11–12; Luke 15:1–3, 11–32.*
