In 1945, the local Eastman Mortuary was purchased by Max E. Mortimore (later being incorporated as Mortimore Funeral Home). He built Mortimore Funeral Home in 1950 where he and his wife, Virginia, resided until the time of his death in 1988. Their son, Clark, joined the firm in 1959 after attending the San Francisco College of Mortuary Science. Clark & Ellen's son, Mike, came "on board" in 1986 and son Mark, joined in 1987 after graduating from San Francisco College of Mortuary Science. With the purchase of the funeral home in 1945, an ambulance service was included. At that time it was common for ambulances to be operated by morticians, using a hearse as the ambulance. Following WWII, Mortimore was one of the first to use a station wagon and one of the first to use utility vehicles for the same purpose. Clark retired from the board after 28 years of service & was County Coroner for 51 years. Clark died in 2014 & the business is now operated by his wife, Ellen, & sons, Mike & Mark. It is a lot of paperwork but worth getting through it to access the assistance available.

I want to remind everyone that volunteers, especially those who aren't often in the Center, you are welcome to join us for any activity offered here as long as you are 60 years old or older. Even if your meals are covered by Medicaid Waiver & even if you can no longer drive, come & participate in our fun. Our bus will pick you up & take you home. Our transportation is not exclusive to seniors either. Public Transportation means exactly that. Our trips are for seniors and anyone in our community as well! Please ask us if you have questions!

Every year you hear about budgets & funding & what can and cannot be. We face it year in and year out, but the bottom line is that numbers don't lie. We need & want you to participate in what we do for you. The more we can count the better! We can show the legislature & powers that be, that the Centers have value in all communities.
