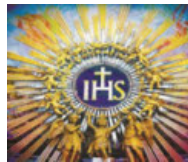

From Parochial Vicar's Desk



God, with one another, and with all of creation. They included the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields."

This Holy Year is centered on the theme of **Hope**. During a Jubilee, certain pilgrimage sites are designated, each with a Holy Door that "represents Jesus Christ and the mystery of salvation, inviting us to enter into new life, free from the slavery of sin, and empowered to love and serve both God and our neighbor" (Pope Francis).

The theme of the Holy Year is **"Pilgrims of Hope."** As Pope Francis writes, "Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of every person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, even when the future remains uncertain." The phrase "Hope does not disappoint" from Romans 5:5 encapsulates this: "And hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

As we journey toward the Jubilee, let us turn to Scripture for guidance. The words of Hebrews 6:18-20 offer profound encouragement: "May we who have taken refuge in Him be strongly encouraged to seize the hope set before us. We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters the inner shrine behind the curtain, where Jesus, a forerunner on our behalf, has entered."

This passage urges us never to lose the hope we have been given but to hold fast to it. In God, we find our refuge and strength. The image of the anchor serves as a powerful symbol, reminding us of the stability and security found in the Lord amidst the turbulent waters of life. Though storms may come, we are anchored in the hope born of grace—this hope enables us to live in Christ, overcoming sin, fear, and death. It transcends life's fleeting pleasures and immediate goals, elevating us above our trials, inspiring us to press forward with our eyes set on the heavenly prize for which we have been called (Spes Non Confundit, 25).

Ultimately, the Church invites us to embrace spiritual renewal in this Jubilee Year. Nothing should prevent us from answering this call, particularly as "In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to respond to Christ's call to holiness. We are invited to walk by the light of Christ, to trust in His wisdom, and to surrender our hearts to Him with ever-deepening love."

En 2025, la Iglesia Católica celebra un Año Jubilar, una ocasión especial que se observa cada 25 años en la vida de la Iglesia. Desde el año 1300, los años Jubilares se han celebrado a intervalos regulares, inspirados en la tradición judía de marcar un Jubileo cada 50 años. Como se explica en el sitio web del Jubileo del Vaticano, estos años sagrados en la historia judía "tenían la intención de restaurar una relación adecuada con Dios, con los demás y con toda la creación. Incluían el perdón de deudas, el retorno de tierras mal apropiadas y un periodo de descanso para los campos".

Este Año Santo se centra en el tema de la Esperanza. Durante un Jubileo, se designan ciertos sitios de peregrinación, cada uno con una Puerta Santa que "representa a Jesucristo y el misterio de la salvación, invitándonos a entrar en una nueva vida, libre de la esclavitud del pecado, y capacitados para amar y servir tanto a Dios como a nuestro prójimo" (Papa Francisco).

El tema del Año Santo es "Peregrinos de la Esperanza". Como escribe el Papa Francisco: "Todos saben lo que es la esperanza. En el corazón de cada persona, la esperanza habita como el deseo y la expectativa de cosas buenas por venir, incluso cuando el futuro sigue siendo incierto." La frase "La esperanza no defrauda" de Romanos 5:5 resume esto: "Y la esperanza no nos defrauda, porque el amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu Santo que se nos ha dado."

A medida que avanzamos hacia el Jubileo, volvamos a la Escritura en busca de orientación. Las palabras de Hebreos 6:18-20 nos ofrecen un profundo aliento: "Nosotros, que hemos buscado refugio en Él, seamos fuertemente animados a asirnos de la esperanza que se nos ofrece. Esta esperanza, una ancla segura y firme para el alma, una esperanza que entra en el santuario interior, detrás de la cortina, donde Jesús, precursor nuestro, ha entrado."

Este pasaje nos insta a no perder nunca la esperanza que se nos ha dado, sino a aferrarnos a ella. En Dios, encontramos nuestro refugio y fortaleza. La imagen del ancla sirve como un símbolo poderoso, recordándonos la estabilidad y seguridad que encontramos en el Señor en medio de las aguas turbulentas de la vida. Aunque puedan venir tormentas, estamos anclados en la esperanza nacida de la gracia; esta esperanza nos permite vivir en Cristo, superando el pecado, el miedo y la muerte. Transcendiendo los placeres fugaces de la vida y los objetivos inmediatos, elevándonos por encima de nuestras pruebas, inspirándonos a seguir adelante con los ojos puestos en el premio celestial para el que hemos sido llamados (Spes Non Confundit, 25).

Finalmente, la Iglesia nos invita a abrazar la renovación espiritual en este Año Jubilar. Nada debe impedirnos responder a este llamado, especialmente porque "En el Bautismo, el Espíritu Santo nos mueve a responder al llamado de Cristo a la santidad. Estamos invitados a caminar a la luz de Cristo, a confiar en Su sabiduría y a rendir nuestros corazones a Él con un amor cada vez más profundo."

