

**From The Pastor's Desk**

**The Year of St. Joseph, the Year of the Family**

The year 2020 has been depicted with so many monikers: the pandemic year, year of losses, lockdown, devastation, calamities, waste, meltdown, and other such nomenclatures. These names, perhaps, portray how the survivors felt about 2020. With the lasting impacts of 2020 still with us, no one knows definitively when we would be out of the woods. It is a year that has stimulated different ways of thinking and created a *new normal*, as obscure as that is. It will be quite a challenge to emerge from these trying times but there's hope. In the midst of all these uncertainties, Pope Francis dedicates 2020-2021 as the Year of St. Joseph. While recalling the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, he set aside December 8, 2020, the Feast day of the Immaculate Conception to December 8, 2021, as the Year of St. Joseph, the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows" [Excerpt, Patris Corde]. Now, not much is known of St. Joseph except that he's the Joseph of the tribe of Judah who lived in Nazareth. For sure, he was a common man, and not much is said about him in the scriptures except as one who deciphers and learns through dreams. He's mentioned sporadically by church historians, but literature does not hold much information in his favor.

**Who is St. Joseph:** St. Joseph (1st c.) was a descendant of Israel's King David and a carpenter by trade. Scripture tells us that he was a *just and virtuous* man who was betrothed to wed the young Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon finding her pregnant with the Son of God, Joseph, after a time of uncertainty, was encouraged by an angel to continue with the marriage plans. Because of his complete faithfulness and obedience to the will of God, St. Joseph was chosen to become the spouse of the Mother of God and the adoptive father of Jesus Christ. As the divinely-appointed earthly guardian and protector of the Holy Family, St. Joseph provided and cared for the material needs of Mary and the Child Jesus. [Excerpt, Catholic company, Morning Offerings].

The Holy Father's intent on proclaiming the Year of St. Joseph is to give the church a ray of hope and opportunity to reflect, study, pray, meditate, and put St. Joseph in our gaze for a moment. The timing is exceptional. At a time of despair, anxiety and uncertainties, focusing our gaze on an ordinary common man is uncommon. Against the backdrop of the COVID 19, and the ordinary men and women who became life savers, Pope Francis wanted the faithful to look at St. Joseph as that quiet, humble and selfless servant to the holy family in every moment of need, serving the blessed mother and the infant Jesus.

In quoting his predecessor St. Paul VI Saint Joseph, Pope Francis said that St. Joseph "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home." *To be Contd...*



#### Esteban dice la verdad

Con su presencia en la lapidación de Esteban, Saulo aprobó la ejecución del primer mártir. Sin embargo, Saulo permitió que Dios lo transformara. Ya como apóstol, Pablo usó sus dones para edificar el Cuerpo de Cristo. Piense en las maneras en las que él llevó la luz de Cristo a otros. En un principio, fue uno de los perseguidores de la Iglesia. No importa lo que hayamos hecho, Dios está siempre preparado con misericordia y perdón. Dios siempre está dispuesto a llamarnos a hacer su obra en el mundo. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 7:51—8:1a; Salmo 31:3cd–4, 6 y 7b y 8a, 17 y 21ab; Juan 6:30–35.*

### Miércoles, 21 de abril

#### Pan de vida

### Viernes, 23 de abril

#### Saulo, ¿por qué me persigues?

Desde siempre, la historia de la conversión de san Pablo ha sido representada en el arte. Lea Hechos 9:1–20 en voz alta. Comparta una hora con su familia: que cada uno dibuje o pinte lo que escuchó y que intercambien reflexiones artísticas. O bien, que representen la escena. Busquen en internet otras representaciones de este pasaje bíblico y vean qué tan similar es su reflexión a la de otros artistas. *Lecturas del día: Hechos 9:1–20; Salmo 117:1bc, 2; Juan 6:52–59.*

### Sábado, 24 de abril

#### Palabras que dan vida

## This Week at Home

### Monday, April 19

#### Stephen Speaks the Truth

One way to carry the Easter season forward is to look at the life of the early Christian community. In Acts, we hear how St. Stephen, the first martyr, was in conflict with the religious leaders because of his work in the name of Jesus. This story would be wonderful for children to turn into a play or for adults to journal as a first-person account, envisioning themselves as participants in the story. *Today's readings: Acts 6:8–15; Psalm 119:23–24, 26–27, 29–30; John 6:22–29.*

### Tuesday, April 20

#### Saul

By Saul's presence at the stoning of Stephen, Saul gave his consent to the first martyr's execution. Saul, however, allowed God to transform him. As an apostle, Paul used his gifts to build up the Body of Christ. Think of the ways he brought the light of Christ to others. He was initially one of the Church's persecutors. No matter what we have done, God is always ready with mercy and forgiveness. God is always ready to call us to do his work in the world. *Today's readings: Acts 7:51–8:1a; Psalm 31:3cd–4, 6 and 7b and 8a, 17 and 21ab; John 6:30–35.*

### Wednesday, April 21

#### The Bread of Life

Jesus is the Bread of Life, and in him is our hope. He shares his very self with us in the Eucharist, that we might have eternal life. When you attend Mass, receive this gift, listening for what God is calling you to do as you are given food for your journey. The Eucharist is called the source and summit of our faith. How can you make it more central in your life? *Today's readings: Acts: 8:1b–8; Psalm 66:1–3a, 4–5, 6–7a; John 6:35–40.*

### Thursday, April 22

#### Bread from Heaven

Jesus shows the people that God has been preparing them for him. As he explains that life comes through eating the bread that is his Body, his very self, he recalls the manna that brought life to the people of Israel in the desert. When Catholics read Scripture, we look at the law and the prophets and the whole of salvation history in light of what has happened in Jesus. Read Exodus 16. Think about how it enriches your understanding of Jesus' words. Then bake a loaf of bread. Think about what it might mean for Jesus to be such a fundamental food. *Today's readings: Acts 8:26–40; Psalm 66:8–9; 16–17, 20; John 6:44–51.*

### Friday, April 23

#### Saul, Why do you Persecute Me?

Saul, Why Do You Persecute Me?

St. Paul's conversion story is frequently depicted in art. Read Acts 9:1–20 aloud. Spend an hour with your family, each drawing or painting what you hear and sharing your art reflection with one another. You could also choose to act out the scene. Search online for other depictions of this moment in history, and see how your reflection is similar to those of other artists. *Today's readings: Acts 9:1–20; Psalm 117:1bc, 2; John 6:52–59.*

### Saturday, April 24

#### Trusting the One Who Gives Life

In today's Gospel, many turn away from Jesus because his teachings are difficult. Peter says, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." I personally have often found comfort in Peter's words. It is not always easy to follow Jesus. Sometimes his teachings are difficult. How can Peter's words become your words? How can they become your prayer? *Today's readings: Acts 9:31–42; Psalm 116:12–13, 14–15, 16–17; John 6:60–69.*

Through a series of 10 videos, beginning with the chapters of the Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris Laetitia*, the Holy Father, with the help of several families, invites us to journey together to rediscover the family as a gift, despite every problem, obstacle and challenge that families have to face today.
