## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

### THE STEWARD'S WORK IS NEVER DONE

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?

Nos damos permiso para ser egoístas. Entonces, ¿qué pasa si el rebaño se dispersa solo un poco?

Jesús lo entiende. Podemos imaginarlo exhausto de agotamiento, ¿no es así? Lo vemos en su bote, tratando de escabullirse para un breve descanso, tal vez solo una oportunidad para comer un bocado en paz. Él es Dios, pero seguía siendo humano, después de todo. Incluso los pastores más dedicados necesitan dormir. Pero la gente no podía dejarlo en paz. Tenían hambre de él. Necesitaban lo que él podía ofrecer y lo necesitaban ahora.

Por duro que sea, ese es el ejemplo que tenemos que imitar. La corresponsabilidad diaria exige responsabilidad. Exige que nos presentemos incluso cuando estamos cansados. Exige que miremos nuestras vidas, nuestro tiempo, nuestras energías, nuestros talentos, nuestros corazones, nuestras cuentas bancarias y pensemos: ¿dónde tengo más para dar?



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## FR. JOSEPH NGUYỄN – CONGREGATION OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Fr. Joseph comes to us from the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, or the Spiritans, in Mexico. He currently serves in a parish, living and working among the people.

Among the group's priorities, there is a clear option for the poor: the indigenous, the peasants and the workers; also a privileged pastoral care for the sick, for vocation ministry, and a community conscience to seek the real and necessary self - financing of the group.

"In Tanlajás, I work with a lot of indigenous people. Over there we don't have any special thing to do, we have to do everything. We visit people, visit the sick, say Mass with the people. Sometimes we have to do work like carpentry. We do everything."

The Spiritans serve a large rural community in Tanlajás. Much of what Fr. Joseph does is live amongst the people and minister to them as a priest. The rural areas are not the wealthiest, so when it came time for the priests to get paid for their time saying Mass, it looks a little unusual.

"They give us bananas, beans, eggs, pumpkin or a small squash. It's different but I love it. Over there, they like priests a lot. They invite me to have dinner with them after the Mass. They just have rice and beans and nothing else - sometimes tortillas."

Fr. Joseph grew up in Vietnam and his family came over to the U.S in 1994.

"I did not speak English very well and had to start learning English when I was 28 years old. My eyes were very good, I could see far away without [glasses]. After two years of studying English, because I used to study late at night, I needed lenses. When I was not in class, I sat in front of the TV to watch and to listen to what they said and so I damaged my eyes, now I have awful eyes!"

Fr. Joseph has been with the Spiritans since 2003. He was ordained a priest on August 15, 2010. He went to Mexico where he had to relearn Spanish.

"The first Mass with the people after school was a funeral for the police. A relative came up to me and told me, 'Father, please don't say anything because it's dangerous. After the Mass, you will go, but we will stay here, and we will have trouble with them.' And I didn't know anything, because I didn't know Spanish!"

There was crime in parts of the community but it, thankfully didn't make its way to the Spiritans' community.

"They did not come to us. They came for Confession only, after killing people. I could not break the Seal and I could not deny them. I could only accept them and guide them. They are bad, but they are not totally bad; they still have a conscious. At least their conscious says something, they feel it and they know it's not right. That's why they come to Confession."

Your support of the Spiritans and Fr. Joseph further fuels their ministry to the poorer communities of Tanlajás.



As the Rule of Life for the Congregation states, "The evangelization of the 'poor' is our purpose. Therefore, we go especially to peoples, groups, and individuals who have not yet heard the message of the Gospel or who have scarcely heard it, to those whose needs are the greatest, and to the oppressed. We also willingly accept tasks for which the Church has difficulty in finding workers."

## MISSION APPEAL

July 17-18

As part of the **Diocesan Missionary Cooperation Plan**, Reverend Joseph Quan Nguyen, CSSp, will visit us to speak about the missionary work of the Church and in particular that of the Spiritans, the Congregation of the Holy Spirit, previously known as the Holy Ghost Fathers.

This visit is part of a national program in which annually a representative of one of the missionary groups visits parishes of the Diocese to invite the parish to share in the mission work of the universal Church. The Spiritans are an international community engaged in a wide range of missionary activity in over 60 countries throughout the world. Fr. Joseph himself is a missionary priest from Vietnam. He is presently serving in a parish in Tamaulipas, Mexico and for many years previously in rural parishes in Mexico.

When Jesus said: "You shall witness to me in Jerusalem and in Samaria and to the ends of the earth," He made the spread of the Gospel an essential part of our Catholic life.

We urge you to respond generously to Father Joseph's appeal.

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


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**THEOLOGY ON TAP**




