FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PASTOR

Alright. We're still in the middle of the stories from the trip to Sacramento, so let's keep plowing along.

Thursday, February 22:

I am awake early. Heartburn. Late night tacos before bed were a mistake – see last week's Pastor Note. The third little cup of hot salsa was the kicker. I keep forgetting I'm not a kid anymore. Eh, no matter. Heartburn is a blessing because I am awake early, and I have a busy day ahead of me, so I better start my prayers early if I am going to have the energy to do what must be done.

Mass is at 9 AM so there is no need to rush, St. Paul is only a two-block walk. Today I forget to cross the street before that one house with the three yappy dogs. Oops! I get to St. Paul thirty minutes early, so I start opening the doors. Within a few minutes of being their Sabina arrives. Better put her to work so I can plan a homily. I could ad-lib the homily, but the Mass is in Spanish, so I need to have something ready – even if it is not on paper. I tell Sabina to find today's reading in the lectionary. I then convince her that she should read today since Patty read on Tuesday, and it seemed like the third lady has no interest in reading for Mass. Sabina is happy. She says she is honored to proclaim the reading and starts to practice while I turn on the microphone system in the sacristy. Bingo!

Mass is as usual, except this time there are *FOUR* ladies in the front pews. Three of the same ladies as Tuesday, but a new face who was at the talk last night.

Once Mass is complete, I hurry to my truck. The ladies understand. I need to go to the Valley of the Sacred Hearth Middle School retreat at the Pro Ecclesia Sancta house in Vacaville, about 45 minutes away. The theology teacher leading the retreat, Brianne Dela Cruz, texted the night before asking that I get there as soon as I can for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions with the retreatants.

I come to the beautiful house of the Pro Ecclesia Sancta Sisters in the hills of Vacaville. There are very few houses around but on the green hills are scattered small herds of cows grazing. When I pull up the driveway Sister Adriana Ponce is there to meet me. She greets me warmly and leads me to where I can vest and hear Confessions. There are about twenty middle school children, five high school students as group leaders, and eight young adult leaders (who are essentially leading but are having a retreat themselves). Brianne is giving a talk, so Sister Adriana gives me a tour of her home, tells me the history of her religious order, and introduces me to two other sisters living in the house.

The talk ends, so I am quickly whisked away to the Confessional. I skip lunch (I miss the pizza but sneak a small bag of Cheeto Puffs) in order to fit in all the Confessions. I have no intention of rushing Confessions because the students want to talk, and I'm happy to listen. The students are bright, articulate, and experienced in the sacrament so the conversation is easy and fruitful. Also, there is an image in Confessional that is holding my attention and becomes a muse for fruitful prayer during the sacrament.



After the Confessions with all the middle schoolers, nearly all the high schoolers (a few I had already seen on Tuesday), and all the adult leaders, I lead Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. There is beautiful praise and worship. The retreatants sing well. At 3 PM the parents begin coming to pick up their children, and by 4 PM all the retreatants are gone.

The Young Adults look to me wondering if I have anything else to do. They ask if I am hungry, knowing I missed lunch. I have not eaten, however, earlier I found a pizza place in Vacaville that had good reviews. That was my plan until one of the Young Adults says: "Anyone want to go to Beer University?" The temptation to make inappropriate jokes about my pretend alcoholism was strong: "I already have my honorary doctorate from Beer University" or "I spend many hours a day studying at the library at Beer University. I've checked out nearly every book." But I zip my lip. Then the same young man says: "They have deep-fried cheeseburgers." "SOLD!" and I am already walking to my truck.

It is a short drive to Beer University in Vacaville. When the six of us arrive, it is Happy Hour and all the appetizers are half-off. We order too much food, and I – worried the deep-fried cheeseburger might stop my heart – get a regular burger (which was still very good); also, a bonus because it came with waffle fries. Despite the many beer-taps on the wall no one orders drinks. We spend the next three hours laughing and telling stories. The time flies by.

It is nearly 8 PM and I still have a 45-minute drive. Traffic should be fine (even through Davis), although most of the others in the dinner group are ten minutes from home so they are not worried. I thank everyone for their dedication to the mission of Jesus Christ, for their ministry, and their hard work, so I pay the bill, assure of them my prayers, and let them know how they can reach out to me should they need anything. It is a long good-bye in the parking lot.

I prayed earlier in the morning but need to catch up on my prayers (the Liturgy of the Hours) for the rest of the day. I begin with this prayer: "God, let's compromise, I'll say *all* my prayers real fast, and then I can watch YouTube until bed, deal?" I assume he says: "Deal."

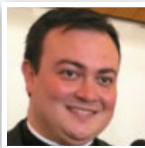

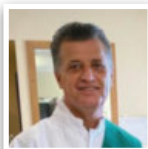

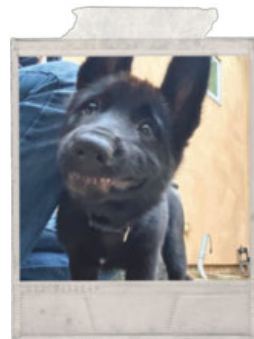
Prayers for Our Troops

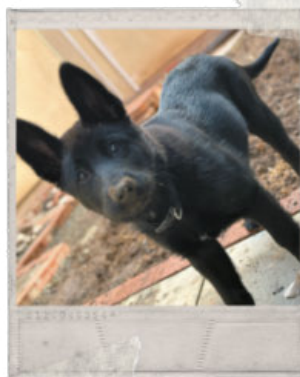
Cocca's Corner 🐾
