From The Pastor's Desk

Why a Joyful Sunday in Lent

Recently, I ran into a parishioner who wished me a happy Lent but quickly retracted it and went in autocorrect mode and said, *Sorry we are not supposed to be happy in Lent*. But this fourth Sunday of Lent is Rejoice (Laetare) Sunday. On this Sunday, the Church would want us to rejoice because our salvation is close at hand. According to the Ordo, *Laetare Sunday sets a tone of joyful anticipation of the Easter mystery, as does the permitted use of rose-colored vestments. Likewise, instruments may be used at Mass and the altar may be decorated with flowers.*

We have varied perceptions of what Lent is and what it is not but Christians are not a *seasonally* joyful people. On Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, the Church enjoins her children to engage in Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. The faithful, however, are admonished to refrain from the temptations of performing their righteous deeds for public recognition and adulation. Lent is not necessarily a time to look mournful and haggard. Yet, as much as the ashes symbolize and remind us of our human condition and penitence, the interior character to convert and be reconciled to God far outweighs any externalities and rubrics. This sacred time is also a joyful and happy time of salvation for the grace that is granted us to engage in acts of charity and imitate God in his kindness. What could be more joyful to know that *God so loved the world and sent his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life?* Nothing could be more precious than knowing and experiencing that Jesus Christ has redeemed us by his blood and that we are debt-free, and are not captives to death. Nothing could be more thrilling and joyful to know that it is in him and through him that we are saved.

Through the mystery of Christ's life-giving death, we become children of the loving Father. The early Christians understood the merits and value of their identity and configuration in Christ which explains their resolve to die for Christ than worship the false gods of the ancient Roman Empire. We should be the happiest people on earth if truly we understood our vocation as disciples. Disciples are not a band of gloomy, lethargic, and pitiful followers. A Christian must live each day in realized eschatology. Salvation is something not yet attained but still is livable in the present age; not other-worldly reality but faith manifesting and radiating the goodness of God in the present. The joyful Sunday does not exclude *going up to Jerusalem*, or being a crossless Christian but should radiate the joy of the assurance that in his dying and rising, we belong to him. On Laetare Sunday, we are joyful that God responds with mercy, undeserved and salvific. Understanding the crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension as one continuous event is key to experiencing the unending presence of God in our everyday living. Both the process and goal of Lent could be joyful for reason of being a time of experiencing the grace of God.

Lenten Reflections– Fourth Sunday of Lent



Gospel Reading

John 3:14-21 – Jesus is the Light of the World

Reflection Questions:

1. In this reading, John states that “God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” If we believe in God, and if we strive for Christ-like behavior, why then do some people judge or look down on others whose experiences they don’t know and haven’t lived? God was not seeking to condemn the world, but to save it. Is it possible that in order for us, as believers in God, to do God’s bidding and help save this world, we should seek to understand others and lend a hand rather than judge or condescend? How would doing so bring you closer to God?
2. Consciously or unconsciously, are you quick to judge or look down on those to whom you don’t relate or understand because of their race or ethnic background? What can you do to promote interracial healing between yourself and those with whom you believe you share little in common?



Monday, March 15

Life-Giving Word

Jesus' second sign in Galilee, the healing of the official's child, occurs from a distance. Jesus' word provides healing and life to the boy, who is near death. We even hear that the fever left him at the time Jesus spoke. Jesus' word gives new life. We hear in Isaiah the prophecy of the new heavens and the new earth. "No longer shall the sound of weeping be heard there." How is this healing word of Jesus a sign of what is to come? What do you think the coming kingdom will be like? *Today's readings: Isaiah 65:17–21; Psalm 30:2 and 4, 5–6, 11–12a and 13b; John 4:43–54.*

Tuesday, March 16

Take up your Mat

Once again, Jesus' word brings healing and life. After encountering the healing word of Jesus, a man who has been ill for many years is able to pick up his mat and walk, with all the possibilities this new life suggests. Jesus' word gives life. It has power. Choose a phrase that Jesus states in Scripture and copy it three times. How is Jesus' word inviting you to new life today? *Today's readings: Ezekiel 47:1–9, 12; Psalm 46:2–3, 5–6, 8–9; John 5:1–16.*

Wednesday, March 17

St. Patrick

St. Patrick was a bishop in Ireland in the fifth century. He was responsible for the peaceful conversion of Ireland to Christianity. Kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland, he returned as a missionary to use his knowledge of Irish language and culture to evangelize. Celebrate St. Patrick, patron of Ireland, by living as a loving witness to Jesus, so that others might be brought to Christ through your love. *Today's readings: Isaiah 49:8–15; Psalm 145:8–9, 13cd–14, 17–18; John 5:17–30.*

Thursday, March 18

St. Cyril of Jerusalem

St. Cyril of Jerusalem was a bishop and a Doctor of the Church who lived in the fourth century. He wrote for those who were in the process of becoming Christians and also against heresies that were causing divisions within the Church. St. Cyril was a great catechist. Is there an opportunity for you to teach others about the faith? *Today's readings: Exodus 32:7–14; Psalm 106:19–20, 21–22, 23; John 5:31–47.*

Friday, March 19

St. Joseph

St. Joseph's vocation was one of the most important in history. God speaks to St. Joseph in dreams, but Joseph has no trouble distinguishing God's voice from other voices. He acts in accordance with the words he receives. And in so doing, he protects Mary and Jesus from the forces that wish to harm them. We can surmise that his awareness of God's voice might originate in a lifetime of attentiveness to God's presence and action in his life. In our time, just as in St. Joseph's, other voices vie for our attention and response. Ask St. Joseph to intercede for you, to ask God to help you to listen as he does. Then spend some time listening for God's voice in silent prayer, with Scripture, or in the voice of a trusted friend. *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4–5a, 12–14a, 16; Psalm 89:2–3, 4–5, 27 and 29; Romans 4:13, 16–18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18–21, 24a or Luke 2:41–51a.*

Saturday, March 20

Wo Are You, Jesus?

As Jesus taught about the kingdom of God and did many signs, people who listened were divided about his identity. If Jesus is the messiah, raised from the dead, there is a reason for our hope. The ground of all reality is a love stronger than death. Yet often hope and trust are put in other things, and decisions are based on fear rather than love. How can you reorient your life so that your choices are guided by love, not fear? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 11:18–20; Psalm 7:2–3, 9bc–10, 11–12; John 7:40–53.*