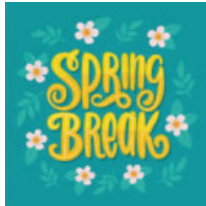
CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION



This Sunday, March 2, Grades K-6 will be having one large Group Gathering in the gym as it's our last class before Spring Break! It's also the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, which is March 5. We will be discussing Mardi Gras and Lent, which means we will be having Mardi Gras parties the first half of class followed by a lesson plan on Lent.

Since Wednesday, March 5 is Ash Wednesday, there will be no Faith Formation classes that evening. **HOWEVER**, students are asked to attend Ash Wednesday Mass instead. There will be activity sheets on the Welcome Table for your children to complete and return on Wednesday, March 19 to receive attendance credit for March 5.

There are no Faith Formation classes on Sunday/Wednesday, March 9/12 due to Spring Break! Let's hope the weather is much improved so you can enjoy your weekend off! Classes resume on Sunday/Wednesday, March 16/19.

Durante la Cuaresma, nos preparamos orando, ayunando y dando limosna, para la nueva vida en Cristo que celebramos en la Pascua. En la Cuaresma practicamos la autodisciplina para reenfocarnos en Dios. Nuestra oración, ayuno y obras de caridad expresan nuestra conversión para seguir más fielmente a Jesús.

Además de abstenerse de carne los viernes, practiquemos la autodisciplina de otras maneras. Algunas personas no comen dulces o no beben café durante la Cuaresma; otras asisten a misa diaria o sirven en un comedor de beneficencia. Escoja una práctica penitencial para prepararse mejor

para la Pascua y pregúntese: “¿Qué me animará a volver a Dios regularmente? ¿De qué maneras puedo socorrer a aquellos que están más empobrecidos? ¿Qué debo hacer para que mi sacrificio y devoción sea un rompimiento con mis modos actuales y pueda volver al Señor? Nuestro compromiso de Cuaresma deberá desafiarnos a abrir el corazón para compartir nuestra alabanza a Dios.

Jesús nos recuerda que es importante orar, ayunar y dar limosna auténticamente. Nuestras prácticas de Cuaresma nos reorientan a Dios, no a la alabanza de los demás. Al comenzar esta temporada, pida que Dios le abra el corazón y le renueve el espíritu. Acuda a Dios en busca de fortaleza mientras se prepara para celebrar la resurrección de nuestro Señor en Pascua.

Rend Your Hearts



Today's readings: Joel 2:12–18; Psalm 51:3–4, 5–6ab, 12–13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians 5:20–6:2; Matthew 6:1–6, 16–18. In today's first reading, the Lord calls us to return to him with our "whole heart." During Lent, our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving prepares us for the new life in Christ that Easter celebrates. The Lenten season is an opportunity to practice self-discipline to refocus on God. Our prayer, fasting, and charity as we seek conversion allows us to more faithfully follow Jesus.

Aside from abstaining from eating meat on Fridays, self-discipline can be practiced in a number of ways. Some people give up sweets or caffeine during Lent, others attend daily Mass or serve at a soup kitchen. While contemplating a practice that you will work to keep in preparation for

Easter, consider asking yourself: What will encourage me to regularly turn to God? How can I give to others, particularly those who may be impoverished in some way? How can I make my sacrifice or dedication a rending of my current ways to return to the Lord? Our Lenten commitment should challenge us to open our hearts so that we can share our praises to God.

Jesus reminds us that it is important to authentically pray, fast, and give alms. Our Lenten practices are to redirect us to God, not to receive praise from others. As we begin this season, ask God to open your heart and renew a steadfast spirit within you. Turn to God for strength as you prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord at Easter.

Water, Light, and Life: A Lenten Parish Mission

Lent is a season of conversion and renewal. During these forty days, all members of the community, through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, ready themselves to renew their baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil.

As a way to enter more deeply into Lent and prepare for Easter, our parish will be offering a four-session Lenten mission called ***Water, Light, and Life***.

Beginning the second Friday of Lent and continuing each Friday for four weeks:

March 14th, March 21st, March 28th, and April 4th

Following Stations of the Cross, the Mission will be from 7:00-8:00 PM.

This gathering is an opportunity for conversion, prayer, reflection, and faith-sharing for your entire family and the whole parish. **Adults, teens, and children are all welcome** (*but those under the age of 18 may not attend without a parent*). Children and teens (grades K-12) will attend break-out sessions in which they will be provided age-appropriate materials and will be able to engage in reflection together with their peers. 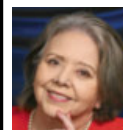

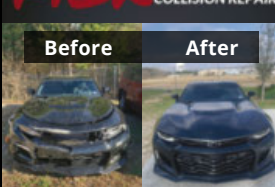
