

From The Pastor's Desk

The Year of St. Joseph, the Year of the Family

Why a devotion to St. Joseph? St. Peter Julian Eymard says that just as the Blessed Mother is invaluable in salvation history, Christians have no better person to guide them to the mysteries of Jesus Christ, than Joseph. He is the one that leads us to the interior sanctuary of Jesus Christ, the Eucharist. St. Joseph is the guardian and protector of the Universal Church. As numerous as the concerns of the human family, so are the many needs of the children of the Universal Church. St. Joseph is the patron saint of many causes, especially fathers, families, married couples, children, pregnant women, workers, craftsmen, the dying, against doubt, and a happy and holy death [Excerpt, Fr. Donald Calloway]. So from the cradle to the grave, St. Joseph is with us in our little joys and sorrows of everyday life. He's a model the common can to relate to as they serve their families, communities, and work for the common good.

Family Man and Model: St. Joseph is the patron saint of the family. Now, more than ever, our world needs father figures and role models, who like St. Joseph bring to life the wonders, the power, and the ceaseless love of a father to his family. Our families and communities need to experience and feel the presence of hope, confidence, and encouragement that fathers provide. St. Joseph's presence is invaluable in the face of the challenges of the holy family. As a refugee family, he sheltered and guided mother and child through the treacherous deserts in search of safety. His vocation reminds us of the uncertainties and challenges that common people face every day.

Man of Faith: The Scriptures present Joseph here and there, as a dreamer. He often withdraws from the distractions and confusions of life into the solitary world of dream where one is truly alone with his creator. The logic of St. Joseph's strength is his ability to utilize quiet moments; he's not afraid of silence. This became the bedrock of his communication and relationship with God. As a man of unalloyed loyalty, his fidelity to God's will is unrivalled. His *fiat* is manifest in his deep prayer life, calm resolve to care, work, and listen. His work became his prayer as he selflessly laid down his life for Jesus and Mary in obedience to God, without complaining. Blessed are the common men and women who selflessly but quietly serve as beacons of hope and light especially in the dark moments of family life. Families can find encouragement and zeal in the person and life of St. Joseph's steadfastness to his family, who refused to make himself the center of things but in freedom and love, he is present to his family. In the midst of crisis, confusion, and a world at war with the Church, and members of the church at war with one another, it's time to come home again to our spiritual father, St. Joseph. Saturated with fear, false sense of freedom and insecurity, our world needs men of the **stature** of St. Joseph as servants and missionary disciples.

Why a Statue? St. Joseph statue would help put before our gaze, the common people in their struggle and service to our human family in much distress. St. Joseph is a constant reminder of the quiet, humble but sometimes unappreciated ordinary people in the service of humankind. In the words of Pope Francis, *true fathers like St. Joseph, point their families to greater fatherhood, our Heavenly Father.*



Status of Church Floor Replacement

After a number of meetings, consultations, and reviews, Fr. Eugene has approved the type of floor replacement materials for our Church building. Through the expertise of committee members, long-term, sustainable, cost-effective considerations were given to every detail of this project. On April 15, the committee met with the Diocesan Commission for Sacred Places, and from all indications, they were thoroughly satisfied with our project layout. The committee of parishioners is now picking the colors and patterns for the approved materials.

As you may recall, our initial goal was to raise \$90,000 for the project. To date, we have raised \$62,000 through fundraising efforts and generous parishioners' donations. **Thank you so very much for your support!** In addition, we have also dedicated \$24,000 from Our Faith, Our Future campaign, bringing it to a total of \$86,000 available for this project. Although we are optimistic about our financial ability to replace all the flooring in our Church building, our current funding level leaves very little room to cover unforeseen issues and contingencies.

One contingency we were hoping to avoid was asbestos abatement. We recently received test results that show the presence of asbestos in our Kitchen floor adhesive. The cost of addressing this issue may limit our financial ability to replace the floors in certain areas of our Church building. I am asking you to please assist us with whatever your means can allow you at this moment, towards the completion of this project.


The diagram below depicts the overall scheme of the types of floor materials approved by Fr. Eugene for the various areas in our Church building. The following shows:

1. The Altar floor and steps being porcelain tile
2. The Sanctuary, Sacristies, and corridors having polished concrete floors
3. The Chapel, Narthex, and Music room floors being carpeted
4. The classroom floors covered in luxury vinyl tile and the kitchen will have a sheet vinyl floor.
5. The restrooms and storage areas' floors remain the same.



Update on St. Joseph's Statue

We envisage a statue that would be same size and same stone as the blessed mother statue outside in the courtyard. It is a 5 foot statue made of Masha Marble compared to Carrara marble which is made to withstand the weather and outdoor elements. Our best estimate to date is \$15,000 including freight cost. For installation, the company uses an individual to do the installation (cost to be determined) or we can hire anyone of our choosing. We have so far received the generous contribution of \$3,442.83 so far in donations towards the purchase of the statue.

As we pray for the success of this project and the spiritual benefits, we join the Holy Father, Pope Francis in this prayer asking St. Joseph to intercede for us.
